

## Conditions of Play for 2013 Statewide Events

Clubs must return to the Golf SA Office by **9<sup>th</sup> August 2013**:

- Remittance Advice form with all Club Entry Fees
- Results form

Cards are not required to be returned, although clubs must retain winning cards or a photocopy of same in the event of a tie. See Condition 6.

If the Remittance Advice form, Entry Fees and the Results form are not received by the closing date of **9<sup>th</sup> August 2013**, players are ineligible for the event. No late entries will be accepted.

### International Bowl

Played in two divisions – Silver handicap to 18 and Bronze handicap 19 to 45. A single entry fee entitles a player to return up to three (3) cards in this competition, and members of more than one club may compete at any club of which they are members on payment of entry fee at each club. Any club may give permission to visiting players (other than club members) to take part in that club's competition, and may also arrange a competition for business women who have not already taken part in their club's competition.

An International Bowl Brooch, costing \$6.00 (includes GST), is available to clubs for presentation to the winner of each division. No minimum number of entries is required for each division.

- 1 Clubs should hold three 18-hole stroke competitions during the allocated period of play from 1 March to 2 August 2013.
- 2 One entry fee of \$2.20 (includes GST) entitles competitors to return cards on current handicap on all three days.
- 3 Total club entry fees to be included with the annual Remittance Advice and forwarded to GSA by the closing date of 9 August 2013. If entry fees are not received by the closing date for the competition, players are ineligible for the event.
- 4 Clubs may hold club events in conjunction with the International Bowl competition.
- 5 A player who enters the Bronze division and reduces to Silver division may then, by paying an additional entry fee (\$2.20), compete in both divisions and thus be eligible to win either or both divisions. A player who enters Silver division and increases her handicap to Bronze division may then, by paying an additional entry fee (\$2.20), compete in both divisions and thus be eligible to win either or both divisions.
- 6 All clubs must retain winning cards for each division or a photocopy of same. Only in the event of a tie will Golf SA require the winning cards for either division to be forwarded for countback purposes. In this instance, Golf SA will contact the relevant clubs to obtain cards. In the event of a tie a count-back will apply (the lowest net score in relation to the course rating recorded will be the winner). If the winning cards or a photocopy of same cannot be forwarded those players will not be considered.
- 7 The state winner in each division to be the player who defeats the Australian Women's Course Rating by the greatest number of strokes. In the event of a tie, a count-back will decide the winner.
- 8 Trophy – the WGA International Bowl to be held at the clubs of the winners for a time allocated by the GSA. A Special International Bowl Brooch, presented by GSA will be awarded to the state winner in each division, together with a prize voucher. Runners-up – prize vouchers in each division.

A competition is to be played in conjunction with the International Bowl with two handicap winners from each club affiliated with each of the eight districts plus the metropolitan area. The lowest net score in relation to the course rating recorded in a round of the International Bowl competition in each of the handicap divisions will be the winner. The entry fee for the International Bowl competition will cover both events. Winners and Runners-up in Silver and Bronze in district and metropolitan divisions will each receive a prize voucher.



#### **Laurel Wreath**

- 1 One division only. There must be at least eight entries.
- 2 Entry fee \$2.20 per player (includes GST). One Laurel Wreath per club.
- 3 Dates of play to be arranged by club committee.
- 4 Draw to be posted on the noticeboard at least one (1) week before the first round.
- 5 Only Australian handicaps to be used. Current handicaps on day of each match.
- 6 Drawn handicap match play on current handicap.
- 7 All matches to be played to a finish on handicap.
- 8 Members of more than one club may compete at any club of which they are members on payment of the entry fee at each club.
- 9 All club entry fees to be forwarded to the GSA Office with the annual Remittance Advice form by the closing date 9 August 2013. If entry fees are not received by the closing date for the competition, players are ineligible for the event.
- 10 Ride-on buggies allowed subject to club regulations and medical certificates.

#### **Shylie Rymill Foursomes (Close event)**

This event is to honour the late Mrs H L Rymill, the co-founder of the SALGU (now GSA) in 1925.

- 1 Entry fee \$2.20 per pair (includes GST).
- 2 All club entry fees to be forwarded to the GSA Office with the annual Remittance Advice form by the closing date of 9 August 2013. If entry fees are not received by the closing date for the competition, players are ineligible for the event.
- 3 Members of more than one club may compete at any club of which they are members on payment of entry fee at each club.
- 4 The event will be played as Handicap Foursomes, the winning pair recording the lowest net score in relation to AWCR. In the event of a tie a count-back will apply.
- 5 The event may be run in conjunction with a club event.
- 6 One round of 18 holes to be played between 1 March and 2 August 2013.
- 7 Half combined handicaps. Individual handicaps must be shown on score card.
- 8 All clubs must retain best (2) cards or a photocopy of same. Only in the event of a tie will Golf SA require these cards to be forwarded for countback purposes. In this instance, Golf SA will contact the relevant clubs to obtain cards. If the winning cards, or a photocopy of same cannot be forwarded, those players will not be considered.
- 9 Shylie Rymill Foursomes Brooches, costing \$12.00 per pair (\$6.00 each - includes GST), are available for presentation to the winning pair in each club. See Remittance Advice form.
- 10 Perpetual trophy to be held for one year by the club of the statewide winning pair who will receive replica ladles, presented during Open Week.

#### **Distribution of brooches**

A package containing the Laurel Wreaths, International Bowl Brooches and Shylie Rymill Foursomes Brooches ordered by each club will be forwarded to the Club's primary postal address when all monies for entries and orders for brooches have been received. The orders and payment for brooches are submitted during the year to the GSA Office on the *Remittance advice for statewide events*.

Remittance Advice and Results Forms should be completed and returned by 9 August 2013 to the GSA Office. No late entries will be accepted.
