CSGA OPEN ANNUAL CHAMPIONSHIPS CONDITIONS OF PLAY 2018

1. This event is open to all Amateur Women members of any golf club affiliated with GA and clubs recognised by the bodies governing Women's Golf in overseas countries.
2. The Championships is a two day Stroke competition for Divisions 1, 2 and 3.
3. Separate **Daily entries** will be available and will be Stroke for Division 1 and 2; and Stableford for Division 3. It should be noted that the 'Daily Entry' players are not eligible for any 'Special Event' prizes nor any 36 hole prizes nor any team events. They will only be eligible for a daily prize.
4. Division 3 players can submit 2 separate Daily entries if they wish to play 2 days of Stableford but noting the conditions in para 3 above.
5. The number of Divisions and breakdown will be decided once all entries have been received, including for daily entries.
6. Sunday will be played as a Foursomes Stroke event with a 2 tee start, with set tee times from 11am. Presentations for the Foursomes event will be undertaken asap at the end of play.
Monday will be a Shotgun start from 8.30am.
Tuesday will be a 2 tee start, with set tee times from 8.30am. Presentations for both Monday and Tuesday will be undertaken at the end of Tuesday's event, including for daily prizes.
7. The CSGA Match Committee has complete control of this event and reserves the right to vary conditions should it be deemed necessary. The decision of the Match Committee on all points of protest shall be final.
8. Competitors must report to the starter at least 20 minutes prior to their scheduled hit off time. Failure may result in a two shot penalty or disqualification. See R&A Rules of Golf 6-3a and 33-7.
9. Handicaps are to be GA or certified by the Governing Women's Golf body in the player's country of residence. A player's handicap will remain the same for Day one and two of the Competition.
10. The Rules of Golf and the local rules of the Host Club shall be the rules of play during this Tournament.

11. Mobile phones may be carried on the course, in silent mode. A player may use a Mobile phone for the following uses only (NB: if a phone is used outside of these parameters it will be considered a breach of these conditions)"
 - As a distance measuring device. It must not be used to gauge or measure other conditions that might affect her play (eg elevation changes, wind speed etc) otherwise the player will be in breach of Rule 14-3.
 - To look up the R&A Rules and/or Decisions of Golf
 - In case of emergency.
12. Motorised Transport is permitted. The CSGA Committee takes no responsibility for the provision of motorised transport and players should make their own arrangements and bookings with the respective Club Pro Shops.
13. A Tie in the Open or Closed 36 holes Scratch Championship or Foursomes Scratch Champion events (Southern Cup, Canberra Cup, Goulburn Cup, and Bridges Cup only) will be decided by a sudden death hole by hole play-off.
14. A Tie in all other individual gross and handicap events shall be decided using the GA method of count back.
15. A Tie in Team events shall be decided using the GA method of count back for the lowest GA handicap marker in each team.
16. Competitors are limited to one trophy per day, excluding Special Event trophies, with scratch event trophies taking precedence over nett events.
17. It is the responsibility of the competitor to comply with the dress regulations of the Host Club.
18. Players must abide by the GNSW Standard Conditions of Play and Code of Conduct as published on the GNSW website www.golfnsw.org and available at all affiliated Clubs.
