The past year has continued to be a busy and positive one for Golf NT with increased club membership up 6% NT wide, with excellent growth of 9% in Katherine and healthy increases in Palmerston and RAAF Darwin. Overall growth of the game and club viability continues to present challenges we need to overcome. This is no different than what the Australia wide golf fraternity are experiencing.

Some of the highlights of the 2014/15 year have been:-

- Continued NT Government Funding with granting of Tier 1 Status.
- Continued Strong support from Golf Australia with renewing of the MOU.
- Ongoing development of the men's and women's high performance squads.
- Ongoing junior golf development support by the joint venture agreement with the PGA & My Golf has been most welcome.
- Excellent School Visit Program & Golf NT Junior Academy established.
- The appointment of a full time Golf Operations Manager in Brett Rankin has paid handsome dividends as can be seen from the 2014-15 year in review.
- The successful entry of the NT into the Australia Men's Interstate Championships.
- The ongoing updates of the Rules of Golf & Monitoring of the New GA Handicap System.
- Increased media coverage through NT News, Facebook, Twitter and website upgrade.
- Jason De Araujo's continued representation at Australian Open Championship events.

The above has only been possible through dedicated work by the Committee, Staff and Volunteers and Member Clubs.

Our finances have remained solid yet challenging, but controlled under the guidance of Sandy Ford (Treasurer). The strong support from the NT Government, Channel Nine and the Carbine Club of the NT assists greatly.

I would like to thank all our Sponsors for their ongoing support (these are mentioned in detail later in the report).

I would like to thank and farewell Rosemary Campbell after serving as the Women's co-ordinator with excellent results. She will be missed.

I would like to thank all the Committee Members for their contribution, and our staff Brett Rankin (Golf Operations Manager) and Vicki Bridge (Office Manager) for their tireless work and contribution to Golf NT's successful year.

PATHWAY PROGRAMS:

Boys Interstate Series

An admirable result considering that NT were without its two strongest players in recent times, Josh Hetherington and Troy Parmenter. Josh represented Victoria and Troy was unavailable due to illness. Alice Springs provided four players (George Worrall, Mitch Gridley, Dan Brown and Joe Worrall), whilst Thomas Johnston (Darwin GC) and Zac Hughes (Palmerston GC) were the other team members.

Five of the team are still age eligible in 2016 which is an encouraging sign.



Mens Interstate Series

For the first time in 111 years, the Northern Territory Golf Community were able to witness their own elite amateur golfers compete with Australia's best last week in Melbourne at the historic Huntingdale Golf Course.

The Australian Men's Interstate Series played host to the NT team for the first time and the local players did an excellent job as they pitted their skills against the larger States and more fancied rivals.

The majority of players were giving away up to five shots to each opponent in the individual Match Play contests. It was the youngest member of the team, Mitchell Gridley, who created history by winning the first ever match for NT as he disposed of his Western Australian rival on the 18th hole. Mitch again followed up with a victory against his Tasmanian rival, as did the evergreen Darwin Golf Club member, Peter Hargreaves who had a convincing 5/4 win in the same contest.

It was a great week for the entire team. The experience and knowledge gained from last week will assist with taking Golf in the NT to a new level over the next 12 months.

The Series will be hosted by Brisbane Golf Club in May, 2016.

Club Membership has experienced a moderate increase of 4.4% during the reporting period. Healthy increases at Palmerston GC and RAAF Darwin have assisted in the overall increase. Gove Country Club has experienced another decline during this reporting period but the decline has certainly stabilised.

It must also be noted the 9% increase in Membership at Katherine Golf Club, which indicates that the investment in the region is having a positive impact.

- Assist with funding for 3 Junior Holiday Clinics one in Alice Springs and two in Darwin
- Engage local clubs to embrace Play Golf Month
- Conduct a Junior Clinic for Indigenous Juniors
- Engage Clubs to embrace Golf as an activity in Seniors Week (Aug 2016)
- Monitor and improve the Golf NT Pathway as required.

AUDITOR'S REPORT

Independent Audit Report to the members of Golf NT Incorporated

Report on the Financial Report

We have audited the accompanying financial report being a special purpose financial report, of Golf NT Incorporated, which comprises the statement of assets and liabilities as at June 30, 2015, the statement of profit or loss for the year then ended, notes comprising a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information, and the officers' assertion statement.

Committee's Responsibility for the Financial Report

The Committee of Golf NT Incorporated is responsible for the preparation of the financial report and have determined that the basis of preparation described in Note 1, is appropriate to meet the needs of the members. The Committee's responsibility also includes such internal control as the Committee determines is necessary to enable the preparation and fair presentation of a financial report that is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on the financial report based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. Those standards require that we comply with relevant ethical requirements relating to audit engagements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial report is free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial report. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgement, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial report, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial report in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial report.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our qualified audit opinion.

Basis for Qualified Opinion

As is common for organisations of this type, it is not practicable for Golf NT Incorporated to maintain an effective system of internal control over sales and other income until their initial entry into the accounting records and bank statements. Our audit in relation to these items was limited to amounts recorded in the accounting records. Accordingly, we are unable to express an opinion on the completeness of income.

Qualified Opinion

In our opinion, except for the possible effects of the matter described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion paragraph, the financial report presents fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of Golf NT Incorporated as at June 30, 2015, and its financial performance for the year then ended.
