



2016 SSV SECONDARY SCHOOLS GOLF - EVENT CONDITIONS & INFORMATION

Eligibility

Students must be enrolled in years 7,8,9,10,11 or 12 in a School Sport Victoria full or associated member school. For a list of eligible schools please see the about us page on the School Sport Victoria website.

Competition Procedure

The 2016 event has two competition levels (Division and State). All students will compete in a 9 hole Division event with qualifying students to progress to the 18 hole State Final.

Entries

Entries for all Division Events will be taken by Golf Victoria through their website (\$10 per player). Entries will close 5 days before the advertised date of each event or when a capacity field has been reached. Players <u>do not</u> require a golf handicap to compete. Entries will be accepted on a receipt of entry basis until a capacity field is achieved. Players trying to enter a full fielded event will be directed to play at another venue in their area.

Competition Categories

The following competitions shall be played at all Division Events and the State Final;

Junior Boys (7-9 students)

Junior Girls (7-9 students)

Senior Boys (10-12 students)

Senior Girls (10-12 students)

In the event of a tie in each of the categories the Golf Australia count-back system shall be used to determine final positions. If scores are still tied then positions will be awarded to the tied players.

State Qualification

Students that qualify to the State Final will be notified of their progression. In the event of a tie in each of the categories the Golf Australia count-back system shall be used to determine final positions. If scores are still tied then positions will be awarded to the tied players.

Event Correspondents

All event details will be forwarded from Golf Victoria to players and schools who have supplied an e-mail address. This includes starting times, player information and event draw.

Clothing & Equipment

All players, spectators and supervising staff must be appropriately dressed for a private golf club. Runners or golf shoes are appropriate foot wear for play. Students should have their own golf clubs, balls, tees, pencils etc. Golf Victoria can provide a set of clubs for players if they don't have their own set. Schools must contact Golf Victoria a minimum of one week out from the event if they require clubs to be provided.

Rules and Conditions

The competition shall be played in accordance with the Rules of Golf adopted by the Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St Andrews, Scotland, together with the local rules of the club, or as altered by the tournament organiser to suit special conditions which may apply. The event conditions are to be read in conjunction with the School Sport Victoria 'General Conditions of Competition'.

Hole Lengths

The courses will be set up using the approximate distances;

Junior Boys and Junior Girls

Par 3s - 150m

Par 4s - 250m

Par 5s - 350m

Senior Boys - White tee markers of the day

Senior Girls - Red tee markers of the day

Maximum Strokes per Hole

Once a player has double the par on any hole, the ball must be lifted and the relevant score for that hole placed on the scorecard. Any deliberate attempt to hit the ball must be counted as a stroke. No further strokes are permitted on the hole once the player has reached double the par (Division Event Only).

Bunkers

After two shots in a bunker the player may pick up their ball and play it from the side of the bunker but no closer to the hole (Division Event only).

Lost Ball Rule

If a ball is lost during play, a player must drop another ball as close as possible to where the ball was lost under penalty of one shot (Division Event only).

Bad Weather

In the event of bad weather, or for any other reason, the Championship Committee may shorten the competition or appoint another day or days for completion of the event.

Caddies and Spectators

Caddies are not permitted. Players must carry/wheel their own clubs. Spectators (parents, teachers etc) are not allowed to coach or offer advice either verbally or by gestures to competitors during their round. Parents are encouraged to come along and spectate.

Championship Committee

The Championship Committee shall consist of representatives of Golf Victoria and School Sport Victoria. The Championship Committee reserves the right to vary any condition of this event. Protests must be made to the Championship Committee no later than 10 minutes after the conclusion of each round. The decision of the Championship Committee will be the final in all matters relating to the tournament.

Database of Competitor's Details

The personal information you have provided in your entry form is collected, used and disclosed in accordance with the Golf Victoria Privacy Policy (available from www.golfvic.org.au). Golf Victoria may use and disclose your personal information for the purposes of conducting the event, administering golfing and other related activities across Victoria, providing you with event-related services or promotional material, complying with legal obligations or otherwise in accordance with the Golf Victoria Privacy Policy. In entering this event the player understands that their name and school will be published on the tournament results sheet which is displayed on the websites. If a player wishes not for their name and school to be published on the website they will need to contact Golf Victoria prior.
