*TOYOTA Junior Golf World Cup, supported by JAL is the world's only junior golf championship in which 16 national teams, winners of regional qualifiers held across 6 continents and participated by more than 60 national teams, compete for the world champion trophy.*

*This tournament is meant to encourage the players' patriotic spirit during the competition, while providing them with the opportunity to develop international friendship among the players themselves.*

*Teams consist of four boys (aged 18 years or under) and play 72 holes stroke play with the best three scores recorded.*
