### Welcoming

Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> July 2018 at 4.30 pm at Crystal Brook Golf Club. Casual or golf wear.

### Event 1

Bronze Plate – 36 holes stableford (18 holes played on Tuesday and 18 holes played on Wednesday). Winner to hold Golf SA Plate for one year. Trophies for winner and runner-up.

### Event 2

18 holes stableford on Tuesday. Trophies for winner, runner-up, best front 9 and best back 9.

### Event 3 (in conjunction with event 1)

Veterans' event – 36 holes stableford. Open to players who have reached their 70<sup>th</sup> birthday by the first day of play. Trophies for winner and runner-up.

### Event 4

18 holes Stableford on Wednesday. Trophies for winner and runner-up.

### Event 5

#### Country v Metro Salver

Country and Metro will be represented by 12 players each to be drawn from the entrants on the Monday preceding the first day of play. The best stableford total on Tuesday will win the Salver. (See Conditions)

### Event 6

18 holes' handicap foursomes stroke played on Thursday. Trophies for winner, runner-up and best gross. A light luncheon will be served at the conclusion of play of the foursomes when the trophies will be presented.

**Note – players may take only one trophy in event 6.**

### Dinner

Players are invited to a dinner on Wednesday evening Crystal Brook Golf Club at **5.30 pm for 6.00 p.m.**

**Presentation** of trophies at dinner.

## Conditions of play

1. Registrations must be made via the Golf SA online registration system. Entries by any other method will not be accepted.
2. Players must register by **5.00pm on Friday 6<sup>th</sup> July 2018**. IT IS THE SOLE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE ENTRANT THEMSELVES TO ENSURE THAT THEY HAVE REGISTERED CORRECTLY. A player has not officially registered until their name is listed in the **Registered Participants** section of the event registration page.
3. Entries may be limited at the discretion of the Host Club Match Committee.
4. Late entries may only be accepted at the discretion of the Golf SA Match Committee.
5. No registration fee or dinner cost refunded after registration closing date.
6. These events are open to female amateurs with an Australian Handicap or overseas equivalent.
7. Competitors are requested to bring proof of handicap
8. A player entering on the GA handicap limit of 28.1 who reduces her GA handicap before the closing date of registrations may apply for transfer to the (next event) i.e. Bronze Shield Country Meeting before the closing date of registrations or
- 8a: A player entering on the GA handicap limit of 28.1 who reduces her GA handicap before the closing date of registrations may continue in the entered event, on her reduced daily handicap, and is only eligible for events 2-6.
9. Players to use their first day daily handicap for all events
10. Foursomes – if through illness or another unavoidable cause one entrant has to withdraw after the closing date of entries, her partner may substitute another player in her stead.
11. The Golf SA Match Committee shall have the right to refuse or accept an entry of any person without being required to give a reason for so doing.
12. The Golf SA Match in conjunction with the Host Club Match Committee has full power to alter or make any variation in the Conditions.
13. The Host Club Match Committee in conjunction with the Golf SA Match Committee to be absolute umpire of any dispute or protest, which must be lodged in writing at the host Clubhouse before 6.00pm on the day on which the dispute has arisen.
14. The Host Club Match Committee may, in the event of bad weather or for any other reason, alter the venue, time or day of play. In the event of dangerous conditions (eg. lightning) the signal for suspending play will be a prolonged note of the siren. Players must discontinue play immediately and not resume play until the committee has ordered a resumption of play. Penalty for failing to discontinue is disqualification. Refer Rule 6-8c & d for lifting/replacing ball.
15. The Rules of Golf, the local rules of the host Club and the Rules of GA shall be the Rules of Play.
16. Competitors will be drawn in such manner as the Host Club Match Committee shall arrange.
17. Competitors must start at the appointed time, unless under circumstances approved by the Match Committee. Competitors must report to the starter 15 minutes before the appointed tee time.
18. If there is a tie for the winner in event 1, there will be a stableford sudden death play-off. All other ties by countback as per the current Rules of Golf and the Rules of Amateur Status book.
19. Players are prohibited from smoking cigarettes, cigars or the like during a stipulated round. See Golf SA's Code of Conduct.
21. All competitors are subject to drug testing by the Australian Sports Anti-Doping Agency for banned substances as laid down in Golf Australia's Anti-Doping Policy. Any competitor infringing this policy, or refusing to take a test, will be disqualified and subject to any sanction(s) brought down by ASADA.
22. Except in case of emergency, mobile phones must not be used to make or receive calls or messages when on the golf course.
23. Ride-on buggies will be permitted only on medical evidence from the player's Club and by permission of the venue Club. Medical Certificate to be forwarded to Golf SA and evidence of approval to be held by the player at all times. Caddies are not permitted to use ride-on buggies.
24. A player may obtain distance information by use of a distance-measuring device. If, during a stipulated round, a player uses a distance-measuring device to gauge or measure other conditions that might affect their play (e.g. elevation changes, wind speed etc.), the player is in breach of Rule 14-3.
25. Country v Metro - If there is insufficient players to have a team of 12 the Golf SA representative may alter the amount of players at the time of the draw. If any player fails to finish the stipulated round the lowest stableford score from the opposing team will not be counted. In the event of a tie, a count back will occur using the total of the back 9 holes of each scorecard.

## Notes

- Competitors are requested to bring proof of handicap as they may be disqualified if evidence of correctness of handicaps is not available.
- Please observe dress regulations of host Club.
- Draws will be posted in competitors' Clubhouses.
