Q.5)	A player is playing in a stroke play competition and their ball comes to rest on a path. As the player is not sure how to proceed they invoke Rule 3-3 and tell their playing partner that they will play two balls. The player states that they wish to count the ball which is dropped away from the path. The first ball is played from the path and the score with that ball is 5. The second ball is dropped under Rule 3-3, two club-lengths from the path and the hole is completed with that ball in a total of 4 stokes. What is the player's score for the hole? Q.6)	A player's ball is heading towards an adjacent fairway after a stroke made from the teeing ground. While the ball is in motion it is deflected by another ball and comes to rest in a water hazard. How should the player proceed?  A.  The player can replay the stroke without penalty.  B. The player should drop a ball where the original ball would be estimated to have some to rest if had not been deflected and play their next stroke from there without penalty.  C. - Q.9) After playing from the tee a player's ball lands in a metallic drainage hole in a bunker. The player lifts the ball and drops it outside the bunker keeping the point where the ball lay directly between where the ball is dropped and the flagstick. The player then sees their fellow-competitor standing next to the flagstick. The player chips their ball onto the green and it hits the fellow-competitor who is attending the flagstick and the ball falls into the hole. What is the ruling?
