 The club state championship event, conditions made extremely difficult by persistent rain, saw her beat Victorian Green Legend by a stroke.  
 Heard, who also earned her first national trial victory, was about seven under-par to beat Victoria's Green Legend by a stroke.

### 5 OF THE BEST

- 1 Brad Moules was cruising with a seven-shot lead with just three holes to play last year when his wheels fell off the buggy. He had back-to-back triple bogeys then three-putted the 18th to get home by just one stroke. His final round 78 was 13 shots worse than his course record effort two days earlier.
- 2 The Classic was previously known as the SAGA Invitational and its name was altered following the amalgamation of the South Australian Golf Association and Women's Golf South Australian in 2007. It is now played in conjunction with the Rene Erichsen Selver, named after the former administrator. Both are national trial events.
- 3 Then national women's amateur champion Nikki Campbell appeared to have the 2002 Rene Erichsen Selver at her mercy. But West Australian Dana Lacey had other ideas and stormed up the leader board on the final day. Lacey's three-under par 71 was a course record and enabled her to share the title with Campbell.
- 4 Missy Bagger was born a mile in Denmark. In 1999, Bagger claimed the South Australian women's amateur crown. By 2002, he had three state individual titles as well as a victory in the 2001 Rene Erichsen Selver. Bagger underwent a sex change in 1995 and is now a professional on the European Tour.
- 5 Former world No 1-ranked amateur Daniel Willett is the only international to have won the Classic. He was successful in 2008 when the event was played in conjunction with the national amateur title as a prologue to the World Amateur Teams Championship in Adelaide. Willett turned professional that year and finished into the top 100 on the

- #### PROMINENT WINNERS
- Stuart Appley** (1999): Has career earnings of \$23,247,547, with his resume including nine victories on the US PGA Tour. The winner of the 2001 Australian Open and 2010 Australian Masters, the Victorian has played in five Presidents Cup teams.
- Greg Chalmers** (1994): The West Australian has career earnings of \$6,095,030, with his biggest win being the 1998 Australian Open. Is a dual winner on the Nationwide Tour in the US and has twice finished runner-up on the US PGA Tour.
- Peter O'Halley** (1986): Has earned \$2,417,504 on the European Tour and has won three times in Europe, including the 1992 Scottish Open and 2001 English Open, is a multi-tournament winner on the Australasian Tour.
- Brett Rumford** (1996, pictured below): Won the 1999 ANZ Players Championship at Royal Queensland as an amateur. Has career earnings in Europe of \$5,615,256 and has had four wins on the European Tour, including the 2007 European Masters and 2004 Irish Open.
- Brett Ogilvie** (1985): The winner of the 1991 and 1992 South Australian Open, he also won the 1990 Australian PGA Championship and 1994 Hawaiian Open. Has won in Canada and Europe.
