Australian Men's and Women's Amateur Championships – Presentation Cocktail Party:

Registration:

Competitors are required to register between 12:00 pm and 3:30 pm on Saturday 12 April at Glenelg Golf Club. At this time, competitors will be required to provide a phone number where they can be contacted during the event. Failure to register may result in disqualification from the Championship.

If it is impossible to register in person, competitors must contact the Championship Office on registration day on 0414 696 810.

Results & Draws:

All results and draws will be posted at www.golfaustralia.org.au. The draw for rounds 1 and 2 will be available at 4.00 pm on Saturday 12 April.

Practice:

A practice round is available after 10.00 am on Saturday 12 April. Please contact Glenelg Pro Shop on 08 8295 3274 to make a reservation. Play must be from the daily tee markers only – one ball only – competitors only. (Competitors in breach of these practice conditions are liable to face action under Golf Australia's Code of Conduct.)

Course Guides:

Yardage books/course guides will be available for purchase at the player's own cost at Registration.

Range Facilities and Balls:

A practice fairway is available and competitors will receive complimentary practice balls on the Championships Days only. Practice balls are available from the Pro Shop. There is also a large practice chipping and putting green facility with two bunkers.

Pull Buggies:

Local competitors and those traveling by car are requested to use their own pull buggies. Golf Australia will endeavour to provide a buggy to all players who require one, however players are encouraged to bring a light-weight bag in the case that a hire buggy is not available. Buggies will be complimentary for Championship Days only for those players who require them.

Club Storage:

There is limited club storage available at Glenelg Golf Club so players are requested to make alternate arrangements.

Physiotherapist:

A physiotherapist will be available all week at either The Grange Golf Club or North Adelaide. The contact phone number is 0411 774 335 or (08) 8361 6933. The website is www.sagolfinjury.com for further information. This will be at the player's expense.

Player Lockers:

A small number of Lockers are available to competitors if required.

Caddies:

Caddies will not be supplied. If players require a caddie they must make their own arrangements.

Competition Conditions:

Please refer to the Championship Conditions as listed on the entry form, particularly Condition Number 7 pertaining to Conforming Golf Balls, One Ball Condition and Time of Starting. Competitors are requested to report to the starter approximately 10 minutes prior to the advertised starting time. Score cards, Local Rules and hole placement sheets will be distributed by the starter on their starting tee.

The current list of Conforming Golf Balls can be viewed via www.golfaustralia.org.au (see the Playing the Game section).

Driving Clubs Condition:

The driver the player carries must have a clubhead, identified by model and loft, that is named on the current List of Conforming Driver Heads issued by R&A Rules Limited. Note: Any individual driver on the List, if tested on pendulum apparatus approved by R&A Rules Limited, must not have a characteristic time greater than 257 microseconds. (The list may be viewed via www.golfaustralia.org.au) Penalty: Disqualification

Ties:

In the event of a tie for the Australian Women's Stroke Play Championship, players in such a tie will continue over such holes as the Championship Play Committee will decide in a sudden-death, hole-by-hole play-off until the winner is determined.

In the event of a tie for the last match play places (32 in total) after the Australian Women's Stroke Play Championship, a sudden-death, hole-by-hole, play-off will be held immediately after the 4th round has concluded on Wednesday 16 April, or, if necessary due to insufficient light, the next morning. Any competitor in the play-off not ready to play when called will be disqualified.

Dress Requirements:

"Hard" spikes are not permitted at Glenelg Golf Club. Soft spikes are permitted in the spike bar area only. Players, caddies and spectators must adhere to dress which is neat, tidy and appropriate to the game. Denim jeans/shirts, track or leisure pants, and clothing, hats, caps, and visors with excessive slogans or advertising are not permitted.

Catering:

Sandwiches will be available in the Clubhouse from 10.00 am for the duration of the event.

Mobile Phones:

Mobile phones may not be used on the golf courses during competition play under any circumstances. A COMPETITOR FAILING TO ADHERE TO THIS REGULATION WILL BE IN BREACH OF GOLF AUSTRALIA'S CODE OF CONDUCT.
