Tuesday 10 April: Practice Round: from 6.00 am – 7.30 am or after 9.00 am
Registration: 10.00 am – 3.30 pm

Wednesday 11 April: 2012 Australian Girls' Amateur Championship – Round 1 (7.30 am – 9.30 am)

Thursday 12 April: 2012 Australian Girls' Amateur Championship – Round 2 (7.30 am – 9.30 am)
After 36 holes, the top 60 players plus ties will continue to rounds 3 and 4.

Friday 13 April: 2012 Australian Girls' Amateur Championship – Round 3 (6.45 am – 8.06 am)
2012 Australian Girls' Amateur Championship – Round 4 (11.35 am – 12.56 pm)
Presentation Ceremony for the Australian Girls' Amateur and Opening Ceremony for the Australian Girls' Interstate Teams Matches – approximately 5.30 pm

Championship Presentation Ceremony:

All players are invited to attend the Australian Girls' Amateur Championship Presentation Ceremony & Australian Girls' Interstate Teams Matches (Burtta Cheney Cup) Opening Ceremony on Friday 13 April commencing at the conclusion of play (approximately 5.30 pm). Dress: Jacket. A small function will follow the conclusion of the Ceremony.

Registration:

Competitors are required to register between 10:00 am and 3:30 pm on Tuesday 10 April at Carbrook Golf Club. At this time, competitors will be required to provide a phone number where they can be contacted during the event. Failure to register may result in disqualification from the Championship.

If it is impossible to register in person, competitors must contact the Championship Office on registration day on 0414 696 810.

Competitors are not required to register each day. Players are requested to report to the Starter approximately 5 minutes prior to the advertised starting time. Score cards, Local Rules, hole placement sheets, etc will be distributed to players on the tee.

Unavailability:

Results & Draws:

All results and draws will be posted at www.golfaustralia.org.au. The draw for rounds 1 and 2 will be available one week prior. Players are asked to contact Golf Australia by **27 March** if they are travelling with another

player and would like a similar tee time (every effort will be made to action requests). **Requests after this time will not be considered.**

Draw for Rounds 3 and 4:

The championship will be decided over 72-holes of stroke play. A draw for Rounds 3 and 4 will be seeded based on scores after the first 36-holes.

Practice:

A practice round is available on Tuesday 10 April from 6.00 am – 7.30 am or after 9.00 am. Players must contact Carbrook Golf Club to make a booking.

For practice outside of Tuesday 10 April, players will be charged \$15.00 per person. Please contact the club to check availability.

During a practice round a player may play one ball only throughout the round with the following exceptions:

- If a player misses the fairway with their drive, they may play one additional tee shot from the tee;
- If a player misses the green with their approach shot, they may play one additional shot to the green;
- Not more than three chip shots may be played from beside the green, and only then provided such practice shots do not damage the course;
- Only two bunker shots may be played towards the green from a greenside bunker. All other bunker shots must be played away from the green;
- Only three practice putts are permitted.

Yardage Books:

Yardage books are not available however yardage dots will be painted on the fairways at 50 metres, 100 metres and 150 metres from the front of the green.

Distance Measuring Devices:

Distance Measuring Devices are NOT permitted in the Championship Proper. They may be used during the practice round.

Range Facilities and Balls:

A practice fairway is available and competitors will receive complimentary practice balls for the official practice round and the championship days. Note: The range is approximately a 500 metre walk from the clubhouse so a shuttle will be in operation for the three championship days.

The range operating hours are:

Monday 9 April:	not available (players may use the facility with their own balls)
Tuesday 10 April:	6.00 am – 3:00 pm
Wednesday 11 April:	6.30 am – 3:00 pm
Thursday 12 April:	6:30 am – 3:00 pm
Friday 13 April:	6:00 am – 8:15 am

If players wish to use the range outside of these times, please see the GA staff.

Balls will be on the range.

Pull Buggies:

Local competitors and those travelling by car are requested to use their own pull buggies. Golf

Australia will endeavour to provide a buggy to all players who require one, however players are encouraged to bring a light-weight bag in the case that a hire buggy is not available. Buggies will be complimentary for the Championship for those players who require them.

Club Storage and Player Lockers:

There is no club storage available. Please see Golf Australia staff if this is a concern.

Billeting:

Billet accommodation is NOT available.

Caddies:

A player is prohibited from using a caddie during the stipulated round. Penalty: Two strokes for each hole at which any breach occurred; maximum penalty per round – Four strokes. In the event of a breach between the play of two holes, the penalty applies to the next hole. A player having a caddie in breach of this condition must immediately upon discovery that a breach has occurred ensure that they conform with this condition for the remainder of the stipulated round. Otherwise the player is disqualified.

Motorised Carts:

Players must not ride in any form of transportation during a stipulated round unless authorised by the Championship Play Committee. Penalty: Stroke Play – 2 strokes for each hole at which a breach occurred; maximum penalty per round – 4 strokes.

Any player seeking authorisation to use a golf cart due to a disability as defined under the Disability Discrimination Act 1992 should contact Golf Australia to obtain information on procedures for submitting such requests. All such requests and required information must be submitted to Golf Australia simultaneously and together with the entry form (or within 2 days of the on-line entry being receipted). Requests due to temporary injuries or impairments that do not qualify as a permanent disability under the Act will not be granted. In the event of a change in a medical condition after submitting the entry form but before the commencement of the event, written submission of all documentation must be received by Golf Australia no later than 7 days prior to the first day of the event. Golf Australia will consider any such request in accordance with these conditions and its rules, regulations and policies.

Ties:

In the event of a tie for the Australian Girls' Amateur Championship, players in such a tie will continue over such holes as the Championship Play Committee will decide in a sudden-death, hole-by-hole play-off until the winner is determined. Any competitor in the play-off not ready to play when called will be disqualified.

Dress Requirements:

During both practice and competition, competitors and their spectators must ensure a standard of dress is in keeping with national championships. Jeans, t-shirts, and garments with excessive advertising are not permitted on the course or in the clubhouse. Shirts must be tucked in; golf shoes must be worn. Metal spikes are not permitted; soft spikes are permitted in the clubhouse.

Catering:

Catering will be available in the clubhouse from 9.00 am to 3.00 pm each day. Food and beverage is at the player's expense.

Mobile Phones:

Mobile phones may not be used on the golf course during competition play under any circumstances. A COMPETITOR FAILING TO ADHERE TO THIS REGULATION WILL BE IN BREACH OF GOLF AUSTRALIA'S CODE OF CONDUCT. Phones may be used discreetly in the clubhouse.

Golf Australia Hard Card:

The Golf Australia Hard Card will be in effect throughout the Championship and will be provided to players at registration.

Course Care:

All clubs which host Golf Australia National Championships kindly give up their course for the duration of the event. Hence, so that the course is left in a suitable condition once the Championship is completed, players MUST carry AND use a sand bucket and repair divots. Any player seen to be in breach of this request may face action under Golf Australia's Code of Conduct.
