

HISTORY AND HONOUR ROLL – Australian Women’s Interstate Teams Matches *(for the Gladys Hay Memorial Cup)*

History

The first interstate match was played in 1897, then 1906 to 1939 and from 1947. In 1933 the series became the Gladys Hay Memorial Cup in honour of Miss Hay to perpetuate her great contribution to the game both as an administrator (Foundation Member of the ALGU and Council Member 1921-23) and player (Australian Champion 1922).

Each team consists of six players, with four players taking part in the two foursomes, and five players involved in the singles.

From 2007, the Women’s, Men’s and Colts Interstate Teams Matches were played concurrently in the same city.

In 2011 the foursomes matches were removed which each team contesting singles matches only. At the conclusion of the five singles rounds, team one and two play each another in a final with teams three and four, and five and six, playing off for third and fifth place respectively.

Gladys Hay

Gladys Hay was the winner of the last Victorian Championship before World War 1 (1914) and the first after it (1920 and 1921). It is considered that the war detracted from Gladys gaining an even more impressive record. She was very committed to the establishment of associate golf at her own club, Metropolitan in Melbourne, and was a prominent administrator who became widely recognised as an authority on the Rules of the game.
