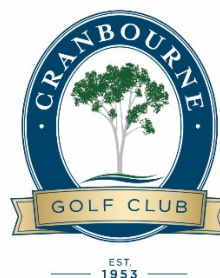

Presentation

All trophies will be presented after the conclusion of play on Tuesday 27 February. It would be appreciated if as many competitors as possible remain for the presentation to honour the respective trophy winners.

Event Format

Monday 26 February

11:00am - Registration starts
 12:30pm- Play commences – Multi tee start

Tuesday 27 February

7:00am - Registration starts
 8:00am- Play commences – Multi tee start
 2:30pm (Approx.) – Event presentation and luncheon.

Final Round Draw

Please note a seeded draw will be created for the final round on the basis of round one scores following conclusion of the first days play. The final round will commence via a multi-tee start at 8.00am on Tuesday 27 February.

The final round draw will be made available on the Golf Victoria Website at www.golfvic.org.au, from 7:00pm on Monday 26 February. Alternatively, players may call the GV Mobile on 0448 577 640.

All players must be available at their allocated tee time as determined by Golf Victoria. Competitors unable to compete at the designated time forfeit the right to compete in the event. Golf Victoria reserves the right to modify the draw.

Lunch

A light lunch will be provided to all players for round one and available in the clubhouse from 11am. The Presentation BBQ lunch at the conclusion of play on Day 2 (Tuesday) is open to all players.

Scratchings

Any player wishing to scratch prior to Thursday 22 February must ring GV Tournaments on (03) 8545 6229. Any player wishing to scratch on the weekend prior should call the GV mobile on **0448 577 640**.

(Note: Refunds will only be approved if given 3 business days' notice, unless supporting documentation provided.)

Course Map

Players are requested to familiarize themselves with the course map to avoid any delay in commencement of play from allocated holes.



GENERAL INFORMATION

Registration

All competitors are required to report to Golf Victoria representatives inside the clubhouse at the respective clubs upon arrival at the course. Players must then be present on the appropriate tee **no later than 10 minutes' prior the tee time.**

Handicaps

All players must ensure that their current and correct daily handicap is recorded on the scorecard in accordance with Rule 6-2b. Players must play from their correct **DAILY** handicap during the Championship, with the exception that no male player shall play from a daily handicap greater than 24 and no female player shall play from a daily handicap greater than 45.

Scorecards

All score cards are to be returned to the registration area situated in the clubhouse immediately at the conclusion of play.

Dress Regulations

All **players and caddies** are required to adhere to the Club's dress regulations with particular reference to the following: -

- ❖ Clean dress shoes **MUST** be worn in the clubhouse at all times. Athletic jogger shoes are not permitted.
- ❖ Advertising or display materials must not appear on clothing except for brand name logos.
- ❖ All shirts must have a collar.
- ❖ Tailored shorts are permitted.
- ❖ Denim clothing of any description is not permitted.

Any player not adhering to the Host Clubs' dress regulations will be prohibited from playing. Any caddie or guest not adhering to the Host Clubs' dress regulations will be requested to leave the course.

Course Care / Club Regulations

Players are reminded that sand buckets **MUST** be taken and used, pitch marks are to be repaired, and bunkers

raked following play at each course. Mobile phones are not to be used in the clubhouse or on the course unless in the case of an emergency or a ruling during the round. Play will be from the nominated tee markers. Any player not complying with these requirements will be subject to action in accordance with the GV Code of Conduct.

Slow Play

“Ready Golf” will be encouraged during the event. Rule 6-7 will be strictly enforced. Each group must maintain its position on the course with respect to the group preceding them. Any group with a clear hole in front of them will be considered out of position. Penalties will be issued to individuals in such groups who by their pace contribute to such delay. Warnings may not be issued prior to penalties.

Suspension of Play

In the event of heavy rain, lightning or for any other reason, the Championship Committee will be responsible for deciding whether to suspend play. The signal for suspending play will be one short siren blast. The procedure when play is suspended is outlined under Rule 6-8b. When the course is ready for play, players will be advised to return to various locations. The signal for the resumption of play will be one long siren blast.

‘Safe thru 18’ – First Aid Information Guide for Golfers

Golf Victoria is aware that occasionally situations arise out on golf courses where first aid or emergency action is needed, and often golfers are unsure of the best way to respond.



A compact and comprehensive first aid guide titled “Safe thru 18” has been developed in a format that can easily fit into a player’s bag. This guide provides information covering many situations that players may face out on course, both critical and common.
