Commencement of Registered Clubs Amendment (Exception to 5 Kilometre Rule) Regulation 2015

The NSW Office of Liquor, Gaming and Racing (OLGR) announced that an amendment has been made to the Registered Clubs Regulation 2015 to provide a new exception to the 5 kilometre rule that will support clubs and their important role in providing refuge for people during emergencies, e.g. floods, bushfires, storms and heatwaves.
