## GV Future Stars Rankings

## Overview

The Future Stars Rankings is a yearly OOM encompassing four different events, the Victorian Primary Schools, Junior Secondary Schools, Victorian U16 Classic, and the Stuart Appleby Rookie Series events. The Future Stars rankings is a significant step in streamlining all of the introductory competitions not requiring a handicap that Golf Victoria has to offer, and provide a clear pathway of golf events for the development of young players.

Ranking points can be accrued across all four events in either the boys or girls sections. Victorian Primary Schools, Junior Secondary Schools, and the Stuart Appleby Rookie Series are all played over a modified 9 -hole shortened course. There is no entry fee for the Future Stars Rankings and prizes will be awarded to the winners at the end of the year.

## Events

The below events are included in Golf Victoria's Future Stars Rankings:

- Primary Schools
- Junior Secondary Schools
- Rookie Series (Excluding final)
- Victorian U16 Classic


## Points

In Primary and Junior Secondary School events, points will be awarded to the boys and girls final position across the entire field relative to their gender. In the Stuart Appleby Rookie Series players will compete in either the U9, U12 or U16 boys and girls sections and will be awarded points according to their age division. The U16 Classic event points will be allocated based upon a player's finishing position within U9, U12 and U16 age divisions, even though these grades don't exist in the competition itself. The points will be awarding as follows:

1. If there are tied scores the points will be averaged across those scores (rounded up).
2. If more than one player is tied as OOM leader at the end of the season they will be deemed joint OOM winners.
3. Only the highest 7 point scores across the year will count towards the players final OOM.
4. There is no minimum number of events that a player needs to compete in to finish with a final standing.
5. A competitor can only compete in 2 school events across the year, otherwise any points tallied after their initial 2 events will not be counted.
