PACE OF PLAY FACTS

Did you know?

If each player in a four-ball takes 5 seconds less to play each shot, the round time can be improved by over 25 minutes.

A recent R&A survey not surprisingly showed that 60% of golfers wished their rounds to be shorter






READY GOLF

WHAT IS IT?

- Refers to a method for golfers to speed up play
- Hit when ready
- Shorter hitters can play first
- More efficient play





What Influences Pace of Play?

There are three factors which influence the Pace of Play:

- The management of play
- The course design and set-up
- The players

Explore the panels opposite to find out more information on each of the topics.

Before embarking on any attempts to improve pace of play, it is best to assess whether there is a widespread view among users of the facility that there is an issue with pace of play. The Pace of Play Manual provides guidance on simple methods of data gathering.







MULTI TEE AND MIXED GENDER COMPETITIONS

HOW?

- Each golfer plays from a specific set of tees of their choice
- Slope rating help to adjust the competition handicap
- Further adjustment of a handicap may be required





MULTI TEE AND MIXED GENDER COMPETITIONS

AN EXAMPLE: AT THURGOONA

- Stuart plays off the blue par 72, scratch 73 (so his course is 1 harder than par)
- Bernard plays off white par 72, scratch 72 (so his course is same as par)
- Piret plays off the red par 74, scratch 75 (so her course is 1 harder than par)

GOLF BOX SOFTWARE

- Golf NSW has been using Golf Box software for 3 years
- Also used by the R&A, England Golf, European Tour
- Free Pennant Software for all Districts
- Clubs enter their own results immediate availability to view























2019 RULES MODERNISATION

SPEEDING UP PLAY

- Caddies can't stand behind players to line them up
- Must play within 40 seconds
- Can establish a maximum number of strokes in a competition
- Specifically allow golfers to play out of turn





2019 RULES MODERNISATION









Leaving Flagstick in the Hole

If you make a stroke from on the green and your ball hits the flagstick in the hole, there will be no penalty.




You are allowed to ground your club and move loose impediments in a penalty area (an expanded concept

of water hazards).

Rule 16 – Relief from Abnormal Course Conditions (Including Immovable Obstructions), Dangerous Animal Situations, Embedded Ball

Purpose of Rule 16:

Rule 16 covers when and how you may take free relief from interference by abnormal course conditions and dangerous animal situations.

- Decause such conditions and situations are not considered part of your challenge in playing the game, you are normally allowed relief without penalty when they interfere with your ball that lies anywhere on the course except in a penalty area.
- You normally take relief by dropping your ball in and playing it from a relief area based on the nearest point of complete relief, so that you are completely free of the interference.

The Rule also allows you to take free relief when your ball is embedded in its own pitch mark in the general area.

16.1 Abnormal Course Conditions (Including Immovable Obstructions)

This Rule covers relief from interference by animal holes, ground under repair, immovable obstructions or temporary water.

These are collectively called abnormal course conditions, but each of these terms has a separate Definition.

a. When You May Take Relief



Meaning of Interference by Abnormal Course Condition. Interference exists when:

- Your ball touches or lies in or on an abnormal course condition, or
- An abnormal course condition interferes with your area of intended stance or area of intended swing, or
- Only when your ball is on the putting green, an abnormal course condition on or off the putting green intervenes on your line of play.

When your ball is off the putting green, intervention on your line of play is not interference under this Rule.

FIGURE 16.1a: RELIEF FROM ABNORMAL COURSE CONDITIONS (INCLUDING IMMOVABLE OBSTRUCTIONS)



Relief is allowed for interference by an abnormal course condition (ACC), including an immovable obstruction (10), when your ball touches or lies in or on the condition (81), or the condition interferes with your area of intended stance or swing (82). For a right-handed player, the nearest point of complete relief for B1 is very close to the condition (P1). For B2, it is farther from the condition to accommodate the stance (P2).

DROPPING THE BALL

- •Within 20 or 80 inches rather than a club length or two
- •Ball must land in and remain in the dropping area
- Drop from any height





WHAT IF YOUR BALL DOESN'T STAY IN THE DEFINED DOPPPING AREA

- Try Harder!
- Try a few different spots within that area
- Try releasing the ball closer to the ground
- If all that fails ...move to the nearest spot where the ball will come to rest, when dropped

- I will arrange groups of four now I know who is playing and who needs a cart










