Tournament Functions:

Australian Women's Stroke Play Championship – Presentation Cocktail Party:

Saturday 21 March at the conclusion of play – approximately 2.30 pm – 3.30 pm at Brisbane GC
(Dress – smart casual)

Australian Men's and Women's Amateur Championships – Presentation Cocktail Party: Wednesday 25 March at the conclusion of play – approximately 4.00 pm – 5.00 pm at Royal Queensland GC
(Dress – golfing attire or casual (no jeans))

Registration:

Competitors are required to register between 12:00 pm and 3:30 pm on Tuesday 17 March at Brisbane Golf Club. At this time, competitors will be required to provide a phone number where they can be contacted during the event. Failure to register may result in disqualification from the Championship.

If it is impossible to register in person, competitors must contact the Championship Office on registration day on 0414 696 810.

Withdrawals:

Results & Draws:

All results and draws will be posted at www.golfaustralia.org.au The draw for rounds 1 and 2 will be available after 4.00 pm on Tuesday 17 March.

Practice:

Due to the large number of players who will wish to have a practice round, play must be from the daily tee markers only – one ball only – competitors only. (Competitors in breach of these practice conditions are liable to face action under Golf Australia's Code of Conduct.) Practice is from 12.30 pm and players must report to the Pro Shop prior to teeing off.

Practice outside of this time may be made by contacting the club and a green fee may be charged. Brisbane GC – 07 3848 1008.

Course Guides:

Yardage books/course guides will be available at each player's own cost and can be purchased at Registration.

Range Facilities and Balls:

A practice fairway is available and competitors will receive complimentary practice balls prior to their round on the Championships days only. Practice balls at the conclusion of a player's round are at the player's expense. Practice balls are available from the Pro Shop.

Pull Buggies:

Local competitors and those travelling by car are requested to use their own pull buggies. Golf Australia will endeavour to provide a buggy to all players who require one, however players are encouraged to bring a light-weight bag in the case that a hire buggy is not available. Buggies will be complimentary for Championship Days only for those players who require them.

Club Storage:

There is limited club storage available so players are asked to make alternate arrangements. Lockers are available and players should collect keys to the lockers from the Golf Club office when they register.

Physiotherapist and Medical Centres:

A list of physiotherapists and Medical Centres is available from the Tournament Office if required.

Caddies:

Caddies will not be supplied. If players require a caddie they must make their own arrangements.

Competition Conditions:

Please refer to the Championship Conditions as listed on the entry form, particularly Condition Number 8 pertaining to Conforming Golf Balls, One Ball Condition and Time of Starting. Competitors are requested to report to the starter approximately 10 minutes prior to the advertised starting time. Score cards, Local Rules and hole placement sheets will be distributed by the starter on their starting tee. The current list of Conforming Golf Balls can be viewed via www.golfaustralia.org.au (see the Rules & Handicapping section).

Driving Clubs Condition:

Any driver the player carries must have a clubhead, identified by model and loft, that is named on the current List of Conforming Driver Heads issued by the R&A. Exception: A driver with a clubhead that was manufactured prior to 1999 is exempt from this condition. (The list may be viewed via www.golfaustralia.org.au)

***PENALTY FOR CARRYING, BUT NOT MAKING STROKE WITH, CLUB OR CLUBS IN BREACH OF CONDITION:**

Match play – At the conclusion of the hole at which the breach is discovered, the state of the match is adjusted by deducting one hole for each hole at which a breach occurred; maximum deduction per round – Two holes.

Stroke play – Two strokes for each hole at which a breach occurred; maximum penalty per round – Four strokes.

Match or stroke play – In the event of a breach between the play of two holes, the penalty applies to the next hole.

*Any club or clubs carried in breach of this condition must be declared out of play by the player to their opponent in match play or their marker or fellow competitor in stroke play immediately upon discovery a breach has occurred. If the player fails to do so, they are disqualified.

PENALTY FOR MAKING STROKE WITH CLUB IN BREACH OF CONDITION: Disqualification.

Ties:

In the event of a tie for the Australian Women's Stroke Play Championship, players in such a tie will continue over such holes as the Championship Play Committee will decide in a sudden-death, hole-by-hole play-off until the winner is determined.

In the event of a tie for the last match play places (32 in total) after the Australian Women's Stroke Play Championship, a sudden-death, hole-by-hole, play-off will be held immediately after the 4th round has concluded, or, if necessary due to insufficient light, the next morning. Any competitor in the play-off not ready to play when called will be disqualified.

Dress Requirements:

"Hard/Metal" spikes are not permitted. Players, caddies and spectators must adhere to dress which is neat, tidy and appropriate to the game. Denim jeans/shirts, track or leisure pants, and clothing, hats, caps, and visors with excessive slogans or advertising are not permitted. Players are reminded that they are guests of the clubs and failure to adhere to dress regulations may result in players being asked to change or purchase appropriate dress.

Catering:

Catering will be available from 6.30 am. All food and beverage for players for the duration of the event is at the player's expense.

Bottled Water:

Complimentary bottled water will be supplied to players on the Championship Days only, from the 1st and 10th tees. Players are requested not to abuse this privilege and to place empty bottles in rubbish bins.

Mobile Phones:

Mobile phones may not be used on the golf courses during competition play under any circumstances. A COMPETITOR FAILING TO ADHERE TO THIS REGULATION WILL BE IN BREACH OF GOLF AUSTRALIA'S CODE OF CONDUCT.

Golf Australia Hard Card:

The Golf Australia Hard Card will be in effect throughout the Championship and will be provided to players at registration.

Course Care:

All clubs which host Golf Australia National Championships kindly give up their course to you for the duration of the event. Hence, so that the course is left in a suitable condition once the Championship is completed, players MUST carry AND use a sand bucket and repair divots. Any player seen to be in breach of this request may face action under Golf Australia's Code of Conduct.
