CONDITIONS OF PLAY.

1. The competition will be played according to the Rules of Golf adopted by the Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St Andrews and subject to such Local Rules that are in force on the Rosebud and The Dunes Courses during the period of the competition.
2. Conduct of the tournament will be under the direction of the GPV Executive, and the Match Committee of the two Host Clubs.
3. Competitors must report to the start 15 minutes before he or she hits off.
4. Ties will be decided by a count-back over the inward 9 holes, 6 holes and 3 holes, and then hole by hole.
5. Competitors must be under 18 on the day of the Competition.
6. All competitors must have a current Australian Handicap.
7. Dress regulations apply at both Courses. Neat casual clothes must be worn at all times, both on the course and in the Clubhouse. Cargo trousers, cargo shorts, denim jeans, track suits or any other untidy clothing will not be permitted. Only soft spikes permitted.

NOTE: All members of a GPV Member Club playing the 36 Hole Peninsula Junior Masters will be eligible to win the Peninsula Junior Boys and Girls Championships.

GPV COMPETITION CONDITIONS

GPV CLUBS ONLY

DISTRICT JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. The GPV Executive in collaboration with the host clubs (hereinafter referred to as the "committee") will be responsible for the management of the event.
2. Entry in the GPV District Junior Championships (36 Hole Event) is restricted to financial amateur male and female members, with golf playing rights, of the GPV Member Clubs who must, if required by the Committee, be able to produce evidence of current handicap before being eligible to win a handicap competition. For conditions of the Rosebud event see separate sheet.
3. To be eligible for the GPV District Junior Championship a player must be under 18 years on the day of the event and a member of a GPV Member Club.
4. The competition shall be played in accordance with the R & A Rules Limited, Scotland, together with such local rules as are in force on the course over which the competition rounds are being played. In the event of any dispute which arises on any point or any protest, which must be made not later than ten minutes after the conclusion of play, these matters shall be resolved by the Committee whose decision shall be final.
5. In the event of adverse weather conditions, or for any other reason, the Committee may either shorten the event or appoint another date and/or venue.
6. Within five days of the closure of entries the Committee shall conduct a seeded draw.
7. Competitors are required to report to the Registration Desk/Starter not later than fifteen minutes before their hit off time.
8. A draw will be made by the Committee. The Committee has the power to amend the draw or substitute another player for any competitor who is not at the tee at the time for any player. However, it is a condition of the competition that, in the absence of circumstances which warrant waiving the penalty of disqualification as provided in Rule 33-7, if the player arrives at his starting point, ready to play within five minutes of his starting time, the penalty for failure to start on time is two strokes at the first hole in stroke play instead of disqualification.
9. PACE OF PLAY: Rule 6-7 will be strictly enforced. Each group must maintain its position on the course with respect to the group preceding them. Any group with a clear hole in front of them will be considered out of position. The penalties will be issued to individuals in such groups who by their pace contribute to such delay. Warnings may not be issued prior to penalties.
10. No competitor may win more than one individual trophy or prize except for perpetual trophies
11. If there is a tie for the Gross Winner there will be a sudden death play-off to decide the Champion. The winner of a tie in a handicap competition or of runner-up in scratch competitions shall be decided on a count-back system currently recommended by Golf Australia.
12. Results shall be declared and presentations made as soon as possible after the conclusion of play.
13. On the day of the event entrants shall be elected Honorary members of the host club.
14. Players and caddies must conform to the dress code of the host club.
15. Distance Measuring Devices
Players may obtain distance information by using a device that measures distance only. However, if during a pennant match, a player uses a distance measuring device that is designed to gauge or measure other conditions that might affect his play (e.g., gradient, wind speed, temperature, etc), the player is in breach of Rule of Golf 14-3, for which the penalty is disqualification, regardless of whether any such additional functions are actually used.

The **Betty Hebb Perpetual Trophy** will be awarded to the player with the best scratch score over 18 holes at the Rosebud Country Club.
The **Limeburners Trophy** will be awarded to the player with the best scratch score over 18 holes at The Dunes Golf Links.
