### Welcoming party

Monday 20<sup>th</sup> July 2015 at 4.30pm at Willunga Golf Club. Casual or golf wear.

### Event 1

Bronze Salver – 36 holes stroke play (18 holes played on Tuesday and 18 holes played on Wednesday). Winner to hold Golf SA Salver for one year. Trophies for winner, runner-up, best net aggregate and best 18 holes gross each day.

### Event 2

18 holes handicap stroke play on Tuesday. Trophies for winner and runner-up.

### Event 3 (in conjunction with event 1)

Veterans' handicap event – 36 holes stroke play. Open to players who have reached their 65th birthday by the first day of play. Trophies for winner and best gross aggregate.

### Event 4

18 holes handicap stroke play on Wednesday. Trophies for winner and runner-up.

### Event 5

#### Country v Metro Salver

Country and Metro will be represented by 12 players each to be drawn from the entrants on the Monday preceding the first day of play. The best net aggregate total on Tuesday will win the Salver. (See Conditions)

### Event 6

18 holes handicap foursomes stroke played on Thursday. Trophies for winner, runner-up and best gross.

A light luncheon will be served at the conclusion of play of the foursomes when the trophies will be presented.

**Note – players may take only one trophy in event 6.**

### Dinner

Players are invited to a dinner on Wednesday evening at **Willunga Sports & Social Club** at 6.00pm for 6.30pm - Presentation of trophies at dinner.

**\*\*Please nominate at the time of registration for the dinner - \$35 per person\*\***

## Conditions of play

1. Registrations must be made via the Golf SA online registration system. Entries by any other method will not be accepted.
2. Players must register by **5.00pm on Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> July 2015**. IT IS THE SOLE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE ENTRANT THEMSELVES TO ENSURE THAT THEY HAVE REGISTERED CORRECTLY. A player has not officially registered until their name is listed in the **Registered Participants** section of the event registration page.
3. Entries may be limited to 150
4. Late entries will only be accepted at the discretion of the Match Committee.
5. No registration fee or dinner cost refunded after closing date.
6. These events are open to female amateurs with an Australian Handicap or overseas equivalent.
7. Competitors are requested to bring proof of handicap
8. A player entering on the GA handicap limit of 16.1 who reduces her GA handicap before the first day of play may apply for transfer to the (next event) i.e. Silver Country Meeting or
- 8a: A Player entering on the GA handicap limit of 16.1 who reduces her GA handicap before the first day of play may apply to Golf SA or its representatives for permission to continue in the entered event, on her reduced daily handicap, and is only eligible for events 2-6.
9. A player entering on the GA handicap limit of 21.4 who exceeds that GA handicap before the first day of play may remain in the Bronze Salver playing on the daily handicap limit.
10. Players to use their first day daily handicap for all events
11. Foursomes – if through illness or another unavoidable cause one entrant has to withdraw after the closing date of entries, her partner may substitute another player in her stead.
12. The Match Committee shall have the right to refuse or accept an entry of any person without being required to give a reason for so doing.
13. The Match Committee to make all arrangements and have full power to alter or make any variation in the Conditions.
14. The Match Committee to be absolute umpire of any dispute or protest, which must be lodged in writing at the host Clubhouse before 6.00pm on the day on which the dispute has arisen.
15. The Match Committee may, in the event of bad weather or for any other reason, alter the venue, time or day of play. In the event of dangerous conditions (eg lightning) the signal for suspending play will be a prolonged note of the siren. Players must discontinue play immediately and not resume play until the committee has ordered a resumption of play. Penalty for failing to discontinue is disqualification. Refer Rule 6-8c & d for lifting/replacing ball.
16. The Rules of Golf, the local rules of the host Club and the Rules of GA shall be the Rules of Play.
17. Competitors will be drawn in such manner as the Match Committee shall arrange.
18. Competitors must start at the appointed time, unless under circumstances approved by the Match Committee. Competitors must report to the starter 15 minutes before the appointed tee time.
19. If there is a tie for the winner in event 1, there will be a sudden-death play-off. All other ties by countback as per the current Rules of Golf and the Rules of Amateur Status book.
20. Players are prohibited from smoking cigarettes, cigars or the like during a stipulated round. See Golf SA's Code of Conduct.
21. All competitors are subject to drug testing by the Australian Sports Anti-Doping Agency for banned substances as laid down in Golf Australia's Anti-Doping Policy. Any competitor infringing this policy, or refusing to take a test, will be disqualified and subject to any sanction(s) brought down by ASADA.
22. Mobile phones must be switched off when on the golf course and may only be used in an emergency.
23. Ride-on buggies will be permitted only on medical evidence from the player's Club and by permission of the venue Club. Application and approvals to be forwarded to the host club. Caddies are not permitted to use ride-on buggies.
24. A player may obtain distance information using a device that measures distance only.
25. Country v Metro - If there is insufficient players to have a team of 12 the Golf SA representative may alter the amount of players at the time of the draw. If any player fails to finish the stipulated round the highest net score from the opposing team will not be counted.

### Notes

- Competitors are requested to bring their GolfLink cards or print out from home club to this meeting as they may be disqualified if evidence of correctness of handicaps is not available.
- Please observe dress regulations of host Club.
- Draws will be posted in competitors' Clubhouses.
- Presentation of trophies – at dinner on Wed 22<sup>nd</sup> July
