The Teams Cup (Stableford) Championship in 2017 is a combined event with Golf SA.

The Teams Cup will be a one-day event on Monday 3rd April at the North Adelaide Golf Course which will also be the qualifying event for the Knockout Competition (see details page 3). Start time for all days unless otherwise notified will be 9.30am rolling 1st tee start (groups will hit off at 7 minute intervals, players will know actual start time 7 days prior to day). Teams are required to check in 30mins prior to their tee off time.

Country Convenors are encouraged to run a golf day prior to the event. All teams are eligible to play in the Championship and Knockout Competitions.

Cost is \$22.00 per student. No cash will be accepted on the day. Schools will be invoiced after the event.

A team must comprise of three students from the same school. Special permission can be sought from SSSSA and Golf SA for students to make up a team of 3 when it is not possible to do so from their own school. Teams that are entered from a combination of schools must come from within the same SSSSA Zone.

- All players must have a Golf Australia handicap
- All players' scores will count towards their team score
- The event shall be played over 18 holes
- Teams can be of single or mixed gender

GENERAL INFORMATION:

- 1) Students must have a consent form from their school to play
- 2) Each school or player is to provide approved equipment and balls
- 3) Buggy hire is available from host venue
- 4) Players are expected to have some basic knowledge of golf rules and etiquette *before* they play
- 5) DRESS: Players, teachers/ supervisors and caddies must wear appropriate golfing attire of collared shirt, tailored shorts, pants or skirt. T-shirts, jeans, football shorts, tracksuit pants and tops are not allowed. Proper golf shoes or sneakers should be worn
- 6) HANDICAPS:
 - Players with club handicaps must provide their golf link number
 - Students wishing to establish a handicap should contact Golf SA – Development Coach on Ph.82671353
- 7) SCORING:
 - Play every hole out – when points are to be scored – No 'gimmies'
 - Every 'airy' is to be counted as a one shot
 - Check each score hole by hole – both yours and the player from whom you are scoring
 - Record the checked scores onto the score card at the end of each hole
 - Sign 2 cards – Card with your name on it as the player and the card you marked as the marker. The signatures verify that the players' names and handicaps are on the cards, each hole score is correct and the date is recorded and any alterations on the card should be initialed
- 8) TIED SCORES:

A count back system in the event of tied scores by teams will be used to decide the winners as follows

 - 1) Deduct the lowest score from each team
 - 2) Rank teams in order of new totals
 - 3) In the situation of scores still tied, repeat the above procedure by deducting the 2nd lowest score from each team
 - 4) Repeat process to decide placings
 - 5) Unsigned cards and/or incorrect cards will lead to disqualification

PLEASE NOTE: Schools will be advised of the actual tee-off time and order of play after nominations have been received.

INDIVIDUAL STABLEFORD

The Stableford competition is probably the most common event played at club level. The system takes its name from Dr Stableford of the Liverpool Golf Club, and was introduced in 1931. It involves scoring points based on results at each hole.

Using the index for each hole, players firstly make a mental allocation of their full handicap over eighteen holes. For example, a player on a handicap of 18 will add one shot to the par value for each hole to determine his or her own par for the hole. Thus a hole rated as a par 4 becomes a par 5 for the player.

The points scoring method is then calculated by allocating two points for a par, one point for one over, three points for one under, four points for two under, and so on.

Players who exceed their own par by two strokes score no points for the hole

and, since they cannot improve on that result, they should then pick up their ball and hope to score points on the next hole.

At the end of a round, all points scored are added for each nine holes and totalled for eighteen holes. The player with the most points is the winner.

The Stableford competition has two major advantages. First, it speeds up the game since there is no point continuing to play a hole once your own par is exceeded by two strokes. Second, it means you can have one or two bad holes, but compensate for them during the balance of your round.

When marking the scorecard, note that the number of strokes taken must always be shown for holes where points are scored. Thus, the card records both strokes and points.

Examples:

1. If the Handicap is 12 then par is plus 1 for Stroke Index holes 1 - 12
2. If the Handicap is 24 then par is plus 1 for 18 holes and an additional stroke for each of the Stroke Index holes 1 - 6
3. If the Handicap is 27 then par is plus 1 for 18 holes and an additional stroke for each of stroke index holes 1 - 9.
4. If the Handicap is 36 then par is plus 2 for 18 holes
5. If the Handicap is 45 then par is plus 2 for 18 holes and an additional shot for index holes 1 - 9

The Shield is named in respect of Mr. David Bottroff and his continued support of Golf. He has been a major contributor to the development of the game both at the school level and his own club, Flagstaff Hill. He has served on the Secondary School Sport SA Golf committee since 1981, also serving as President and Captain of his own club during this time. He has a keen passion to see students develop to their full potential not only in golf by in life.

The Competition will comprise of a qualifying event, the SSSSA Teams Championship, which is traditionally played in the first term of the year and then knockout rounds until there is a winner. The event will conclude by the end of term 2.

The competition will be a Team Stableford event. Teams will consist of three players with all three scores to count towards the team total points.

Knock Out Competition round one will commence with a field of the top 16 teams from the SSSSA Teams Championships. Round two will comprise of the top 8 from round one and the final will be the top four teams from round 2.

Scoring: The team with the highest aggregate stableford score each round will be the number one qualifier

Ties: Teams that are tied on a qualifying position, the following golf count back system will be used to decide placings.

- 1) Deduct the lowest score from each team
- 2) Rank teams in order of new totals
- 3) In the situation of scores still tied, repeat the above procedure by deducting the 2nd lowest score from each team
- 4) Repeat process to decide placings
- 5) Unsigned cards and/or incorrect cards will lead to disqualification

1 st Round Knock Out	Monday 15 May	top 16 from Teams Championship
2 nd Round Knock Out	Monday 5 June	top 8 teams from 1 st round Knock Out
Final Round Knock Out	Monday 3 July	top 4 teams from 2 nd round Knock Out

Start time for all days unless otherwise notified will be 9.30am rolling 1st tee start (groups will hit off at 7 minute intervals, players will know actual start time 7 days prior to day).

Knockout Competition Winner will be the team with the highest aggregate score on the final day. In the event of a tie the count back method as above will be used to decide the winner. There will be a short presentation following the final round.

Rules of the Game will be those set by R&A of St Andrew per their reference manuals.

Knock Out Competition Fees will be \$15 per player per round, Schools will be invoiced from Secondary School Sport SA

Competition Management will be conducted by Golf SA
