

HISTORY AND HONOUR ROLL – Australian Men's Senior Amateur Match Play Championship

History

The first Australian Men's Senior Amateur Match Play Championship was played in 2007, and for the first two years was played at Barwon Heads Golf Club on Victoria's Bellarine Peninsula. In those first two years, the leading 32 players from the Men's Senior Order of Merit were eligible for the event. In 2009, the Men's Senior Order of Merit became known as the Australian Men's Senior Amateur Ranking System, and the leading 32 players from that Ranking System were then eligible.

Players contest five rounds of match play over five days, with players eliminated from the main Championship playing in various flight matches. Players must be 55 years of age or over to be eligible.
