Aaron Baddeley International Junior Championship CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

Peninsula Golf Country Club September 2nd 2007

- 1. **THE EVENT:** The Aaron Baddeley International Junior Championship Victorian Qualifying tournament will be played over 18 holes stroke play:
- 2. **CHAMPIONSHIP COMMITTEE:** The Championship Committee shall have the sole management and control of the Championship with full power at any time, to alter or vary any of the conditions.
- 3. ENTRIES: Entries close 5.00 pm August 17th 2007 and will be limited to 90 players with the lowest handicap.
- 4. ENTRY FEES: An entry fee of \$33.00 must be attached to the entry form.
- 5. AGE REQUIREMENT: Entrants must be under 19 years* of age as at November 29th 2007.
- 6. RULES: Competition shall be played in accordance with the Rules of Golf as adopted by the Royal and Ancient.
- 7. BALL: Competitors must use a ball which is named in the current R&A and/or USGA approved lists.
- 8. **PROTESTS:** The decision of the Championship Committee will be final in all matters relating to the Tournament. Protests must be made to the Championship Committee no later than 15 minutes after the conclusion of each round.
- 9. PACE OF PLAY: Rule 6-7 will be strictly enforced. Each group must maintain its position on the course.
- 10. **MOTORISED TRANSPORT:** Competitors may not travel in or on any motorized vehicle unless specific written permission has been granted by the Championship Committee.
- 11. **MOBILE PHONES:** Use of mobile phones is prohibited during Association events. Players and caddies in breach of this requirement will be subject to action in accordance with the Association's Code of Conduct.
- 12. **SCORE CARDS:** Score Cards, signed by the marker and countersigned by the competitor must be returned to the person appointed by the Championship Committee as soon as possible following completion of each round.
- 13. **BAD WEATHER:** The Championship Committee may in the event of bad weather or for any other reason either shorten tournament or appoint another day or days for completion of the event.
- 14. **DRAW AND STARTING TIME:** A draw will be made by the Championship Committee. The Committee has the power to amend the draw or substitute another player for any competitor who is not at the first tee at the time appointed to play. It may also alter the starting time for any player.
- 15. CADDIES: The tournament would appreciate all players to have a caddie for the event however, this is not mandatory.
- 16. **DRINKS ON COURSE:** Drinking fountains are located on several holes around the course, however it is suggested players carry their own drink container / water bottle.
- 17. **TROPHIES:** Winner and Runner up: > Boys and Girls 18 years
 - > Boys and Girls 17 years
 - > Boys and Girls 16 years
 - > Boys and Girls 15 years
- 18. ABIJC QUALIFYING TOURNAMENT: The leading 2 boys and the leading 2 girls from the Victorian Qualifying Tournament will be offered a position to represent Victoria in the ABIJC AUSTRALIAN FINAL to be played at the Heritage G&CC from November 3-4th 2007 over 36 holes stroke play with the cost of flights and accommodation paid for by the tournament. In the event of players in these categories not being available, players with the next best scores will be offered the position.
- 19. **SPECIAL EXEMPTIONS:** The Championship Committee may add any player/s to the field where a special exemption is considered appropriate.
- 20. **CITIZENSHIP:** All players that qualify at the Australian Final to play in International Championship in China must be an Australian citizen or a permanent resident holding permanent visa status to be eligible to represent Australia and be part of the ABC Learning Centres Team Australia. A copy of your permanent visa status will be required. However, this does not exclude any player from entering the International Championship.
- 21. ENTRY FORM AND CONDITIONS: These conditions form part of the entry form.
- * Players may be 18 years of age, not having turned 19 years of age as at November 29th 2007.
