2015 MEN'S COUNTRY WEEK TEAMS EVENT CONDITIONS (Version – 05/06/2015)

(To be read in conjunction with general conditions for Country Week and the Golf Victoria Standard Conditions of Competition)

Definitions

- (i) 'Golf Victoria' (GV) is the parent body for golf clubs and amateur golf in Victoria.
- (ii) A 'District' means a District as defined in the Golf Victoria Constitution.
- (iii) The Men's Country Week competition is under the control of the GV Match Committee.
- (iv) The competition between two District teams is known as a 'contest'.
- (v) The contests grouped together in the draw generally played at the same venue on the same day is a 'round'.
- (vi) A contest is 'decided' when all matches have been completed or one district has won a minimum of four individual matches (Plate & Bowl) and five individual matches (Shield).
- (vii) Championship Committee is responsible for administering the competition at the venue. See Condition 5.1.

2. Eligibility

2.1 Districts

(i) Each District may enter one team only in the Men's Country Week Teams Event.

2.2 Players

- (i) Players and non-playing Captains selected by Districts must be male amateur playing members of a Golf Victoria affiliated country club in the District they represent OR an individual Golf Victoria affiliated country member, who holds a District Affiliation of the District he wishes to represent, irrespective of residential location.
- (ii) Players must have played a minimum of 10 competition rounds at either the affiliated country club or in designated District events in the preceding twelve months for the player to be eligible.

Note: Non-stroke Club or District events such as District Pennant or club match play events (as approved by the GV Match Committee) will also count towards the minimum of 10 competition rounds.

Exception: Upon application, the Golf Victoria Match Committee will consider an exemption being granted to a player for this condition.

- (iii) Should any doubts arise as to the eligibility of one of their players, a District must apply in writing to the Golf Victoria Match Committee for a decision. Any queries by opposing teams regarding a player's eligibility must be lodged with the Golf Victoria Championship Committee before he plays his second match.
- (iv) Should an ineligible player be included in a team, his match shall be forfeited

3. Method of Play

3.1 General

(i) The events are to be competed for annually by a team of players from each District Golf Association, which is registered with Golf Victoria. District Golf Associations shall be graded upon performances in three Divisions, those in Division "A" shall compete for the "Shield", those in Division "B" for the "Plate" and those in Division "C" shall compete for the "Bowl".

Note:-Teams in the Shield Competition shall consist of nine (9) players. Teams in the Plate and Bowl competitions shall consist of seven (7) players.



- (ii) In each Division, each team will play each other team once.
- (iii) The competitions between teams will be known as contests, and in the event of the number of contests being won being equal, the winning team in each Division will be that team which has the greatest number of wins in individual matches. In the event of individual matches being equal, the decision shall be reached by countback based on the results of the contest between the tied teams during the round robin competition. Should the teams still remain tied and cannot be separated, a count back system decided upon by the Golf Victoria Match Committee will be applied.
- (iv) In order to realign the Shield, Plate and Bowl competitions for 2016, the <u>leading team</u> in Divisions "B" and "C" will be promoted to Divisions "A" and "B" respectively for the 2016 competition. The lowest <u>two teams</u> in Division "A" and "B" will be relegated to Divisions "B" and "C" respectively for the 2016 competition. For all promotion and relegation situations, when teams are tied on contests and matches won, the decision as to the final finishing order will be reached by countback based on the result of the contests between tied teams during the round-robin competition. In the case of a squared contest and/or teams unable to be separated on this basis, the finishing order will be determined by using a count back system decided upon by the Golf Victoria Match Committee.
- (v) The Captain of each team shall prepare a list of the players in his team, numbered 1 to 9 (Shield) or 1 to 7 (Plate and Bowl). Before the commencement of a contest, such lists shall be exchanged by the opposing Captains, and the individual matches shall be played by the opposing players in the reverse order in which their respective names appear in such lists.
- (vi) Contests shall commence from tees at the times and in the order listed on the draw unless otherwise advised by Golf Victoria. Teams listed first will have the honour.
- (viii) All matches shall be played over eighteen holes match play. Matches being square after eighteen holes shall be considered "halved". A halved match shall be counted as half a win. In addition, the following solution is to be used to assign a hole result for forfeited matches in the Men's Country Week Teams Event as indicated below:

<u>Scenario</u>	Result
Player B concedes or forfeits match to Player A without any play occurring.	10/8 win to Player A.
Player A & B commence match. Prior to the 10 th hole, Player B concedes match for some reason (eg. injury).	Player A is credited with winning each remaining hole until a victory is achieved.
Player A & B commence match and play at least 10 holes. Player B concedes after the 11th hole when Player A was leading 4 up.	6/5 win to Player A. Player A is credited with winning each remaining hole until a victory is achieved.
Player A & B commence match and play at least ten holes. Player B concedes after the 11 th hole when he was leading 4 up.	2/1 win to Player A. Player A is credited with winning each remaining hole until a victory is achieved.

(viiii) As specified by Rule of Golf 6-3a, If a player arrives at their starting tee, ready to play, within five minutes after their starting time, the penalty for failure to start on time is loss of the 1st hole instead of disqualification. Play will commence from the 2nd hole.

3.2 Pace of play

(i) All matches are expected to complete 18 holes in a maximum time of 3 hours and 45 minutes (approximately 12 and a half minutes per hole). In exceptional circumstances (such as extreme weather/playing conditions), the Championship Committee has the authority to modify this time requirement.



- (ii) The first match of a contest will be considered to be out of position if at any point in the round the match is taking more than an average of 12 and a half minutes per hole to play.
- (iii) Any following match will be considered out of position if it
 - (a) falls a clear hole behind the preceding match; and
 - (b) is taking more than an average of 12 and a half minutes per hole to play.
- (iv) If a match is out of position, loss of hole penalties may be issued by either the GV member(s) of the Championship Committee or appointed Referees to an individual who, by their pace of play is responsible for such delay. If this occurs, the player in breach may also be required to appear before the GV member(s) of the Championship Committee at the conclusion of play and may be subject to suspension from further match(es) in the current series.
- (v) If both players in a match are equally contributing to an unacceptable pace of play, they may be 'walked' a hole(s) until they are considered to be in position. If this occurs, both players may be required to appear before the GV member(s) of the Championship Committee at the conclusion of play and may be subject to suspension from further match(es) in the current series.
- (vi) Repeated infringements of the pace of play requirements in the current series may be referred to the Match Committee and may see a player subject to further action in accordance with the GV Code of Conduct.

Note:

1st Offence Player will be issued an official warning regarding pace of play for first offence.

Subsequent penalties will be issued as follows:

2nd Offence Loss of Hole

3rd Offence Loss of Hole and final warning

4th Offence Disqualification

3.3 Suspension of play and abandonment of contests

- (i) In the event of heavy rain, lightning, fog, extreme heat, unplayable course conditions or for any other reason, the Championship Committee will be responsible for deciding whether to suspend or resume play. The signal for suspending play will be three short siren blasts. The procedure when play is suspended is outlined under Rule of Golf 6-8b.
- (ii) When the course is ready for play, players will be advised to return to their various locations. The signal for the resumption of play will be one long siren blast. Every effort should be made to complete all contests on the scheduled day.
- (iii) Matches Yet to Commence: If a course is declared unplayable by the host club prior to the stipulated time of the first match commencing, and remains unplayable for more than one hour thereafter, then a decision will be made by the Championship Committee with a view of abandoning play for that contest. If play is abandoned, the matches affected will be halved and the points shall be shared. Through consultation with the host club, it is the responsibility of the Championship Committee to make the final decision to abandon play.
- (iv) Contest Commenced: If a course is declared unplayable by the host club and the matches have commenced, the Championship Committee must SUSPEND play immediately. If the course remains unplayable for more than one hour thereafter, then the Championship Committee will make a decision with a view to abandoning play for that contest. If play is abandoned, the contest will be halved and the points shall be shared. Through consultation with the host club, it is the responsibility of the Championship Committee to make the final decision to abandon play.

Note:

Refer to Rule 6-8 c and d with regard to lifting and replacing ball for suspension of play.

3.4 Practice

(i) Players are not permitted to practise on the course on the day of competition prior to the commencement of their matches. Breach of this condition will be disgualification of the player(s) involved. Prior to the commencement of



their matches, players may practise on the designated practice areas of the host club and in accordance with the exception to Rule of Golf 7-1.

(ii) Following the commencement of their matches, players may practise in accordance with Rule of Golf 7-2. However, players should note that penalties may still be applied in accordance with Rule of Golf 6-7 to any player who delays play by such actions.

3.5 Liaison Officers & Team Managers

- (i) Each district must nominate a liaison officer. Failure to do so will automatically disqualify a District from competing in the "Shield", "Plate", or "Bowl" events. Liaison officers shall not be playing members of a Team.
- (ii) Distircts may nominate a team manager. In accordance with the Note to Rule of Golf 8-1, team managers are authorised to give advice to members of her team. Team managers are not part of a match and are considered to be outside agencies.
- (iii) A player accepting advice from persons other than his team manager or his caddie will be subject to penalty in accordance with Rule of Golf 8-1.

3.6 Distance Measuring Devices

Players may obtain distance information by using a device that measures distance only. However, if during Pennant, a player uses a distance measuring device that is designed to gauge or measure other conditions that might affect his/her play (eg, gradient, windspeed, temperature, etc), the player is in breach of Rule of Golf 14-3, for which the penalty is disqualification, regardless of whether any such additional functions are actually used.

Note:

With respect to smart phones and applications on the device, any other applications that could actively gauge or measure non-conforming factors (e.g. an anemometer or thermometer) would render the phone automatically non-conforming, even although the specific distance application does not measure these aspects. These apps or capabilities that gauge or measure would have to be removed from the phone to ensure it conforms for use in a competition – switching them off or not using them does not make the phone conforming.

Where the device contains other applications or features (e.g. a camera, video camera or spirit level), provided these applications or features are not used during a round in such a way that could assist the player in his/her play (e.g. videoing swing to analyse fault or gauging slope or green contours), the distance-measuring application is permitted.

As the Internet is now available on most mobile phones and multi-functional devices, it is possible to access information through this route at any time. Provided the player, during a round, does not use the Internet to access information or find measurement tools which would, if used, be a breach of Rule 14-3, there is no breach of the Local Rule and the phone may be used as a distance-measuring device.

3.7 Dress, footwear and course requirements

- (i) Players and caddies are required to wear footwear in accordance with host club policy. Penalty for breach: Disqualification of player.
- (ii) Caddies must be attired in accordance with host club dress standards and any caddie not attired in this manner will be withdrawn.
- (iii) Players or caddies who fail to adhere to the host club's dress and course requirements (eg. failure to carry/use sand buckets, slicks on buggies, returning buggies to the pro-shop, littering, leaving the car park in an untidy state etc) will be subject to sanction in accordance with the GV Code of Conduct.
- (iv) Districts are strongly encouraged to ensure that their supporters are attired in accordance with the host club's dress standard.



4. Adjudication

4.1 Championship Committee

The Championship Committee shall consist of representatives of the Golf Victoria Board/Match Committee; Golf Victoria Chief Operating Officer, Golf Victoria Golf Events Coordinators; appointed Golf Victoria staff; one representative of the Match Committee of the club upon whose course the competition is being conducted and appointed Liaison Officers. In the absence of a full Committee, such members thereof as may be present at the time, may give a decision and any such decision given, shall be deemed to be a decision of the full Committee.

The Committee shall have the entire management of the competitions, with full power to alter or vary the conditions. For the purpose of resolving problems concerning the playing conditions of the course for Shield, Plate and Bowl matches, each District can be represented on the Committee for that Contest, by the team captain or manager. In the event of bad weather, or for any other reason, the Championship Committee may shorten the competition, appoint another day or days for completion of, or may transfer play to another course. The Committee's decision will be final in all matters affecting all events. Protests must be made to the Committee within ten (10) minutes of the conclusion of the day's play in stroke or stableford events and within ten minutes after the conclusion of a match in the Shield, Plate or Bowl Contests.

Results

5.1 Ladders

- (i) Points will be allocated as follows:
 - a) Contests: one point will be awarded for a team win, half a point will be awarded for a squared contest.
 - b) Matches: one point will be awarded for an individual win, half a point will be awarded for a squared match.
- (ii) Prior to the final round, Division ladders will be calculated as follows:
 - (a) teams are positioned on their ladder in descending order of contests won;
 - (b) teams tied on contests won are ordered by numbers of matches won;
 - (c) teams still tied are ordered by the result of the most recent contest in the current competition between the two teams;
 - (d) if the contest was undecided or the teams have not played each other in the current competition, teams still tied are ordered alphabetically.
 - (iii) Ladders will be published on the Results Vault website http://golf.resultsvault.com/ and the Golf Victoria website www.golfvic.org.au, as soon as practicable after each contest.
- (iv) No contest or match wins will be awarded to any team receiving a bye.

6. Code of Conduct

- All players, caddies and club officials are required to abide by GV's Code of Conduct.
- (ii) In the event that a person is reported for a possible breach of the GV Code of Conduct, such report will be considered by GV's Match Committee.
- (iii) The GV Code of Conduct and Disciplinary procedures can be found on the Golf Victoria website, www.golfvic.org.au.



DIMENSIONS OF LOGO'S IN COMPLIANCE WITH RULES OF AMATEUR STATUS

Clothing including headwear, issued by a commercial sponsor to individual golfers may only bear the small emblem of the clothing or headwear manufacturer, and the event concerned (which may or may not include the logo of the sponsor of the event).

If clothing or headwear is issued by a sponsor to individuals in any event, it must be available to all and not just selected players.


Teams: Where a National, State, District or Club Team is sponsored, the members of the team may have on their uniforms the emblem of the Team (e.g. a golf club logo) and the small name or logo of either or both the sponsor and the manufacturer.

The sponsor's or manufacturer's name or logo must not appear more than once on each garment and must not exceed a <u>cumulative</u> perimeter measurement of 220mm.

Team Managers **must** ensure that players and teams are fully compliant with these requirements.

Please refer to documentation on the Rules of Amateur Status and/or the Decisions on the Rules Amateur Status, which should be readily accessible via your club or district. Copies may be obtained from Golf Victoria at a nominal cost, if required.

NOTES FOR LIAISON OFFICERS AND TEAM MANAGERS

Identification - Liaison Officers

The Liaison Officer will be identified by a nametag. They are requested to be at the course at least 20 minutes before the first hit-off time and made themselves known to the Professional, Golf Victoria/Rules Officials (as applicable), the Club Office and the Team Managers. The Liaison Officer should then remain in attendance around the tee area until all players have hit off, assisting the starter where necessary.

Starter

Together with a Golf Victoria Representative, Liaison Officers will assist with starting duties at individual events. The Liaison Officer should supervise the hit-off for the Shield, Plate and Bowl matches in co-operation with Team Managers.

Result Sheets - Shield, Plate and Bowl Matches

- All match results should be reported to the Golf Victoria representative as soon as possible following the conclusion of the match.
- The appointed District Liaison Officer is required to collect the results sheets and ensure delivery to the Golf Victoria representative at the venue.
- Golf Victoria will then forward all results through to the relevant newspapers, media etc. for publication and update the Golf Victoria Website at www.golfvic.org.au and via Results Vault-http://golf.resultsvault.com/

Luncheon Arrangements

Individual Events

Catering for individual Country Week events is undertaken by a voucher system. Each competitor will be issued with a lunch voucher for which the respective host club will provide a meal. The lunch cost has been included in the event entry fee for all individual Country Week events.

- Shield, Plate and Bowl Competitions

As occurred in previous years, lunch tables (one-two per District team) have been pre-arranged at each host venue for six District teams on each day of the Shield competition and nine District teams on each day of the Plate and Bowl competitions (including the final day). The arrangements have been made on the basis of a minimum of 12 players/officials for Shield teams and 10 players/officials for Plate/Bowl teams.

While luncheon arrangements are at the club's discretion, traditionally soup, sandwiches/rolls, fruit and water/Gatorade will be provided for District teams at the Shield, Plate & Bowl competitions. As per current catering rates applicable at host venues, an allowance of \$20.00 (incl. GST) per player has been determined for the provision of lunches.

Golf Victoria will pre-pay the catering costs with all Shield and Plate/Bowl host clubs. However all Districts will be required to forward payment of \$720 (Shield), \$600 (Plate) and \$400 (Bowl) for their respective catering costs including **prior to the commencement of Country Week**. Should additional numbers of player/officials require catering, it's requested that this be advised via the attached Team Catering return form.

Note: Districts with a bye in the final round of the Plate completion will not be charged for lunch on the Friday (unless otherwise requested) and will be billed a lower amount. The final day bye will be rotated amongst the Districts. In view of match schedule, lunch tables will be available from 11.30am. Any food items and/or drinks not supplied as above that are ordered/consumed by District players/officials will be at the each District/individual's expense.

Notes:

- (i) This catering arrangement is a replication of what occurs at the Australian Interstate Teams Series and enables players to walk straight into a lunch arrangement following the completion of morning matches.
- (ii) All Districts are expected to support the above arrangement in order to maintain good relations with host clubs and improve the conduct of the day.



Draws

The draws for the individual events will be circulated to players and District approximately one week prior to the event. The Draws for the Shield, Plate and Bowl contests are included in this information booklet.

Course regulations and care

It is the responsibility of all players to observe their obligations as guests during the series.

Golf Victoria and State Level Referees will be monitoring the field during the events to ensure appropriate course etiquette is being adhered to by all players.

While expected levels of Golf Etiquette are fully outlined in Section 1 of the Rules of Golf book, players should give particular attention to the following etiquette issues;

- The carrying of sand buckets and use of sand to repair all divots.
- The repair of pitch marks on greens.
- The placement of litter in rubbish bins.
- The raking of all bunkers after playing from them.
- Behaviour that distracts the attention of fellow-competitors including the use of audible obscene language and club throwing.
- Non-emergency use of mobile telephones.

Note: Players who are observed to display serious breaches of etiquette may be disqualified in accordance with Rule of Golf 33-7.

In addition, after completion of each round all sand buckets and pull buggies must be returned to their respective dispenser units. Under no circumstances must these items be left scattered in the club car park. Players who are observed to leave sand buckets and/or pull buggies in the club car park will be subject to action in accordance with the Golf Victoria Code of Conduct.

Scoreboard

Golf Victoria will provide and maintain a scoreboard in a prominent place, (outside if weather permits) giving a summary of progress in each match. As in past years, the "official" scoresheets will be used for this purpose.


