

2019 Victorian Junior Masters Player Information

History

The Victorian Junior Masters is an Australian Ranking Event and World Ranking Event. It is for players aged under 18 years and is now contested as a 72-hole stroke events without a 'cut'. First conducted in 1995, the event now is one of Australia's premier junior tournaments. Approximately 240 leading junior players from around Australia and internationally participate over four days.

With an extensive honour roll of USPGA Tour winners and players it is obvious as to why The Victorian Junior Masters is Australia's leading junior golf tournament! Past champions include Aaron Baddeley in 1998, prior to winning 2 Australian Open titles, and Jason Day in 2005 who won the 2015 US Open. Other past competitors also include Adam Scott who finished in the top 5 in each of the four years he competed from the age of 15.

After 23 successful years at Waverly Golf Club, the Victorian Junior Masters will move to Spring Valley Golf Club for the first time in January 2019. The Junior Masters will be contested in 2019 without a cut meaning all players will compete in all four rounds.

Registration

All players are requested to report to their starting tee 10 MINUTES PRIOR TO THE TEE TIME to be allocated their scorecard, pin positions and temporary local rules.

All scorecards are to be returned to the recording area immediately at the conclusion of play



Slow Play

Rule 5.6b will be strictly enforced. Each group must maintain its position on the course with respect to the group preceding them. Any group with a clear hole in front of them will be considered out of position. Penalties will be issued to individuals in such groups who by their pace contribute to such delay. Warnings may not be issued prior to penalties. Golf Australia expects all players to implement 'Ready Golf' procedures and be ready to play when it is their turn.

Dress Regulations

Golf Footwear

Players are requested to note that soft spikes are mandatory.

Course Care/Club Regulation

Players are reminded that sand buckets **MUST** be taken and used and pitch marks are to be repaired. Play will be from the nominated tee markers. Any player not complying with these requirements will be subject to action in accordance with the GV Code of Conduct.

Motorised Carts

According to GV's standard conditions of competitions, it is the responsibility of the player, if they require the use of a golf cart during the event to send a Medical Certificate and a completed copy of the Golf Victoria Motorised Transport Approval Return Form for consideration by the Match Committee.

Golf carts are at the player's own expense and MUST be booked directly with the Golf Victoria as soon as possible. Golf Victoria cannot guarantee the use of a golf cart on any given day of play. Caddies are permitted to ride in the cart with the player ONLY when sufficient carts are available.

Suspension of Play

In the event of heavy rain, lightning or for any other reason, the Championship Committee will be responsible for deciding whether to suspend play. The signal for suspending play will be one short siren blast. The procedure when play is suspended is outlined under Rule 5.7a. When the course is ready for play, players will be advised to return to various locations. The signal for the resumption of play will be one long siren blast.

Refunds

Any entrant may withdraw and have the entrance fee refunded provided notification is received within three working days prior to the event.

Under no circumstances will entry fees be refunded after this date unless players can provide Golf Australia with supporting documents regarding their withdrawal from the event (ie. Medical certificate).
