2010 Australian Men's Senior Amateur Match Play Championship

CONDITIONS

1. Format

1.1 The Championship will be played in two sections at Thirteenth Beach Golf Links.

1.2 (i) The first section will be the Australian Men's Senior Match Play Championship and will be played over five (5) rounds of 18 holes elimination Match Play:

Round 1: Monday 25 October (Ocean)
Round 2: Tuesday 26 October (Beach)
Quarter Finals: Wednesday 27 October (Ocean)
Semi Finals: Thursday 28 October (Ocean)
Final: Friday 29 October (Ocean)

The Championship will consist of successive rounds of match play, with losers being eliminated and winners progressing to the next round. The general numerical draw will be applied to establish the match pairings (based on the player's position on the 2010 Australian Men's Senior Ranking System after the SA Senior Amateur) with the highest ranked player receiving the lowest available number, in accordance with the published Golf Australia procedure. If two or more players are tied in the Australian Ranking System, the player's exact Australian Handicap at the time of entry will be used, with the player with the lowest exact handicap receiving the lowest number available.

Once eliminated from the main Championship, all eliminated players will be drawn to play in additional match play draws which will ensure all players play all five (5) Rounds.

(iii) The second section will be the Australian Men's Senior Match Play Championship - Super Senior Section (for players aged 65 years and over as at 1 November 2009). The Super Senior Section will be played over three (3) rounds of 18 holes round robin match play (after the players are divided into two Pools), with the leading player in each Pool progressing to the Final:

Round 1 (Round Robin): Monday 25 October
Round 2 (Round Robin): Tuesday 26 October
Round 3 (Round Robin): Thursday 28 October
Final: Friday 29 October

NB. Wednesday 27 October is a rest day.

The Pools will be determined by the player's position in the 2010 Australian Men's Senior Ranking System after the SA Senior Amateur, with player's ranked 1, 3, 5, and 7 constituting Pool A, and players ranked 2, 4, 6 and 8 constituting Pool B. If two or more players are tied in the Australian Ranking System, the player's exact Australian Handicap at the time of entry will be used, with the player with the lowest exact handicap receiving the lowest number available. Players in each Pool will play each other once, with the player in each Pool having won the most number of matches progressing to the Final. In the event that two or more players have the same number of wins, the result(s) of the match(es) between the tied players will be used to determine the winner. If still a tie, the number of holes won between the tied players in all matches will be used, and if still a tie, the Finalists will be determined by their original seeding within the Pools. Those players not progressing to the Final will be drawn to play on the final day, with the second placed player from Pool A playing the second placed player from Pool B, and so on. In the event of a tie, the above procedure will be used.

1.3 In the event of a halved match in any round;

(i) players will continue to play until a winner is determined, and;

(ii) the round is deemed to extend to as many holes as are required for a match to be won.

1.4 The winner of the first section will be the *Australian Men's Senior Amateur Match Play Champion* and will receive the Championship gold medallion and hold the Championship Trophy for one year. The runner-up will receive a silver medallion. The third place getter (ie. the winner of the match between the losing semi-finalists) will receive a bronze medallion. The winner of the second section will be the *Australian Men's Senior Amateur Match Play Super Senior Champion* and will receive a gold medallion. The runner-up will receive a silver medallion. The third place getter (ie. the winner of the match between the two players who placed second in their respective Pool) will receive a bronze medallion.

2. Championship Play Committee

2.1 The Championship Play Committee will comprise the Chair of the Golf Australia Championships Committee, Golf Australia's Director - Championships, and Manager - Championships.

2.2 In the absence of a full Championship Play Committee, such members as may be present at the time may give a decision, and any decision so given will be deemed to be a decision of the full Championship Play Committee.

2.3 The Championship Play Committee will have the sole management and control of the Championship, with full power at any time to alter or vary any of the conditions.

2.4 The Championship Play Committee's decision on matters affecting the Championship will be final.

3. Rules of Play

The Rules of Golf, as adopted by R&A Rules Limited, will apply together with Local Rules as drawn up by the Championship Committee.

4. Entries

4.1 Eligible players for the first section are male amateurs who have reached their 55th birthday by 25 October 2010 and who are the leading 32 entries according to the 2010 Australian Men's Ranking System as at 27 September (after the SA Senior Amateur).

Eligible players for the second section are male amateurs who have reached their 65th birthday by 1 November 2009 and who are the leading 8 entries according to the 2010 Australian Men's Ranking System as at 27 September (after the SA Senior Amateur).

NB. A player aged 65 years and over may CHOOSE whether he wishes to contest the first section or the second section of the Championship.

4.2 Entrance Fee \$185.00 (includes GST). Entry Fees will not be processed until after the closing date of 27 September.

4.3 Entries must be made on the entry form issued by Golf Australia, or a facsimile copy thereof. Entry by email is acceptable provided it is a scanned image of the official entry form.

4.4 The decision of the Championship Play Committee as to acceptance or refusal of any entry will be final.

4.5 Entrants must conform in all respects to the Rules of Amateur Status, as adopted by R&A Rules Limited.

4.6 Fully completed Entry Forms, together with appropriate Entrance Fees, must be received by Golf Australia prior to

5:00 pm on Monday 27 September 2010. **IT IS THE SOLE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE ENTRANT THEMSELVES TO ENSURE THAT THEIR ENTRY IS RECEIVED PRIOR TO THE CLOSING TIME FOR ENTRIES.** A player's entry form has not officially been received until their name has been posted at www.golfaustralia.org.au

- 4.7 In the event of entry applications exceeding the number of places available in the first section of the Championship (32), or the second section of the Championship (8), applications outside of the leading 32 entries, (or 8 entries) according to the 2010 Australian Men's Senior Ranking System as at 27 September will be balloted. Unsuccessful applications will be informed without delay and given the opportunity to compete if withdrawals subsequently occur. Entry Fees will not be processed until after entries have closed.
- 4.8 Late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the Championship Play Committee. Any such entry shall be subject to the application of a \$40.00 late fee (includes GST).
- 4.9 In the event that an entry is received after the closing time for entries and that it is accepted, the entrant will be automatically liable to Golf Australia for the sum of \$40.00 (the "late entry fee" – includes GST). Where the entrant nominates to pay the entry fee by credit card, by providing their credit card details, the card holder additionally authorises Golf Australia to debit the nominated account for the sum of the late entry fee (if applicable). Where payment is made by cheque, money order or cash, the entrant will be invoiced for the amount of the late entry fee and the entry will not be accepted until the full requisite payment has been received.
- 4.10 Acceptable payment methods are only as follows – credit card (Visa, or MasterCard only), cheque (personal or bank), money order, cash (please note though that Golf Australia will NOT accept responsibility for cash sent that is not received). Cheques or money orders are to be made payable to **Golf Australia**.
- 4.11 Only entry forms accompanied by credit card payment will be accepted by facsimile or email. Entry forms accompanied by other acceptable payment methods must be submitted by post or in person. Entries will not be accepted by telephone. Entry forms will not be accepted unless they are fully completed.
- 4.12 Entrance Fees will only be refunded in the case of a withdrawal being advised before the closing time for entries, except for those entrants who fail to secure a place.

5. Television and Media

All rights for televising live, television recordings or for any visual or electronic reproduction of the Championship are reserved only to Golf Australia and may only be made under licence.

6. Conforming Golf Balls, Conforming Driver Heads and Time of Starting

The specimen conditions in the Rules of Golf are in effect as regards Conforming Golf Balls, Conforming Driver Heads and Time of Starting.

7. Practice

Sunday 24 October.

8. Motorised Transport

During play, it is prohibited for a player to ride in or on a motorised vehicle unless specific written permission has been granted by the Championship Play Committee. (NB Subject to host club permission, a caddie may use motorised transport at any time.)

Penalty (unless permitted to ride by a member of the Championship Rules Committee): At the conclusion of the hole at which the breach is discovered, the state of the match will be adjusted by deducting 1 hole for each hole at which a breach occurred; maximum deduction per round – 2 holes

Procedure when breach discovered: Use of any unauthorised form of transportation must be discontinued immediately upon discovery that a breach has occurred. Otherwise the player is disqualified.

Note i: Permission will only be granted to entrants who can provide a Medical Certificate.

Note ii: Golf Australia takes no responsibility for the availability of golf carts.

Note iii: Permission will be granted on the basis that the following requirements are adhered to. Players failing to adhere to these requirements are liable to have such permission revoked:

Players who drive at a pace which is clearly quicker than walking pace; and/or who drive to a point past their ball which is clearly unreasonable for a player who is not using motorised transport to reach, are in breach of these requirements.

9. Registration

Competitors are to register between 4.00 pm and 5.00 pm at Thirteenth Beach Golf Links on Sunday 24 October. If a player cannot be at the club at that time, players may register via phone. Failure to comply may result in disqualification from the Championship.

10. Match Play Draw and Withdrawals

The draw will be released once all players have registered. If there is a subsequent withdrawal, the opponent will receive a forfeit.

A player is not permitted to withdraw from any round of the Championship unless on the receipt of a medical certificate, or in exceptional circumstances (as determined by the Championship Play Committee).

11. Pace of Play

Rule 6-7 will be strictly enforced. Each group must maintain its position on the course with respect to the group preceding it. Any group with a clear hole in front of it will be considered out of position. Penalties will be issued to individuals in such groups who by their pace contribute to delay. Warnings may not be issued prior to penalties.

12. Drug Testing

All competitors are subject to drug testing by the Australian Sports Anti-Doping Agency for banned substances as laid down in Golf Australia's Anti-Doping Policy. Any competitor infringing this policy, or refusing to take a test, will be disqualified and subject to any sanction(s) brought down by ASADA. A list of the prohibited substances will be available at registration. Clarification of any medication can be obtained via the ASADA hotline – 1800 020 506, or from www.asada.gov.au

13. Database of Competitors' Details

The personal data contained in this entry is permanently retained by Golf Australia. This data may be utilised by Golf Australia or its sponsors for the distribution of correspondence, in both electronic and hard copy means. From time to time players may be sent entry forms, event literature, the Golf Australia e-newsletter, or marketing material by the sponsor(s) of Golf Australia events, or information about events conducted by Golf Australia-approved bodies. Upon receipt by Golf Australia of a written request, a player may either have access to their details, or have their details deleted from the database.

14. Code of Conduct

All entrants are bound by Golf Australia's Code of Conduct ("the Code"). A copy of the Code is available at www.golfaustralia.org.au. Any breach of the Code may be recorded on the Central Register of the Code ("the Register"). The Register may be accessed (and published from time to time) by any State Association or GA for the purposes of administering state and national championships, any codes of conduct and/or other related matters.

15. Golf Australia Hard Card

The Golf Australia Hard Card will be in effect throughout the Australian Men's Senior Match Play Amateur Championship.

Note i: Distance Measuring Devices are NOT permitted. Penalty in accordance with Rule 14-3.

Note ii: The new condition relating to Club Face Grooves will not be in effect until 2014.
