The Tweed Heads Coolangatta National Match Play Championship is open to all players on the Australian Men's Senior Ranking system, with the leading 32 players who enter ultimately contesting the event over four days. All players will play six rounds of golf, am and pm on 16th July, am and pm on 17th July, am on 18th July and am on 19th July 2018.

The seedings for the 2018 event are based on the players ranking after the NSW secondary at The Lakes, The Australian and Avondale GC from 14th – 16th May 2018.

The 32 players will be drawn into 8 pools based on their rankings and will play 3 round robin matches over 18 holes .

2018 CTHGC NATIONAL SENIOR AMATEUR MATCH PLAY CHAMPIONSHIP - CONDITIONS

1. Format

1.1 The Championship will be played at Coolangatta-Tweed Heads Golf Club (River Course).

1.2 (i) The C.T.H.G.C. National Senior Match Play Championship will be played over six (6) rounds of 18 holes of Match Play:

Round 1 – Pools :7—9am

Mon 16 July

Round 2 – Pools :11am—1pm

Mon 16 July

Round 3 – Pools : 7am—9am

Tues 17 July

Quarter Finals :from 11am

Tues 17 July

Semi Finals

Wed 18 July 7am-9am

Final :

Thur 19 July 7am-9am

The Championship will consist of three (3) rounds of match play in eight (8) seeded pools consisting of four (4) players, with losers being eliminated from main draw and pool winners progressing to the Quarter Finals.

The general numerical draw will be applied to establish the pool pairings (based on the player's position on the 2018 Australian Men's Senior Rankings after the Men's NSW Senior Classic on 14-16th May 2018).

If two or more players are tied in the Australian Rankings, the player's exact Australian Handicap at the time of entry will be used, with the player with the lowest exact handicap receiving the lowest number available.

Pools will be comprised as follows: Pool 1 (Seed 1, 32, 16 & 17); Pool 2 (Seed 8, 25, 9 & 24); Pool 3 (Seed 4, 29, 13, 20); Pool 4 (Seed 5, 28, 12, 21); Pool 5 (2, 31, 15, 18); Pool 6 (Seed 7, 26, 10 & 23); Pool 7 (3, 30, 14 & 19); Pool 8 (6, 27, 11 & 22).

The general numerical draw will be applied for the main Championship with the winner of each pool progressing to the quarter-finals.

Players eliminated from the main Championship will be drawn to play in consolation rounds for the remaining three rounds with the general numerical draw also applied for all consolation pools.

1.3 In the event of a halved match after 18 holes in rounds 1-3;

(i) The match is deemed to be halved and each player will receive half of the allocated points for a won match;

(ii) In the event that two or more players are on the same number of matches won in their pool after round three;

(iii) Final positions will be determined based on the aggregate of holes won during the three round robin matches played, and if two players are still tied then their individual match result will determine their position. If the two players halved their match, then their seeding at the beginning of the Championship will determine final pool positions.

(iv) If three players are tied after matches won and aggregate of holes won, then their seeding at the beginning of the Championship will determine final pool positions.

1.4 In the event of a halved match in a Quarter Final, Semi Final or Final;

(i) Players will continue to play until a winner is determined, and;

(ii) The round is deemed to extend to as many holes as are required for a match to be won.

1.5 The winner will be the *CTHGC National Senior Amateur Match Play Champion* and will receive the Championship medallion and hold the Championship Trophy for one year. The runner-up will receive a silver medallion.

2. Championship Play Committee

2.1 The Championship Play Committee will comprise, Phil Towle, Darryl Hearsch, Stefan Albinski, Ian Frost

2.2 In the absence of a full Championship Play Committee, such members as may be present at the time may give a decision, and any decision so given will be deemed to be a decision of the full Championship Play Committee.

2.3 The Championship Play Committee will have the sole management and control of the Championship, with full power at any time to alter or vary any of the conditions.

2.4 The Championship Play Committee's decision on matters affecting the Championship will be final.

3. Rules of Play

- The Rules of Golf, as adopted by R&A Rules Limited, will apply, together with any additional Local Rules as drawn up by the Championship Play Committee. Players that cannot resolve a ruling can call either NSW Golf Rules officials. These are:

4. Entries

4.1 Eligible players for the first section are male amateurs who have reached their 55th birthday by Entry Closing Date which is 31st May 2018 and who are the leading

(available) 32 entries according to the 2018 Australian Men's Senior Rankings as at after the Men's NSW Senior Classic on 14-16th May 2018.

- 4.2 Entrance Fee \$320.00 (includes GST) will be taken after final acceptances.
 - 4.3 The decision of the Championship Play Committee as to acceptance or refusal of any entry will be final.
 - 4.4 Entrants must conform in all respects to the Rules of Amateur Status, as adopted by R&A Rules Limited.
 - 4.5 Entries must be received by CTHGC prior to 31st May 2018
- IT IS THE SOLE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE ENTRANT THEMSELVES TO ENSURE THAT THEIR ENTRY IS RECEIVED PRIOR TO THE CLOSING TIME FOR ENTRIES.** A player's entry form has not officially been received until their name has been posted at CTHGC
- 4.6 In the event of entry applications exceeding the number of places available in the Championship (32), applications outside of the leading 32 entries, according to the 2018 Golf Australian Senior Rankings after the Men's NSW Senior Classic on 14-16th May 2018 will be balloted. Unsuccessful applications will be informed without delay and given the opportunity to compete if withdrawals subsequently occur.
 - 4.7 In the event that 64 or more entries are received by the closing date, CTHGC may consider increasing the field size to 64 players. (Not available for 2018)
 - 4.8 Late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the Championship Play Committee.
 - 4.9 Entries will be accepted by Coolangatta-Tweed Heads Golf Club either by email or post. Late entries may be accepted at the discretion of Championship Play Committee.

5. Conforming Golf Balls, and Conforming Driver Heads

The specimen conditions in the Rules of Golf are in effect as regards Conforming Golf Balls, and Conforming Driver Heads.

6. Pace of Play

This being a Members Course, pace is very important to us.

7. Motorised Transport

All players are permitted to use motorised transport.

8. Practice

Sunday 15 July, tee times from 12:30 pm to be booked through CTHGC Proshop on 07 5524 4644. Additional times may be available at the club's discretion.

9. Registration

Competitors are to register between 10.30 am and 1.30 pm at CTHGC on Sunday 15 July. If a player cannot be at the club at that time, players must register via phone. 0755244544 (Pro Shop) Failure to comply may result in disqualification from the Championship.

10. Match Play Draw and Withdrawals

The draw will be released once all players have registered. If there is a subsequent withdrawal, the opponent will receive a forfeit. A player is **not** permitted to withdraw from any round of the Championship unless on the receipt of a medical certificate, or in exceptional circumstances (as determined by the Championship Play Committee). Penalty: As determined by the CTHGC Championship Committee.

12. Database of Competitors' Details

The personal data contained in this entry is permanently retained by CTHGC. This data may be utilised by CTHGC or its sponsors for the distribution of correspondence, in both electronic and hard copy means. From time to time players may be sent entry forms, event literature, the CTHGC e-newsletter, or marketing material by the sponsor(s) of CTHGC events. Upon receipt by CTHGC of a written request, a player may either have access to their details, or have their details deleted from the database.

13. Publicity and Promotion; Broadcasting

CTHGC may arrange for promotion of the Championship, for radio, internet and television broadcasting and other exhibition and publication of the Championship or excerpts thereof in any and all media throughout the world, whether now known or hereafter developed. By this application, the player consents to the use by CTHGC, or persons authorised by CTHGC, of their name, likeness, voice and references to them and photographs and other images of them and their play connected with their appearance in the Championship, or any portion(s) thereof, in connection with such media promotion, broadcasting and other exhibition and publication of the Championship. CTHGC may utilise the rights granted it hereunder in connection with the promotion of this Championship. The cooperation of players with authorised representatives of the media is required, provided that no pre-Championship activities outside of those activities which are part of the Championship will be required and provided that the player's Championship play is not unreasonably interfered with.

14. Code of Conduct

All players are to behave in accordance with the CTHGC Code of Conduct. A copy of the Codes can be obtained from Reception

15. Match Fixing Policy

There will be no tolerance for Match fixing. A player known to have fixed a match may be withdrawn from the Tournament and due to this being a ranking event, GA may be informed

16. Smoking Policy

Players are prohibited from smoking cigarettes, cigars or the like during a stipulated round..

17. Golf Rules

The RandA rules will apply for Match Play, together with relevant local rules supplied.
