



## 2012 Women's Metropolitan Grade Final Results

### Grade 1

Pennant Hills were able to celebrate their first Grade No. 1 Pennant with many of their supporters when Pennant Hills hosted the final day of Grade on Friday. Pennant Hills went through the season undefeated to win their first Grade No. 1 pennant with 12 points. There was still plenty of interest on the final day with all matches affecting the final placings. Bonnie Doon defeated Manly to maintain their position in Grade 1 for 2013. Manly were valiant in defeat. New South Wales defeated The Lakes to end the season in 4th position just behind the Australian on games. Concord and The Australian battled it out for second position with Concord coming out on top with 4 wins to 3.



## Grade 2

Grade No. 2 went down to the wire as anyone of four clubs could have been crowned champions following the final round at Avondale GC. The host club had completed their season with 4.5 wins to lead the title race into the last round, however Castle Hill, Monash and Pymble could all claim the title with a victory and other results going their way.

Monash pressed their claims with a 4.5/2.5 win over Royal Sydney leaving the result down to the match between Castle Hill and Pymble. With three matches progressing to the 18<sup>th</sup> hole the result could have gone either way, but in the end it would be Castle Hill that would triumph 4/3. The results gave them 5 wins for the season, just half a win clear of Avondale and Monash.



### Grade 3

Grade No. 3 proved to be the tightest Grade of the season with three clubs all finishing on 4.5 wins. In the final round contests Wakehurst recorded a narrow 4/3 win over North Ryde, whilst Cumberland recorded a victory of the same margin over Killara. Those results saw Cumberland, Killara and Wakehurst equal on team points and having to be separated by individual wins to determine the winner for 2012. On the back of two 7/0 wins earlier in the season Wakehurst took the Grade flag on 29 individual wins. Killara finished second with 26.5 wins, whilst Cumberland finished third with 25 wins.



#### Grade 4

Bayview put the exclamation mark on their undefeated season as they defeated Cabramatta 5/2 in the final round of Grade No. 4 at Cronulla GC. Bayview swept all before them this season on their way to the Grade No.4 flag dropping just 9.5 matches all season on their way to the title. Elanora were victorious in their final round match 5.5/1.5 over Cromer to claim second spot whilst Muirfield came in third.



## Grade 5

With just half a win separating Camden Lakeside and Randwick heading into the last round of Women's Grade No. 5, the result was going to go down to the wire. Played at Asquith Golf Club, Camden Lakeside on 3 wins took on Woollooware, while Randwick on 3.5 wins would have to defeat Asquith on their home track.

In the end the task of securing a win against a home club proved too great for Randwick as Camden Lakeside scored a resounding 4-1 victory and the Grade No. 5 title. It was a fitting end to a great season for the Camden Lakeside Ladies as they recorded victories in all completed contests.
