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2007 Australian Men's and Colts Interstate Teams Matches – CONDITIONS OF PLAY

1. DEFINITIONS

- (a) "Interim Board" means the Interim Board of Golf Australia.
- (b) The expression "Member State" shall have the meaning ascribed thereto in the Rules of Golf Australia.
- (c) "The Committee" means the Committee in charge of the Tournament constituted under the provisions of Clause 11 hereof.
- (d) "State" means a State of the Commonwealth of Australia.
- (e) "Year" means calendar year.
- (f) Australian national means – holds or is eligible to hold an Australian passport.
- (g) "Permanent place of residence" means the person's residential address in Australia.
- (h) "Permanent resident" means a person who has a permanent Australian residency visa.
- (i) "Contest" means the competition between two teams representing a member State (ie. Queensland v Victoria)
- (j) "Match" means the individual competition between two players

2. GENERAL

- 2.1 A Tournament for Interstate Teams Matches shall be held once a year in accordance with the conditions contained in this document. The Tournament will be decided by match play and will take the form of a series of contests between Teams representing Member States. Each team competes against every other Team in the Tournament once only.
- 2.2 As far as possible, the Tournament will be held in rotation between Member States. A roster may be compiled, however it may vary from time to time.
- 2.3 In special circumstances more than one course may be used. If unforeseen circumstances arise at the time of the Tournament, the Committee may approve the use of an additional or alternative course.

3. FORMAT OF PLAY

- 3.1 A Member State will be represented by a team of eight (8) players as qualified in this document. Eight players (8) will be selected for foursomes and seven (7) selected for singles matches in each contest. A Member State shall notify the Committee in writing of the names of such eight (8) players by the date appointed by the Committee.
- 3.2 The draw will be determined by lot by the Committee.
- 3.3 The tournament will be scheduled to be played over five consecutive days, with each day consisting of a contest comprising four foursomes matches and seven singles matches.
- 3.4 The stipulated round is eighteen holes unless otherwise decided by the Committee to meet special circumstances. The sequence in which holes are to be played will be determined by the Committee for each contest. In the event of a match being all square after 18 holes, a halved result will be recorded.
- 3.5 However, in the event of a substantial delay in play or envisaged substantial delay, as determined by the Committee, the following procedures shall take effect:

- a) The foursomes matches of the current and/or subsequent contests be abandoned or re-scheduled so as to enable all singles contests to be completed. For example:
 - i) if no play is possible on day 1, then round 1 singles and round 2 singles are played on day 2. Rounds 1 and 2 foursomes are abandoned.
 - ii) if the foursomes matches have been sufficiently interrupted, or have not commenced by such a time, so that the singles matches will not be completed that day, those foursome matches be abandoned.
 - iii) if a weather forecast indicates a substantial loss of play, the singles matches may be played first, followed by the foursomes matches if weather ultimately permits.
- b) Single matches that are not completed by the end of the day's play shall be completed when play resumes. Uncompleted foursomes matches (when played after the singles) may be resumed at the Committee's discretion.
- c) If the foursomes matches have been abandoned, the result of the contest shall be determined by the singles matches.
- d) During play of individual matches, should play be suspended and not subsequently resumed, any match result may stand and all incomplete matches may be declared halved (see R&A guidelines in *Guidance on Running a Competition*).
- e) All seven singles games must be completed in each of the three contests for that round to count, except in round 5 where an unfinished game may be discontinued if its result shall not affect the overall series winner.

4. **STARTING TIMES**

- 4.1 On any day of the Tournament during which two series of contests between Teams of Member States are to be played, the Committee shall ensure that the first contest (or contests if more than one starting tee is used) in the first series is commenced at a time that will permit all players participating to be allowed at least half an hour as a lunch respite before being required to engage in the afternoon series of contests.
- 4.2 After the time appointed for commencement of a contest all players shall be ready in turn to commence play of their individual match. Each match will commence at their allotted start time.
- 4.3 If the player arrives at their starting point, ready to play, within five minutes after their starting time, in the absence of circumstances that warrant waiving the penalty of disqualification as provided in Rule 33-7, the penalty for failure to start on time is loss of the first hole to be played.

5. **ORDER OF PLAY**

- 5.1 On each day of the Tournament at least thirty minutes before the times appointed for (i) the foursomes (ii) the singles, the Manager of a team shall (i) give the Committee or its representative a list of the pairings and their order of play for the foursomes matches and later (ii) a list of the players and their order of play for the singles matches. The order of play shall not be altered after the 30-minute cut-off has elapsed, however the Committee may vary such period of thirty minutes if it so determines.
- 5.2 Teams shall play in reverse order - that is to say in the foursomes number 4 team to hit off first, and in the singles number 7 player to hit off first, with the honour as per the draw.
- 5.3 A player who had been nominated to play in a particular contest may, whilst that contest is in progress and after his own match has been decided, act as caddie for another member of his Team playing in the same contest.

6. **ELIGIBILITY**

- 6.1 A player shall be eligible to play in the Tournament if he is qualified as follows:
 - (a) That he is a male amateur player, a member of a Golf Club affiliated directly or indirectly with the Member State. In determining whether or not a player is an amateur the Rules of Amateur Status as approved by R&A Rules Limited shall apply.
 - (b) That he is an Australian national or permanent resident.
- 6.2 A Player shall be eligible to play in the Tournament for a Member State subject to the following conditions:

- (a) That his permanent place of residence in Australia is at a place within the Member State except where he is a member of a Club which is not situated in the Member State within which it is affiliated and he has nominated that Club as his home Club.
 - (b) That where a player changes his permanent place of residence from within one State to a place within another State, with the intention of making that latter place his permanent place of residence, he shall for a period of six months immediately following the date of his actual taking up residence at such latter place, be eligible only to play for the former Member State. At the expiration of such period of six months he shall be eligible only to play for the latter Member State.
 - (c) That where a player who has a usual and permanent place of residence at a place within a State, goes to reside temporarily at a place or places within another State he shall:
 - (i) remain eligible to play for the former Member State.
 - (ii) after the expiration of six months following the date of actual taking up temporary residence within such latter State, become also eligible to play for such latter Member State.
 - (iii) after the expiration of six months following the date of his actual taking up temporary residence within such latter state, give notice in writing to the Interim Board, at least two months prior to the date of commencement of the Tournament, should he elect to represent a Member State he did not represent at the previous Tournament. The Interim Board shall only approve one change of representation, except in exceptional individual cases.
 - (iv) such notice of election shall be forwarded to the Interim Board by the Member State in whose favour the player has elected, and a copy thereof simultaneously forwarded to the other Member State concerned.
 - (d) That where a player is a member of a club with dual Member State affiliation, the player is permitted to elect which Member State for which he wishes to be available for representation, irrespective of his State of residence. Once such election is made in writing to both Member States and is approved by the Interim Board, the player must continue to be available only to the Member State so elected unless special permission is obtained from the Interim Board.
 - (e) Throughout the duration of the scholarship period, an Australian Institute of Sport student shall only be eligible to represent a Member State for which he was eligible at the time of commencement of his scholarship, subject to the provisions of paragraphs 6.1(a) and 6.1(b) above. In addition, for a period of twelve months following the cessation of his AIS scholarship, the player shall only be eligible to represent the Member State he last represented whilst holding an AIS scholarship; and, in the period of 12-24 months after the cessation of his scholarship, he be entitled to represent either this same Member State or any other Member State for which he be otherwise eligible – subject to the provisions of 6.1(a) and 6.1(b) above. In the 12-24 month period, the player shall give notice in writing to the Interim Board, at least two (2) months prior to the date of commencement of the Tournament, should he elect to represent a Member State he did not represent at the previous Tournament, or was not eligible to represent at the previous Tournament. Such notice of election shall be forwarded to the Interim Board by the Member State in whose favour the player has elected, and a copy thereof simultaneously forwarded to the other Member State concerned. The Interim Board may waive or modify these additional constraints in exceptional individual cases.
- (2) Within fourteen days of the receipt from a Member State of a player's election made under the provisions of paragraph 6.2(c) (iii), the Interim Board shall advise such player and both Member States concerned in writing of its approval or disapproval of such election. The decision of the Interim Board shall be final and binding on the player and Member States concerned.

The onus of proof to the satisfaction of the Interim Board that he is entitled to make an election as aforesaid, shall rest solely upon the player concerned.

7. SUBSTITUTIONS

- 7.1 Should a nominated player be rendered incapable of playing by reason of accident, illness or other reasonable cause, substitution may be made for such player subject to the approval of the Committee.

- 7.2 When a substitution takes place after the official opening ceremony, the substitute player cannot play in any singles match unless the team has less than the minimum number of original members available to play.
- 7.3 When a substitution takes place after the list of players and their order of play has been submitted to the Committee, the substituted player will play in the position of the original player.

8. DETERMINING THE WINNER

At the conclusion of the Tournament the winner shall be decided as follows:

- (i) The team of the Member State having gained the greatest number of contest points shall be the winner if there be only one such Team. In the event of a tied contest both teams will be allocated half a contest.
- (ii) If the respective Teams of more than one Member State stand equal in the number of contest points gained the tie shall be decided between them in favour of the Team whose total number of individual match points gained throughout the Tournament, minus any penalty deductions, is greatest.
- (iii) If the respective Teams of more than one Member State stand equal in the number of contest points gained and in the aggregate number of individual match points gained throughout the Tournament, minus any penalty deductions, such Teams shall be declared by the Committee to be joint winners.

9. RULES OF PLAY

The Rules of Golf as adopted by R&A Rules Limited shall apply together with such Local Rules as laid down by the Committee.

10. GOLF BALLS

- 10.1 It will be obligatory for all players to play with a ball that is named in the current R&A Conforming Balls Lists. Penalty: Disqualification
- 10.2 Additionally, throughout a stipulated round, the balls a player plays must be of the same brand and type as detailed by a single entry in the current List of Conforming Golf Balls. Penalty: At the conclusion of the hole at which a breach is discovered, the state of the match must be adjusted by deducting 1 hole for each hole at which a breach occurred; maximum deduction per round: 2 holes. (NB If a player discovers they have used a ball in breach of this condition, they must abandon that ball before playing from the next teeing ground and complete the round using a proper ball; otherwise, the player is disqualified. If discovery is made during the play of a hole and the player elects to substitute a proper ball before completing that hole, the player must place a proper ball on the spot where the ball used in breach of this condition lay.)

11. CHAMPIONSHIP COMMITTEE

- 11.1 The Championship Committee will consist of Golf Australia's Director – Championships, Manager – Championships, and Manager – Rules and Handicapping, together with one member appointed by the Governing Authority of the Host State. (NB Team Captains may not act on the Championship Committee – a Committee member may be involved in a decision even though they are not present at the venue club).
- 11.2 The Championship Committee will have sole management and control of the championship, with full power at any time to alter or vary any of the conditions. In the absence of a full Championship Committee, such members as may be present at the time may give a decision, and any decision so given will be deemed to be a decision of the full Championship Committee.
- 11.3 On a breach of any of the conditions, the Championship Committee may impose such penalty as it thinks fit.

12. TEAM MANAGER

- 12.1 Each Member State shall appoint a Manager of its Team who may or may not be one of such Team. The Manager shall be responsible for the conduct of his team and shall also be responsible for making all necessary communications with the Committee.
- 12.2 In accordance with the Note to Rule 8 of the Rules of Golf, the Team Manager (in addition to the persons from whom advice may be asked under the Rule) may give advice to members of their Team.

13. PRACTICE

The Committee, in conjunction with the host Member State and host club (or clubs), shall design practice arrangements, and publish such arrangements prior to the commencement of the tournament. These arrangements shall be strictly adhered to, and may only be varied by the Committee. The penalty for a

breach of this condition shall be the deduction of ½ an individual match point from the team's total number of individual match points gained for the entire tournament (NB in the instance of multiple breaches, the total penalty shall be ½ an individual match point, except where a breach occurs after a team has already been advised by the Committee that it is in breach of this condition - in such a case, the additional breach shall be treated as a fresh case and the above noted penalty procedure shall be reapplied). These penalties may be either waived or modified in exceptional circumstances.

14. DRUG POLICY

All competitors are subject to drug testing by the Australian Sports Anti-Doping Agency for banned substances as laid down in Golf Australia's Anti-Doping Policy. Any competitor infringing this policy, or refusing to take a test, will be disqualified and subject to any sanction(s) brought down by ASADA. A list of the prohibited substances will be available at registration. Clarification of any medication can be obtained via the ASADA hotline – 1800 020 506, or from www.asada.gov.au

15. HEAD WEAR

Head wear may feature the emblem of the team, and the small name or logos of either or both the sponsor and the manufacturer (NB the sponsor's or manufacturer's name or logo must not appear more than once and must not exceed a perimeter measurement of 220mm). Players may only wear head wear authorised by their team Manager. Head wear should feature a state logo. *Penalty:* First infringement will incur a warning. Any subsequent infringement during the series, or refusal to comply with the first warning, will incur loss of match.

16. DRIVING CLUBS

The driver the player carries must have a clubhead, identified by model and loft, that is named on the current List of Conforming Driver Heads issued by R&A Rules Limited. Note: Any individual driver on the List, if tested on pendulum apparatus approved by R&A Rules Limited, must not have a characteristic time greater than 257 microseconds. (The list may be viewed via www.golfaustralia.org.au.) *Penalty:* Disqualification

17. MOTORISED TRANSPORT

It is prohibited for a player or caddie to ride in or on a motorised vehicle unless permitted to do so by the Championship Committee or Rules Committee. *Penalty:* At the conclusion of the hole at which the breach is discovered, the state of the match must be adjusted by deducting one hole for each hole at which the breach occurred; maximum penalty per round: 2 holes. Procedure when breach is discovered: Use of an unauthorised form of transportation must be discontinued immediately upon discovery that a breach occurred. Otherwise the player is disqualified.

18. MOBILE PHONES

Players must have mobile phones turned off at all times whilst on the golf course during competition play.

19. TELEVISION AND MEDIA

All rights for televising live, television recordings or for any visual or electronic reproduction of the Championship are reserved only to Golf Australia and may only be made under licence.

20. CODE OF CONDUCT

All entrants assent to be bound by Golf Australia's Code of Conduct.

CONDITIONS FOR THE MEN'S INTERSTATE COLTS TEAMS SERIES:

1. A Member State will be represented by a team of six (6) players who must be at least 18 years of age, and not 24 years of age or older, as at the first scheduled day of competition and as qualified under Clause 6 in this document. Six players (6) will be selected for foursomes and five (5) selected for singles matches in each contest. A Member State shall notify the Committee in writing of the names of such six (6) players by the date appointed by the Committee.
2. Unless specifically determined otherwise, the Golf Australia Conditions for the Men's Interstate Teams Matches shall apply to the Men's Interstate Colts Teams Matches, subject to 1. above.
