



## 2014 AUSTRALIAN BOYS' RANKINGS FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

### 1. What Does Golf Australia use the Rankings For?

The Golf Australia Championships Area uses the Rankings as an entry criterion for their events (e.g. exemption categories for the Australian Amateur, Australian Boys' Amateur, and Australian Foursomes Championship).

The High Performance Program also uses the Rankings (along with other ranking systems that exist within amateur golf) as one of a number of tools, not a benchmark, when selecting teams/squads for national or international competition.

The Rankings also provide players, as well as the industry, the opportunity to monitor player movements based on results from particular events (known as Australian Ranking Events), across the peak of amateur golf in Australia.

### 2. What Events are Granted Australian Ranking Status?

Each National Championship (e.g. Australian Boys' Amateur), as well as each State and Territory Championship (e.g. SA Junior Championships), are automatically granted Ranking Status. Each State Association can also nominate one other major event in their State to be granted Ranking Status (e.g. Victorian Junior Masters). Golf Australia may at times, approve Ranking Status for other high quality events (e.g. Handa Junior Masters).

Junior Ranking Events must be scheduled to be played over at least 36-holes, and must not discriminate against categories of players who are eligible for the Junior Rankings (i.e. a junior event must be open to players aged under 18 years; it cannot be open solely to players aged 12-16 years, for example).

### 3. How Do I Get on the Australian Rankings?

Once you contest a Ranking Event (either a Junior Event or Open-Age Event), you automatically gain a Boys' Ranking (provided Golf Australia is aware of your date of birth). You must have played in at least one event however. If you have not contested at least one event in the previous 12-month period, your Ranking is removed.

### 4. What Does the Asterisk Mean Next to a Player's Name?

The asterisk denotes that the player is not an Australian citizen. To be selected in State and Australian Teams, players must be Australian Citizens.

### 5. What Time Period Does the Rankings Cover?

The Rankings cover the last 12-month period. This ensures the Rankings are current and reflects more recent form – as opposed to including events from the previous two years.

### 6. How Does Golf Australia Obtain the Results of the Ranking Events?

In the majority of cases, the results are sourced from the website of the Tournament's organising body.

### 7. How Long Does it Take for the Rankings to be Updated?

This depends on when the event concludes, how quickly the results can be sourced from the Tournament Organiser, and how quickly they can be entered into the Ranking System. In the majority of cases, Rankings will be updated within five (5) days of the event's conclusion.

### 8. How are the Event Weightings Determined?

The event weighting is determined on the starting field of the event for that year, based in the first instance on the following:

- Australian Boys' Amateur is weighted six (6)
- State Championships are weighted a minimum of three (3);
- Territory Championships are weighted a minimum of two (2)

Note i: After the above has been applied, the following criteria are then executed to determine the event's actual weighting. Additionally, if an event includes five (5) or more players (excluding Australians) from the Top 500 of WAGR, the event's weighting will automatically be increased by 1 level.

Note ii: With respect to State and Territory Championships, where the Stroke Play Qualifying Rounds are followed by Match Play Rounds, the Match Play Weighting is two Weightings below the Stroke Play Weighting. Events are considered ONE event with respect to the divisor.

**Example 1:**

NSW Boys' Amateur

- There are 14 players from the top 20 of the Australian Rankings who contest the event;
- There are 21 players from the top 100 of the Australian Rankings who contest the event;
- Therefore, its Stroke Play Weighting is 4.

**Example 2:**

SA Boys' Amateur

- There are 4 players from the top 20 of the Australian Rankings who contest the event;
- There are 12 players from the top 100 of the Australian Rankings who contest the event;
- Therefore, its Stroke Play Weighting based on the table is 2, however as it is a State Championship and the minimum weighting for a State Championship is 3, the weighting is increased.

If the number of rounds of a Ranking Event is reduced, the following points are allocated:

- An event reduced from 72 holes to 54 holes: no change
- An event reduced from 54 holes to 36 holes: no change
- An event reduced from 72 holes to 36 holes: the points weighting is reduced by 1 level
- An event reduced to 18 holes: the points weighting is reduced to level 1 (ie 70 points)

The Open-Age Events included in the Junior Rankings are weighted approximately 1½ times that of which they are weighted in the Open-Age Rankings. (Note: the table above is irrelevant for Open-Age Events in the Boys' Rankings). For example, the Men's Lake Macquarie Amateur may be weighted 5 in the Open Age Rankings, so would be weighted 7 in the Junior Rankings (5 x 1.5 = 7.5); 0.5 being rounded down. This recognises that finishing first in the Australian Junior Championship (6 weighting) is approximately the equivalent of finishing second in the Lake Macquarie Amateur.

Please note that events comprising stroke play rounds followed by match play rounds are considered ONE event with respect to the divisor.

**9. What Points are Allocated to Each Finishing Position?**

The following tables illustrate what points are allocated to each finishing position. Where players finish in tied positions, the points allocated to those finishing positions are averaged and split evenly among the tied players. Exception: where there is a play-off to determine the winner, the winner of the play-off will be allocated the points for the first position.

If you are disqualified from a Ranking Event, or fail to complete a round without reasonable justification (as determined by Golf Australia), you will be deemed to have been disqualified which will result in 0 points being allocated and the event counting as a divisor.

### 10. What is a Divisor?

The Divisor is the number that your Total Points is divided by to determine your Average. The Divisor is either the minimum number of events that is reasonably expected you contest in a 12-month period, or the number of events actually played, whichever is greater. The Divisor for the Boys' Rankings is eight (8), however five (5) of these events must be junior events (this encourages juniors to continue to contest junior events).

The Divisor (i.e. the number in the "Event" column) in the Boys' Rankings is shown as  $x(y)$  with  $x$  being the actual number of events played, and  $y$  being the total number of events including six junior events played or not played.

### 11. How is My Ranking Calculated?

Your Ranking is calculated by totaling the points gained in the events played, and dividing that by your Divisor. For example:

Player A                      Events: 11(12);                      Total Points: 1198.6                      Average: 99.88

Player A has physically contested 11 events, however as only four of these are junior events, and the conditions state that five junior events are counted in the Divisor, the Total Points are divided by 12. Should Player A contest one more junior event, his Ranking will read:

Player A                      Events: 12;                      Total Points: 1250                      Average: 104.17  
(Note: the Total Points and Average will obviously depend on the points gained from the 12<sup>th</sup> event)

### 12. What Happens with Points Gained in the Australian Open?

To recognise the significance of the Australian Open, if you gain points from the Australian Open, these are counted in your Total Points, however the event is not counted in your Divisor – they are effectively Bonus Points.

### **13. At What Point Am I No Longer Considered a Junior?**

So long as you are under 18 on the first day of the Ranking Period (i.e. 1 November 2013) you will be included in the Boys' Rankings. However, once you turn 18, points gained in events when you are 18 will no longer count towards your Boys' Ranking. For example, you may turn 18 on 1 May 2014, so points gained in any event up until 1 May 2014 will count towards your Boys' Ranking. After 1 May 2014, should you contest an Open-Age Event, results from this will NOT be included in your Boys' Ranking as you are no longer under 18 years of age.

### **14. What Should I Do If I See an Error in My Ranking?**

- There may be one or more players with the same or similar names;
- There may have been an error on the results gained from the Tournament Organisers;
- There may have been an error when inputting the results into the Rankings (the Rankings are managed manually, with over 3,500 players' results across over 140 events having to be physically inputted).
