2019 SOUTHERN JUNIOR CLASSIC – TOURNAMENT CONDITIONS

(To be read in conjunction with the Golf Australia's Standard Event Conditions as published on the GA Website at www.golf.org.au)

1. COMPETITION PROCEDURES

- 1.1 The Championship is scheduled to be played over 36 holes stroke play, 18 holes on each day of the tournament.
- 1.2 The field for the event will be limited to 96 players.
- 1.3 Entries will be accepted on an as received basis until the field capacity is reached.

2. ELIGIBILITY

- 2.1 Eligible players are male & female amateurs who are aged under 21 as at the first day of the competition and whose GA Handicap at the time of entry meets the following criteria;
Boys – GA handicaps of 27.4 or less
Girls – GA handicaps of 36.4 or less.

3. ENTRIES

- 3.1 The entry fee is \$60 (inc. GST). Entry fee must be paid at the time of entry.
- 3.2 The Tournament Committee shall have the right to refuse the entry of any person without being required to give any reason for such refusal.
- 3.3 Entries shall only be made online at www.golfvic.org.au.
- 3.4 The draw for the competition will be sent to players and available at www.golfvic.org.au approximately five days before the event.
- 3.5 Entries close 7 days prior to the event.

4. TROPHIES

- 4.1 The male and female player with the lowest stroke score after 36 holes shall be the 2019 Southern Junior Classic Champions.
- 4.2 The player with the lowest nett score after 36 holes shall be the 2019 Southern Junior Classic Handicap Champion.
- 4.3 In addition, the gross winner and runner-up as well as the nett winner for each age division will receive a trophy.
- 4.4 In the event of a tie for the overall gross championships a hole by hole play-off will be conducted if time permits (otherwise a count-back will be utilised) on a hole(s) as decided by the Championship Committee, players who are tied being eliminated hole by hole as they fail to maintain equality. In the event of a tie for the runner-up not determined by the above play-off, the count back method recommended by Golf Australia will be used. Golf Australia's count back method will be used to separate all other trophies.
- 4.5 No player may win more than one trophy in the overall 36-hole stroke and nett sections. However, a player may win one additional trophy in his or her age group section.
- 4.6 A minimum of 8 entries is required to constitute an age division. If insufficient entries are received players will move up to and compete in the next age division and/or for overall prizes.

5. CHAMPIONSHIP COMMITTEE

The Championship Committee shall consist of representatives of host clubs and Golf Australia. In the absence of the full Championship Committee, present members of the committee at any time may give a decision and any decision shall be deemed the decision of the full Championship Committee. The Championship Committee reserves the right to vary any condition of this event. In the event of bad weather, or for any other reason, the Championship Committee may shorten the competition, appoint another day or days for completion of, or may transfer play to another course. The decision of the Championship Committee will be final in all matters relating to the Tournament.

6. DATABASE OF COMPETITOR'S DETAILS

The personal data contained in this entry is permanently retained by Golf Australia. This data may be utilised by Golf Australia or its sponsors for the distribution of correspondence, in both electronic and hard copy means. From time to time players may be sent entry forms, event literature, the Golf Australia e-newsletter, or marketing material by the sponsor(s) of Golf Australia events, or information about events conducted by Golf Australia approved bodies. Upon receipt by Golf Australia of a written request, a player may either have access to their details, or have their details deleted from the database.
