CONDITIONS - South Australian Women's Amateur Championship

1. Format

- 1.1 The Women's Championship will be played in two separate sections.
- 1.2 (i) The first section will be decided by stroke play over two qualifying rounds. Each player in the Championship will play the first round at Blackwood Golf Club and the second round at Flagstaff Hill Golf Club. This section will be known as the Qualifying rounds.
 - (ii) There will be no cut in the first section of the Women's Championship.
- 1.3 The leading qualifier of the first section of the Women's Championship will receive a medal and hold the Vesta Cup for one year. In the event of a tie, players in such a tie will continue over such holes as the Championship Match Committee will decide in a sudden-death, hole-by-hole play-off until the winner is determined.
- 1.4 After the first section of the Women's Championship the eight (8) lowest scores in each will compete in the second section of the Women's Championship.
- 1.5 In the event of there being a tie for a position after the first section of the Women's Championship such that more than 8 players remain in the respective competition, those players tying for the last qualifying position or positions will continue over such holes as the Championship Match Committee determines in a sudden-death, hole-by-hole play-off until the 8 qualifiers for the second section of that event have been determined. However, if the Championship Match Committee determines that there is not sufficient time available for a play-off, such a tie will be resolved by lot.
- 1.6 The second section of the Women's Championship will be played at Kooyonga Golf Club and consist of successive rounds of match play, with losers being eliminated and winners progressing to the next round. The automatic draw will be applied to establish the match pairings.
- 1.7 In the event of a halved match in any round players will continue to play until a winner is determined.
- 1.8. The winner of the Women's Championship will be the SA Amateur Champion and hold the Amateur Championship Cup for one year.

2. Match Committee

- 2.1 The Match Committee will comprise the Golf SA Match Committee.
- 2.2 In the absence of the full Match Committee, such members as may be present at the time, may give a decision, and any decision so given will be deemed to be a decision of the full Match Committee.
- 2.3 The Match Committee will have the sole management and control of the Championship, with full power at any time to alter or vary any one of the Conditions.
- 2.4 The Match Committee's decision on matters affecting the Championship will be final.
- 2.5 Any dispute or protest must be made to the Match Committee not more than 15 minutes after the conclusion of play on the day on which the disputed matter has arisen.

3. Rules of Play

3.1 The Rules of Golf, as adopted by R & A Rules Limited, will apply together with Local Rules of the venue Club.

4. Entries

4.1 Eligible players for the Championship are female amateurs whose Golf Australia Handicap or overseas equivalent does not exceed GA 18.4 strokes.

- 4.2 The Entrance Fee for the Championship is \$55.00 (including GST).
- 4.3 Entries must be made via the Golf SA online registration system. Entries by any other method will not be accepted.
- 4.4 The decision of the Match Committee as to acceptance or refusal of any entry will be final.
- 4.5 Late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the Match Committee.
- 4.6 Players must register by 5.00pm on Friday 28th February 2014. IT IS THE SOLE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE ENTRANT THEMSELVES TO ENSURE THAT THEY HAVE REGISTERED CORRECTLY. A player has not officially registered until their name is listed in the **Registered Participants** section of the event registration page.
- 4.7 The Match Committee reserves the right to determine the size of the field. If a ballot is required, the higher handicap competitors will be eliminated first. Unsuccessful entrants will be informed without delay. Entrance fees will be refunded to competitors balloted out.

Conforming Golf Balls, Conforming Driver Heads, One Ball Condition and Time of Starting

5.1 The specimen conditions in the Rules of Golf are in effect as regards Conforming Golf Balls, Conforming Driver Heads, One Ball Condition and Time of Starting.

6. Drug Testing

6.1 All competitors are subject to drug testing by the Australian Sports Anti-Doping Agency for banned substances as laid down in Golf Australia's Anti-Doping Policy. Any competitor infringing this policy, or refusing to take a test, will be disqualified and subject to any sanction(s) brought down by ASADA.

7. Smoking

7.1 Players are prohibited from smoking cigarettes, cigars or the like during a stipulated round. See Golf SA's Code of Conduct.

8. Mobile Phones

8.1 Mobile phones must be switched off when on the golf course and may only be used in an emergency.

9. Pace of Play

9.1 Rule 6-7 will be strictly enforced. Each group must maintain its position on the course with respect to the group preceding it. Any group with a clear hole in front of it will be considered to be out of position. Penalties will be issued to individuals in such groups who by their pace contribute to such delay. Warnings may not be issued prior to penalties.

10. Motorised Transport

10.1 Ride-on buggies will be permitted only on medical evidence from the player's Club and by permission of the venue Club. Application and approvals to be forwarded to Golf SA at time of registration. Caddies are not permitted to use ride-on buggies.

11. Code of Conduct

11.1 All entrants assent to be bound by Golf SA's Code of Conduct. A copy of the Code is available at www.golfsa.com.au

12. Measuring Devices

11.1 For all play, a player may obtain distance information using a device that measures distance only (this does not include applications for mobile phones).

13. Draws

13.1 Tee times will be available on the Golf SA website www.golfsa.com.au from Tuesday 11th March 2014.
