REGISTRATION


Registration will begin at 6am with all competitors requested to register by 7:15am at the latest. Registration will be set-up inside the clubhouse bar. Complimentary pastries, fruit and tea/coffee will be available upon registration.

PRO-AM PRESENTATION LUNCHEON

Following the conclusion of play at approximately 12.45pm, the complimentary Pro-Am luncheon will commence in the clubhouse including the presentation of all prizes

MOTORISED CARTS & PULL BUGGIES

A large number of groups on the Creek course and a smaller number of groups on the Beach course have been allocated specifically numbered motorised carts as indicated on the draws. Cart keys can be collected at the 13th Beach Pro Shop. The remainder of players will be required to utilise pull buggies. While some pull buggies will be available, given the large Pro-Am field size, players are encouraged wherever possible to bring their own pull buggy or carry bag. Players teeing off holes 6 to 17 of the Creek course are able to park in the car park adjacent to the 9th hole if desired.







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PRO-AM COMPETITION & SCORECARD

The competition played will be Tour Scramble. All players tee off then select the best tee shot on all holes. All 3 amateurs will then play their second shot from this position. If the selected tee shot is the professional's, he/she will play from here, if not he will play from where his/her tee shot finished. After the second shots, each player continues and complete the hole with their own ball.

The net aggregate team score in relation to par will count at each hole (ie. all 4 scores in the team can count). To contribute to a team score, a player must score a nett birdie or better. The worst score any player can have on a hole is a nett par. The team with the lowest nett aggregate in relation to par will win. There will also be nearest to the pin and longest drive for the amateurs only.

All professionals to play from scratch while all amateurs to play from their respective handicaps. The professional in each group will be issued with the team score card at registration & will be responsible for scoring.

HANDICAP STROKE HOLE INDEX

Male & Female amateurs are to use the respective hole index and hole par information as stated on the official Pro-Am scorecard for each respective course. Handicaps will be on the official scorecards upon arrival.

TEE MARKERS (BOTH COURSES)

Blue Tees – Male Professionals; Yellow Tees – Female Professionals; White Tees - Male Amateurs; Red Tees – Female Amateurs.

FINDING YOUR STARTING HOLE

Course Maps will be available at registration and is also printed at the back of this booklet. In addition, club volunteers are also available to assist players locate their respective starting hole.

Note: For regular players at 13th Beach, please remember that the Beach course is played in a different hole order for the ISPS Handa Vic Open.

ON-COURSE DRINKS

Complimentary Mt. Franklin water and Powerade courtesy of Coca-Cola Amatil will be available from drinks carts moving around each course during the round.

PRO-AM PRIZES

1st, 2nd & 3rd for best performed teams on each course. Nearest the pin prizes will be awarded on the 17th Beach & 15th Creek while longest drive prizes will also be awarded for the 18th hole on each course for both men & women.





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CHALLENGE HOLE-IN-ONE COMPETITION

The Australian Beer Company and Coca-Cola Amatil will be putting up 20 cartons of Yenda Beer for any participant that makes a hole-in-one on either the 3rd hole on the Beach Course or the 12th hole on the Creek Course. There will be a small cash donation required to be eligible to win the prize with all proceeds going directly to Challenge – supporting kids with cancer, the official ISPS Handa Vic Open charity for 2019.

SUSPENSION OF PLAY

In the event of heavy rain, lightning or for any other reason, the Championship Committee will be responsible for deciding whether to suspend play. The signal for suspending play will be one short siren blast. The procedure when play is suspended is outlined under Rule 6-8b. When the course is ready for play, players will be advised to return to various locations. The signal for the resumption of play will be one long siren blast.

SCORECARD RETURN

All team scorecards are to be returned inside the clubhouse near the player's lounge.
