### Nominations are now open for the 2012 KPMG South Australian Sport Hall of Fame

Nominations for induction into the KPMG South Australian Sport Hall of Fame for 2012 are now open. Sport SA has approximately 100 nominations already on record that will be considered by the Hall of Fame Selection Committee for inclusion in 2012. All sports that sent through nominations in 2010 and 2011 also have the opportunity to renominate candidates if they believe important information had been omitted from the original nomination form Sport SA would like to see at least one nomination put forward each sport to truly reflect the diverse history of sport in South Australia. Nominations for the Sport SA Awards are now open, closing on Friday 28<sup>th</sup> September 2012. Award categories are as follows:

#### **Administrator of the Year**

The Administrator of the Year will be an individual who has made a significant contribution to their sport or the sport industry as a whole. As a result of nominees' contributions, sport in South Australia will have benefited and they will have achieved standards of excellence which set them apart from their peers.

#### **Coach of the Year**

The Coach of the Year will be an individual who has made a significant contribution to the success of a person/s or team that they have coached or been the major cause for an increased standard of coaching in the sport with which they have been associated. The

Coach of the Year award recognises outstanding performance by a South Australian Coach based on their results for athletes they coach and excellence in coaching practices at any level.

#### **Country Athlete of the Year**

The Country Athlete of the Year is a resident in the country regions of South Australia who has achieved outstanding sporting success at the state, national or international level of competition.

#### **Event of the Year**

The Event of the Year will be an event that can be considered to have achieved a high standard of excellence. A nominated event may involve local, regional, state, national or international competitors; single or multi sports and has been contested by individuals or teams, professionals or amateurs. Above all it has to set itself apart from other events through its high standard of organisation and its resounding success. The event must show a significant impact on community values, awareness of the sport/and or significant economic benefits. The state organisation must show significant involvement in the event

#### **Official of the Year**

The Official of the Year will be an individual who has attained a level of excellence in the field of officiating e.g. refereeing, umpiring, judging, medical, technical officer and whose performance sets them apart from their peers. This award recognises the outstanding South Australian official who has demonstrated dedication, skill knowledge and expertise in officiating at a local, regional, state, national or international level or who has made a significant contribution to the standard of officiating in the state.

#### **Volunteer Award**

The Volunteer Award will be given to an individual who has contributed on a voluntary basis to sport in South Australia. The recipient of this award will be an administrator, coach, official or undertake multiple roles as long as they have not received any remuneration (expenses and true honorarium allowed) in respect of their duties. This Award is not restricted to the last 12 months.

## CLUB ONE UPDATE



### The Trade in Gambling Machines

As many of the members of Sport SA would be aware the Office of the Liquor and Gambling Commission (OLGC) has recently concluded a Trade in Gaming Machine Entitlements (GMEs). The price for a GME was set by a complicated mechanism to be a selling price of \$55,472.73 (plus GST) and a buying price of \$72,630.30 (plus GST). The difference between the two is because the buyer pays a 25% tax to purchase GMEs to be removed from the system and then GST. In Club One's

research, the present real value of a GME is the buyer's price. In September 2012 there will another Trade announced. There were some 81 GMEs traded that saw 13 GMEs withdrawn; 1 in 4 Hotel sales of GMEs are withdrawn to meet the Government's target of reducing GMEs. (This means 52 Hotel GMEs were sold) Seven GMEs were transferred to Club One; 1 in 4 Club GMEs sold are returned to Club One as an effort to keep GMEs within the Club sector. (This means 28 Club GMEs were sold) In the exchange 61 GMEs went to hotel owners. Many of these replaced GMEs placed in the hotel by Club One. This will see GMEs returned to Club One and a subsequent drop in income and the capacity of Club One to fund sport and recreation. The government has a target of removing over 300 GMEs to meet the Rann Target of a 3,000 reduction. At the rate of 13 per trade, at 2 trades a year, it will take over a decade to meet the target. The sale of GMEs reflects a formula that sets a value for the GMEs. In this trade that price saw many GMEs unsold as they were above the formulated trade price, even though they were capable of being purchased given the buyers offers. In the next Trade those GMEs will be back, probably at the new price level of the first trade and from intelligence available, many of them will be from Clubs. The effect of the first Trade has been to see the start of a drift of GMEs and all their income moving permanently from Clubs to Hotels. The next Trade will indicate whether that drift will remain so or become a flood.

### Sustainable Community Recreation Facilities

The Local Government Association of SA has convened a Special Interest Group, the Local Government Recreation and Sport Facilities Sustainability Group (LGRSFSG) to identify existing and potential practices that could be shared across Councils that will improve approaches to funding and managing sport and recreation facilities. Consequently, SGL has been commissioned to research and develop "Guidelines for the Sustainable Management of Community Recreation Facilities". It is proposed that this resource will be used by Local Governments to: ensure community clubs are viable; to manage their recreation and sport facilities effectively; to encourage maximum community participation; and provide a safe and healthy sport and social environment. An on-line survey of all State Sporting Organisations and their affiliated clubs and associations in SA is being conducted. The purpose is to identify what type of management models are currently being used by local government for sport and

recreation facilities and examples of where these management arrangements are working effectively. In addition to this questionnaire, a questionnaire will be distributed to all local Councils, and a series of forums and workshops will be conducted with local government and sport throughout SA. The forums will provide the opportunity to discuss facility management issues in depth and explore directions that may lead to practices that are more financially and socially sustainable. It would be appreciated if you can complete the questionnaire and circulate this email and hyperlink to all your member clubs and associations and request they complete the questionnaire.

## **\$1 million to improve Sport facilities in Adelaide**

More people will soon be able to enjoy the benefits of sport and recreation at Adelaide's West Beach Recreation Reserve after Member for Hindmarsh Steve Georganas announced a \$1 million injection of funds for more playing fields and improved facilities.

Steve Georganas said the funding of \$1 million to the \$2.2 million project will provide two new fully-lit pitches – one synthetic, one grass – a new multipurpose grass playing field, new change rooms, kiosk and spectator seating.

"The funding announced today will allow for further investment in what is already an excellent and well-used facility that currently has 16 hectares of playing fields," Steve Georganas said.

"This project will provide new facilities for players and spectators alike, as well as improving safety at the precinct and increasing car parking.

"Importantly, this project is a partnership with the State Government, the West Beach Trust, and Football Federation of South Australia; it leverages various funding sources to achieve a great result.

Adelaide Shores CEO Kate Williams said that she was delighted Steve Georganas was able to secure the funding to enable the project to proceed.

"This will further enhance Adelaide Shores' status as an iconic sport and recreation facility in our State" she said.

"This project reinforces Adelaide Shores' commitment to providing vital community assets, which are inclusive and provide the opportunity for people in the western suburbs, and for all South Australians, to be more active and participate in sport."

Football Federation SA CEO Michael Carter congratulated the efforts of Steve Georganas, who he said had been a great ambassador for the project.

"The expansion of football pitches at Adelaide Shores is a fantastic result for football in South Australia. Adelaide Shores is in a prime location and we are delighted to have an annual presence at a venue with multiple playing fields.

"Funding received will complete stage 1 of the project at Adelaide Shores. I would like to acknowledge and thank Adelaide Shores and, in particular, CEO Kate Williams for a significant contribution and commitment to football in this State."

Steve Georganas said that the announcement was part of an overall master plan which would develop the site more broadly.

"It will greatly enhance the attractiveness and usability of the recreation reserve at West Beach and the large scale tourism and recreation precinct of Adelaide Shores" he said.

"The benefits of sport and recreation are well documented and the Australian Government is working in partnership to help create this facility that will help make this area a healthy lifestyle community hub.

"Our partnership with the world game through these new facilities will ensure that it continues to grow in South Australia, whilst also providing great benefits economically, environmentally and socially for the Adelaide community."

Steve Georganas said the project would enhance the western suburbs of Adelaide by providing more open space to the community and visitors, and would encourage more participation in sports.

"Those already playing sport will have more opportunities, and the expanded, modern facilities will attract more to the great variety of sports offered here," Steve Georganas said.

"It will encourage a more active, healthy community – and it will provide more disability friendly sports surfaces and ancillary facilities.

"By investing \$1 million, the Australian Government is also helping the local economy by attracting new events to Adelaide Shores, with such events as under-age national championships, master's games, and university games already targeted."

"I am absolutely delighted to have been able to secure this substantial grant for the benefit of people living in the western suburbs and beyond and would like to thank Adelaide Shores and the Football Federation of South Australia for their dedication and hard work to make this project come to fruition".
