PLAYER INFORMATION

To be read in conjunction with the Rules of Golf, as adopted by R&A Rules Limited, Golf NSW Standard Conditions for Events Run by Golf NSW, the Golf NSW Code of Conduct along with the Golf NSW Hard Card.

1. OUT OF BOUNDS (Rule 27-1)

1.1 Those areas beyond the course boundary and car park fences.

2. DROP ZONES

- **2.1** Gardens identified by white pegs or lines or green stakes with white tops are areas from which play is prohibited. All other gardens and wood chipped areas are integral parts of the course. Individual wood chips are loose impediments.
- **2.2** The area containing the soil bins, adjacent to the 8th hole is marked as G.U.R. As an additional option for relief, the ball may lifted, cleaned and dropped without penalty in the drop zone, marked by blue stakes and white tops, provided at the southern end of the area.
- **2.3** As an additional option of relief from the Greenkeeper's Shed, the ball may be lifted, cleaned and dropped without penalty in the drop zone, marked by blue stakes with white tops, provided near the southern end of the 1st tee protection screen.

3. PROTECTION SCREENS (Rule 24-2 Immovable Obstructions)

- **3.1** If any part of the protection screen between the 1st tee and 9th green intervenes directly between the player's ball and the line of play the ball may be lifted, cleaned and dropped in the nearest drop zone, marked by blue stakes with white tops provided at either end of the screen.
- **3.2** If any part of the protection screen intervenes with the players line of play from the top tier of the 10th tee, the ball may be lifted, cleaned and dropped within one club length of the nearest point of relief.

PENALTY FOR BREACH OF LOCAL RULE: TWO STROKES

Rules Enquiries

Doubt as to Procedure (Rule 3-3)

In stroke play, if a competitor is doubtful of her rights or the correct procedure during play of a hole she may, without penalty, complete the hole with two balls. After the doubtful situation has arisen and before taking action, the competitor must announce to her marker or a fellow competitor that she intends to play two balls and which ball he wishes to count if the *Rules* permit. If she fails to do so, the provisions of Rule 3-3b(i) apply.

The competitor <u>must</u> report the facts of the situation to the <u>Committee</u> before returning her scorecard. If he fails to do so, he is disqualified.
