Golf Victoria is a company limited by guarantee and is administered through an elected Board; appointed committees of honorary Officials and until November 2018 supported by a full-time office when that support commenced to be provided for Golf Victoria by Golf Australia under the One Golf services arrangements agreed between them.

GOLF VICTORIA President's Report



I am sure that our people with their strong collaborative culture will play a critical role in enabling a truly unified national golfing operation to be achieved in Australia.

Throughout the year Golf Victoria's staff have devoted their energies and passions to deliver services and programmes for the benefit of golfers and clubs across Victoria.

On behalf of all members, I express our thanks for their dedication and hard work in 2018, and in previous years. They are a great team and have been very ably led by Simon Brookhouse.

On 1 October 2018, Golf Victoria's staff (and their peers in South Australia, Queensland, Tasmania and the Northern Territory) took the momentous step of transferring their employment to Golf Australia thereby enabling "One Golf" to commence in all Australian golfing jurisdictions other than Western Australia and New South Wales.

Our staff's willingness to commit to a new management structure for Australian golf, for which the board of Golf Australia ultimately is now responsible, has made it possible to strengthen the overall administration of our sport in Australia. None of this would have been possible without our staff's unwavering acceptance and belief in the opportunity One Golf presents for achieving not only what is best for Golf Victoria's members but also what is best for the game in Australia.

I am sure that our people with their strong collaborative culture will play a critical role in enabling a truly unified national golfing operation to be achieved in Australia. They understand well the importance of having a national focus but being able to act locally wherever that is required.

Golf Australia's essential commitment to Golf Victoria under the agreed One Golf arrangements is that Golf Victoria's members will receive from Golf Australia services to the standard and extent enjoyed by them before One Golf implementation and a key responsibility of the respective boards of Golf Victoria and Golf Australia will be to ensure this commitment is satisfied.

While One Golf implementation in 2018 has provided the catalyst for much improved golfing administration in Australia, successful golfing outcomes in Victoria depend to a very large extent on the continuing support Golf Victoria receives from the Government of

The State Government's role is vital for the game's continuing health and growth and we are extremely grateful to the Victorian Government for a number of key initiatives it announced in 2018.

THESE INCLUDED:

- An additional financial contribution of \$5.3 million towards the Australian Golf Centre project being developed at Sandringham golf course, bringing to \$15.3 million the State's commitment to enabling Golf Australia's, PGA's and ALPG's staff based in Victoria to work together from the same office.
- A commitment of \$2.0 million to assist Victorian golf clubs with "shovel ready" projects.
- A commitment over 4 years of \$12.0 million for the Vic Open at the 13th Beach golf courses.

The further commitment by the Victorian Government for the Vic Open will underpin its continuing growth and importance, something which the Government recognises, for the event brings together women and men on equal terms on the same courses which is unique in golfing circles globally.

The Vic Open in 2018 was the last year Oates was our naming rights sponsor. Oates has played a vital role in helping Golf Victoria to develop the event.

We thank Oates for its past assistance and for its support in 2018 along with TAC and our other event sponsors in 2018, as well as the City of Greater Geelong and 13th Beach Golf Links for their invaluable Our congratulations are extended to Maddison Hinson-Tolchard continuing assistance in the conduct of the Vic Open.

During 2018 a focus for Golf Victoria has been club health.

Through the efforts of a number of people (including Club Facilities and Support Officer, John Stamp), a more robust system has been developed by Golf Victoria for assessing the financial performance of clubs permitting key ratio measurements, relevant to the golfing I also take the opportunity of thanking my fellow members of the industry, to be adopted allowing for club financial performance comparisons to be undertaken. These efforts supplement those of Golf Victoria's regional development officers who have continued in 2018 to provide valuable assistance to clubs in the areas of golf development and governance.

The 2018 year has also seen a significant number of development and participation initiatives undertaken in Victoria encouraging more people to play golf, and these included:

- Having in operation more than 110 registered MyGolf centres with 4,805 participants in 2018, an increase of 12% on 2017.
- Conducting a 5-week MyGolf schools programme involving 14,967
- Training and utilising an additional 30 MyGolf instructors, 8 MyGolf school instructors (non-teachers), 11 MyGolf school instructors (teachers) and 6 SwingFit instructors.
- Having more than 2,000 women participate for the first time in introductory golfing clinics, more than double the number in 2017.
- Achieving an increase in government funding from \$155,000 to \$320,000 for golf development programmes representing an increase of 106% on the previous year's equivalent funding.
- Conducting a state-wide play 9 promotion leading to the Victorian Play 9 State Final which saw 235 clubs run 6,355 Golflink recognised 9-hole competitions during the qualifying period from July to mid October, with 10.621 competitors,

On the Victorian golfing front, there were many outstanding

(Gosnells Golf Club, WA) and Andre Lautee (Kingston Heath Golf Club) for their fine performances in winning the 2018 women's and men's Victorian Amateur Championships.

Commonwealth Golf Club won the 2018 women's Division 1 Pennant final, defeating Huntingdale Golf Club and, in the 2018 men's Division 1 Pennant final, The Metropolitan Golf Club defeated Kingston Heath

At the Australian Interstate Teams Matches held at The Grange Golf Club and Glenelg Golf Club in South Australia in 2018, the men's State team was victorious in an exciting final match repeating their 2017 win in Perth.

In concluding this report, I thank our wonderful clubs who have hosted Golf Victoria events in 2018. Our programme of events provides a terrific opportunity for so many Victorian and interstate golfers, and the generosity of the clubs is sincerely appreciated. I must also thank volunteers who have helped Golf Victoria's staff on so many fronts during the year. Our volunteers work tirelessly in assisting Golf Victoria carry out its golfing activities and we appreciate all that they do for Victorian golf. Put simply, we could not operate without them.

Total male membership numbers for 2018 was 84,799 representing a decrease of 1,648 (1.9%) over the previous year.



Total female membership numbers declined by 543 in 2018 to 22,436 players.

The small decline in membership numbers occurred throughout Victorian golf - Member Clubs, Victorian Golf League and country clubs.






District Associations & Affiliated Clubs

Australian golfing great Peter Thomson AO CBE passed away in June 2018. Born on 23 August 1929, he was two months short of his 89th birthday and is survived by his wife Mary, son Andrew and daughters Deirdre Baker, Pam Prendergast and Fiona Stanway.

JARROD LYLE

Victorian professional Jarrod Lyle passed away in August 2018 after an extended battle with leukemia. He was aged 36 and is survived by his wife Briony, and daughters Lusi, 6, and

Lyle was born in Shepparton and started in golf at age six when he caddied for his father. He enjoyed a great amateur career, winning both the Victorian Country Championship and Lake Macquarie Amateur in 2003 and 2004 and represented Victoria in the men's State team from 2002 to 2004. He was also runner-up in the Men's Australian Amateur Championship in 2004

Moving to Melbourne to pursue his golf development, the affable Lyle joined Commonwealth Golf Club in Oakleigh South, winning four club championships and representing the club in Golf Victoria's metropolitan clubs pennant competition from the age of 16 until turning professional in 2004.

As a professional, he won twice on the Nationwide Tour in 2008. Lyle also played a number of seasons on the US PGA Tour, first earning his card in 2007. His best finish on the US Tour was a tie for 4th place in the 2012 Northern Trust Open.

In addition to his golf career, Lyle was renowned for his charismatic personality and fierce determination in his ongoing fight with cancer having been first diagnosed with acute myeloid leukemia at age 17, being confined to his bed for nine months while undergoing chemotherapy treatments at Melbourne's Royal Children's Hospital. He recovered twice from the illness to return to his golf pursuits (having had a recurrence of the disease in March 2012). He also became a leading advocate for Challenge, a charity which supports children diagnosed with cancer.

IAN STANLEY

In late July, Australian golf lost of one of its greatest characters in Ian Stanley. A member at Huntingdale Golf Club, the Victorian professional was a winner of 19 events on the PGA Tour of Australasia, one on the European Tour and three on the Senior European Tour including the 2001 Senior Open. He sadly passed away after a long battle with cancer at age 69.

Ian joined the PGA of Australia in 1971 and was a prolific tournament winner in Australasia from the mid 1970s through to the early 1990s. Ian spent his professional years playing on the PGA Tour of Australasia and European Tour.

After turning 50 Ian joined the European Seniors Tour where he won three times including the Senior Open in 2001 and topped the Order of Merit in the same year. He was a director of the Tee Up for Kids organisation which raises money for under-privileged children in Victoria. He was an integral part of the Jack Newton Trust and was a Board Member of the PGA Tour Australasia during the 1980's.

Ian was inducted into the Victorian Golf Industry Hall of Fame in 2012 and is survived by his wife Pam, three children and seven

JOHN DAVIS

John Davis passed away in February 2018 aged 82 years. A former club professional at the Croydon (now Yering Meadows) and Kingswood (now Peninsula-Kingswood) Golf Clubs and a Professional Golf Association (PGA) member since 1954, John was a wonderful player, notably winning the Victorian Open in 1974.

He was first named coach of the Victorian Men's State Amateur Team in 1986 and served in this role until 1989. He was later the Victorian Golf Association Director of Coaching for 13 years undertaking a variety of coaching duties including coordinating training sessions for Victorian Men's and Boys' Teams as well as coaching at junior golf camps and with development squads.

Awarded PGA member of the year in 2003, John also became a Life Member of the Australian PGA in 2004. John's services to Victorian golf were recognised in 2012 with his induction into the Victorian Golf Hall of Fame for services to the sport.

2018 Inclusion Initiative Award

A new Golf Victoria award was introduced at the Victorian Golf Industry Awards Night held at The Arts Centre Melbourne on Friday 10 August designed to recognise clubs, individuals or organisations who have taken significant steps to attract, welcome and include people from cultural and diverse backgrounds and people with a disability.

The nominees demonstrated initiative in removing barriers towards participation, developed pathways for sustainable participation and provided support through a whole of club approach.

THE 2018 NOMINEES WERE:

BRENDAN GREENSandringham Golf Links

Brendan, a member of the PGA for 12 years, is a fully qualified 'PGA All Abilities Golf Coach' and has been Head Professional at Sandringham Golf Course for the last six years.

Two years ago Brendan came to the realisation that children with intellectual difficulties were being excluded from school sporting activities due to their inability to concentrate for the required period of time. Since the beginning of 2017 he has been conducting MyGolf classes specifically designed for children with social, intellectual and physical difficulties including those with severe anxiety, autism, schizophrenia, ADD, ADHD, children with difficult upbringings and missing limbs.

Brendan has helped these children to learn the game of golf while providing a suitable environment for them to form friendships with other children with similar difficulties. Integral to Brendan's success is regular contact with parents of his students, ensuring they are informed of their children's golfing progress and personal welfare.

PAKENHAM GOLF CLUB

Over the past 18 months
Pakenham Golf Club (PGC)
has focused on changing
the culture of the club, how
the region sees golf, and has
considered the club's vision
of being more inclusive of
everyone in the immediate
and wider community.

This process began with Haydn Thompson and Scott Laycock achieving their PGA All Abilities Coaching Accreditation. Having engaged with Officer Specialist School to deliver golf coaching to their students and running a golf coaching programme for the Special Olympics, PGC is now delivering on long term planning.

These teachings tie in with new facilities due for completion mid-2019, working with local government on a complex which offers universal design including a one of a kind All Abilities Playground, offering complete access for all children regardless of ability.

With a third PGA Professional at PGC currently completing the PGA All Abilities programme, PGC and the entire region is benefiting with all three coaches willing to help, guide and support clubs that may or may not have a PGA Professional on-site. They can deliver programmes or educate committees and management of other clubs just how important these programmes are for their long-term

PGC's Bar & Catering Manager Kelly O'Shea is a qualified disability carer and was the starting point for PGC's disability engagement with the community, offering and delivering functions to special needs children who were turning 18 and looking to have a party. These functions have put Pakenham Golf Club on the map as an all-inclusive club.

These aspects set a clear and definitive vision for a Golf Club that can cater for more than

It future proofs the entire facility and along the way engages with some of the most inspiring people who teach us all to embrace life no matter what. All members support the vision for Pakenham Golf Club and are proud of what the club is achieving.

RICH RIVER GOLF CLUB

Rich River Golf Club (RRGC) conducts monthly inclusive/ adaptive coaching sessions run by All Abilities Coach and Club Professional, Steve Loader. RRGC is a registered provider with Empower Golf Australia (EGA) as a dedicated disability hub.

This programme provides players access to a Paragolfer, enabling visiting and local wheelchair bound golfers, the opportunity to visit their facility, one of the first regional hubs set up with EGA.

The recent major clubhouse renovation saw full disability access facilities installed in rest rooms.

This initiative has allowed a pathway for members such as Peter Hyden. Peter plays golf and has coaching with the assistance of a Paragolfer, utilising the club's all access facilities.

Loader, through relationships built from the club's inclusive program, is an ambassador for a local Opening Doors Project which helps build assisted housing for individuals with disability. The Opening Doors Project provides a mix of accommodation catering for individuals requiring assistance 24 hours a day or for those able to use assistive technology to live a more independent life.

In 1993 the Victorian Golf Association (VGA) conducted its first of many State Level Referees, rules courses. The courses were introduced to upskill interested men and women and create a group of volunteers to act as referees at the increasing number of events conducted by the VGA and Women's Golf Victoria. Many of these referees went on to officiate at national events.

As part of the Victorian Golf Industry Awards Night, the significant contribution to Victorian golf of the forementioned referees was formally recognised.

ACHIEVEMENTS 2018 Victorian Golf Hall of Fame

The Victorian Golf Hall of Fame is an initiative undertaken by Golf Victoria, the PGA, Golf Management Victoria and the Victorian Golf Course Superintendents Association.

2018 INDUCTEES INTO THE VICTORIAN GOLF HALL OF FAME:

LOUISE BRIERS

Louise Briers (nee Hawking) was born in Rutherglen in 1956 and grew up across the road from the Rutherglen Golf Club.
As a 19-year-old in 1975, Briers joined Commonwealth Golf Club and quickly made an impact by winning the first of her seven Commonwealth Women's Club Championships in 1975. In 1976 Briers commenced a Pennant career spanning 42 years which yielded five Pennant flags.

At State Level, Briers won the Victorian Women's Amateur Championship 3-times, Victorian Women's Foursomes Championship 5-times, Women's Champion of Champions 5-times, the Riversdale Cup 5-times and was a Victorian State Team Member from 1976-1980 and 1982-1993.

Briers won the Australian Women's Amateur at Royal Melbourne in 1991 after a runner-up finish in 1978, won the Australian Women's Foursomes Championships 4-times and represented Australia at the Queen Sirikit Cup (1983, 1985, 1987, 1989, 1991), the Espitiro Santo Trophy (1984, 1986, 1988, 1990), the team to Great Britain (1978, 1984), the Commonwealth Tournament (1983, 1987, 1991) and the Tasman Cup (1985, 1987, 1989).

On the International scene Briers was runner up in both the British Women's Amateur and the European Women's Amateur in France in 1986. Louise was made a Life Member of Commonwealth Golf Club in 1985 at the age of 30.

ACHIEVEMENTS 2018 Victorian Golf Hall of Fame

TOM CROW

Born in 1931 in Camberwell, Tom first distinguished himself as a cricketer, particularly as a fast left arm bowler, before golf became his sport of choice. He began as a left-handed golfer before switching to right-handed as good left-handed golf clubs were hard to find.

In a glittering amateur career Crow won more than 20 Club Championships at Kingston Heath, Royal Melbourne and Royal Sydney, was the only amateur to win the Victorian Close Championship at Kew in 1953 and won the 1956 Victorian Amateur Championship at Royal Melbourne, where his 63 on the West Course in qualifying lowered the course record by four strokes.

Crow also won the 1961 Australian Amateur at Royal Melbourne, where he defeated fellow Victorian Golf Hall of Fame Member Eric Routley 3 and 2 in the final. This was followed by victories in the Riversdale Cup in 1961 and 1962. Interestingly Tom's Riversdale Cup victories followed his brother Peter's victory in 1956. The two men remain the only brothers to win the title. Crow also won the Victorian Amateur Foursomes Championship in 1956 with Barry West, and in 1962 with Doug Bachli.

To top all of this off Crow also represented Australia in the Eisenhower Cup in 1962 in Japan and 1964 in Italy. Crow was also Peter Thomson's manager for a period of seven years that included three Open Championships and many sponsorship deals.

As amazing as Crow's playing career was, he will probably be best known and remembered as a golf club designer and innovator. Crow started out working for club maker East Brothers which later became PGF. He had design input into the Little Slammer which was very popular in Australia and a concept he would develop further with great success!

In 1973 Crow moved with his family to California and founded the Cobra Club company with an investment of \$60,000

In 1973 Crow moved with his family to California and founded the Cobra Club company with an investment of \$60,000. In 1975, Cobra released the famous Baffler club which was the making of the Cobra brand as it got the tick of approval from tour stars such as Gene Littler.

Throughout the 80's and 90's Cobra continued to innovate with golf club design including the 46-inch shaft in the Long Tom, the King Cobra range designed for ladies and seniors and revolutionised the graphite shaft manufacturing process.

In 1991 Greg Norman and Hale Irwin signed endorsement deals with Cobra. Norman invested in Cobra and in 1993 the company was publicly listed. Cobra continued to have huge success with oversized clubs that were designed for the club golfer with slower swing speeds. In addition Crow, along with short game guru Phil Rodgers designed the Trusty Rusty line of wedges.

Cobra was purchased by American Brands in 1996 and subsequently sold to Puma in 2010.

Crow retired more than 15 years ago but his legacy lives on. In 2003, the PGA of America acknowledged Crow's achievements by bestowing him with the Ernie Sabayrac Award for life contribution to the golf industry. Crow now resides in the USA.

BRENDAN MOLONEY

Moloney has worked on newspapers in Zimbabwe, Papua New Guinea and Australia and reported on and played golf in America, Britain, Japan, China, New Zealand, Sri Lanka, Vietnam, Fiji, Thailand and India.

Moloney followed his father into journalism in 1968, training on the old 'Sun News Pictorial' in Melbourne. From there he worked on the 'Rhodesia Herald' (now Zimbabwe) as a sub-editor, the Papua New Guinea 'Post-Courier' as sports editor and the Melbourne 'Age' where he was chief golf writer.

In 1988, while chief golf writer at 'The Age' he played Augusta National, the day after Sandy Lyle won the US Masters. Moloney left 'The Age' after 16 years in 1993 and since then has contributed to newspapers and magazines and been the media manager for golf tournaments in Australia, Hong Kong, Indonesia and New Zealand. He has also served as a press officer for both the Australian Golf Union (Golf Australia) and the PGA Tour.

He has written or co-written a dozen books on golf, has won 13 national awards from the Australian Golf Writers Association, and in 1987 was named Golf Writer of the Year by the Victorian PGA. He served on the executive of the Australian Golf Writers Association for 31 years from 1986, was president from 2008 to 2017, and in 2008 was awarded Life Membership of the AGWA. In 2017 Moloney received a plaque from the Australian PGA Tour for his outstanding contribution to golf.

Moloney is currently a columnist for 'Golf Australia' magazine and is a member of the East Malvern Golf Club.

ACHIEVEMENTS 2018 Victorian Golf Hall of Fame

COLIN PHILLIPS OAM

Phillips was appointed to the position of Assistant Manager at The Metropolitan Golf Club in 1962. This appointment was part of an initiative between The Metropolitan Golf Club and The Royal Melbourne Golf Club whereby young men were given the opportunity to train in all facets of club administration.

Phillips then moved to the UK where he spent four and half years at the West Kent Golf Club as Secretary/Manager. During this time he provided assistance to the Kent Golf Union.

He returned to Australia in 1975 to assume the position of Secretary of the Victorian Golf Association before securing the position of Secretary of the Australian Golf Union. This was the first full-time position after part-time positions were held by fellow Victorian Golf Hall of Fame Members Sloan Morpeth, Bill Richardson and others.

Phillips remained Secretary of the AGU, now known as Golf Australia, until 2006 and during this tenure he achieved the following:

Establishment of the AGU as a full time business operation

Expansion of the Australian Open

Golf development programmes, particularly for juniors and promising young amateurs

Building and enhancing our international recognition

Establishment of Moonah Links as the home of the AGU

Establishment of Golflink and the Australian Handicapping System

Establishment of an Environmental Strategy for Australian Golf Courses

Phillips has been a member of The Metropolitan Golf Club since 1975 and has served on its Committee and acted as Greens Convener for many years. In addition, Phillips is a member of The Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St Andrews, honorary member of Kingston Heath and West Kent Golf Clubs, Sorrento, Moonah Links and Frankston Golf Clubs,

Phillips was also the Honorary Secretary of the Asia-Pacific Golf Confederation, Director of Asia-Pacific for The Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St. Andrews, Chairman of the Australian Open Championship from 1975-2005, and was the first Australian to serve on Rules Committees for The Open Championship, US Open and The Masters

Phillips also sat on committees to establish the World Golf Ranking system, the Alfred Dunhill Cup, the Johnny Walker World Championship and the Confederation of Australian Sport.

Phillips was awarded an OAM in 1996 for his contribution to the golfing industry through the Australian Golf Union.

JOHN WESTACOTT OAM

John was elected to the Victorian Golf Association (VGA) Council in 1979 and retired 23 years later in 2002. He was VGA President for six years following six years as Vice President, He is a Life Member of Golf Victoria.

Whilst on the VGA Council, he served as Chairman of a number of different committees, including the Match and the Selection Committees. He also sat on the Junior, Rules and Amateur Status, Handicap and Course Rating and Victorian Open Committees.

Westacott was President of the Australian Golf Union (AGU) and was a member of the AGU Executive Committee. He was an Australian National Selector for 14 years which included managing the Australian Men's Amateur Golf Team to the Eisenhower Trophy on three occasions. He managed the Victorian Men's State Team from 1986 to 1988 and again in 1993.

Westacott was also a National Referee and conducted rules education sessions at clubs across Victoria and officiated at the Men's Australian and Victorian Opens over a 25 year stretch.

He sat on each of the AGU Rules Committee and AGU Open Committee for six years.

Locally, John has been a member of Victoria Golf Club for 63 years and in that time has served as Captain for five years, President for five years. Life membership of Victoria Golf Club was conferred on

GOLF VICTORIA STAFF

27 full-time staff: 6 part-time staff and 3 contracted roles were employed by Golf Victoria for most of 2018, working from the Cheltenham premises. The office, which opens on weekdays during business hours, coordinates the events and business of the organisation and deals with club, District, League and public enquiries on all aspects of golf. Almost all of the staff have transferred their employment to Golf Australia under the One Golf services arrangements agreed between Golf Victoria and Golf Australia in October 2018.

In 2018, Golf Victoria continued to improve its presence on social media, growing audiences on all Golf Victoria platforms (Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, Snapchat and YouTube).

MEN'S & WOMEN'S VICTORIAN OPENS

Following ongoing and increased support from the State Government, the City of Greater Geelong and Oates Cleaning Products, the 2018 Oates Men's and Women's Victorian Opens were simultaneously played over 72-holes at the 13th Beach Golf Links from Thursday 7 to Sunday 10 February 2018. The prize money was identical with \$650,000 on offer for each respective title.



The opening two rounds of the Championships were played on both the Creek and Beach courses with the final two rounds then played concurrently on the Beach course over the weekend of February 9 and 10. The fields were organised in alternate groups of men and women players for all four days.

Tasmanian professional Simon Hawkes with a four-round total of 274 (15-under-par) following a play-off against rookie New South Wales professional, Harrison Endycott.

In the 58th year of staging the Men's Victorian Open, Hawkes became the 47th player to have won the title and joins past winners including

The Women's Championship was won by Australian star, Minjee Lee with a 13-under-par total of 279. The 2018 title was Lee's second The Men's Championship was won by Victorian Open victory having previously won as an amateur in 2014. The West Australian returned rounds of 67, 70, 67 and 72.

> With her victory, Lee also became the only woman to have won multiple titles since the Women's Vic Open was first played in 1988.

MAJOR EVENTS

West Australian Maddison Hinson-Tolchard and Andre Lautee from Kingston Heath won, respectively the 2018 Women's and Men's Victorian Amateur Championships in their 36-hole finals played at Huntingdale Golf Club on Wednesday 12 December.

Programmes



VICTORIAN INSTITUTE OF SPORT

The Victorian Institute of Sport Golf Programme has played a pivotal role in developing Victoria's leading players since its introduction in 1990.

Each year graduates from the programme and current scholarship holders feature prominently in pinnacle amateur competitions and world professional golf tournaments.

VIS Golf Programme graduates have achieved an outstanding record of tournament wins including in excess of fifty victories on the US PGA Tour, European PGA and Australasian PGA tours plus other victories in major events in South Africa, Japan and Asia.



This record stands as testament to the contribution made to junior development and high performance by Victoria's golf clubs, District Associations, Golf Victoria and the world recognised quality of the VIS programme and the ongoing level of excellence in its coaching, sports science and life skill contributions.

Congratulations and thanks are extended to Martin Joyce (Head Coach), Darren Cole (Assistant Coach) and the team of VIS sports science professionals and support staff who have worked so successfully with our talented emerging players throughout 2018.

Support with equipment has been again provided through a valued "Titleist" partnership with the Acushnet company.

Sincere thanks are also extended to all golf clubs which assisted the programme by making their courses available for training sessions.

GOLF VICTORIA ELITE PLAYER PROGRAMME

2018 saw the consolidation of the Golf Victoria Elite Player Programme (EPP), which sits as the state's Tier 2 programme under the revised Golf Australia High Performance pathway model.

Paul Skinner continued as the State Development Coach and he has delivered and overseen much of the EPP programme in conjunction with VIS Head Coach, Marty Joyce. The programme also utilises the same sports science expertise as the VIS.

Many players achieved great results throughout the year as the EPP programme rolled out, with most filling our state team representative spots.

Sincere thanks to the Victorian clubs that have also supported the EPP, and particular thanks to Spring Valley Golf Club which is the home base for the programme.



VICTORIAN GOLF FOUNDATION

During 2018, a total of \$41,568 was provided by the Victorian Golf Foundation in grants to clubs and District Associations and for support to state-level golf development programmes. The majority of this funding is directed towards junior golf development via the regional development programme and women's participation initiatives.

Since the commencement of its annual funding and grants programme in 1995, the VGF has injected a total of over \$3.22 million towards keeping Victorian golf and golf clubs healthy.

Programmes



MYGOLF JUNIOR PROGRAMME

Conducted at golf clubs and facilities across Victoria and delivered by accredited PGA of Australia members and Golf Australia Community Instructors, the MyGolf programme is a structured introductory programme to the sport of golf for children endorsed by both Golf Australia and the PGA of Australia.

Each year the MyGolf programme continues to strengthen, and in 2018 Victoria finished the year with 90 active MyGolf Centres and 3847 MyGolf participants. Victoria is leading all Australian States and Territories in the take up of the MyGolf programme.

As part of the MyGolf programme in 2018 Golf Victoria held a MyGolfer Day at the Oates Vic Open, and a MyGolfer Skills Challenge in conjunction with the Victorian Boys' & Girls' Championships.



MYGOLF SPORTING SCHOOLS PROGRAMME

Sporting Schools is a \$100 million Australian Government initiative designed to help schools to increase children's participation in sport, and to connect children with community sport during, before and after school.

Through the MyGolf Sporting Schools programme, Golf Victoria has connected golf clubs, PGA of Australia Professionals and Community Instructors with local schools to help introduce golf through school sport. In 2018 141 schools and 10,147 students were involved in the five-session programme.



COMMUNITY INSTRUCTOR COURSE

The Community Instructor Course has been designed to grow the sport of golf through the effective development of a volunteer workforce at the grassroots level, with a long-term vision of community golf instructors working alongside PGA Professionals in programme delivery at golf courses, driving ranges and schools.

In 2018 we saw the addition of 33 MyGolf Club Instructors, 7 MyGolf School Instructors (non-teacher accreditation), 15 MyGolf School Instructors (teacher accreditation) and 10 SwingFit Instructors.

Programmes



SCHOOLS GOLF

The popularity of the school events continues to increase with thousands of children beginning or continuing their journey into the game of golf. With all the rules modified, all the holes shortened, and equipment available to borrow, the school events provide an inviting environment for students to have fun and learn about the game.

The Victorian Primary Schools Golf event entered its 18th year in 2018 with the participatory competition attracting 2169 primary school students throughout the state, conducted at 46 different venues. The Victorian Secondary Schools Golf event attracted 634 secondary school students across 24 different venues.

With the introduction of 9-hole division events and 18-hole state finals across both secondary and primary events it provides a level of competition that will encourage the beginner to get out on the course, yet also provide the skilled golfer a chance to take out the state title.







PLAY 9

Mark Corradan (Cobram-Barooga), Herbie McCandless (Yering Meadows), Lynne Turner (Beaufort) and Matyke Scott (Mt Martha) took out the leading men's and women's spots at the 2018 Victorian Play 9 State Final played over the magnificent West course at Royal Melbourne Golf Club on Sunday 4 November.

The quartet subsequently travelled to Sydney and contested the Australian Play 9 Final as part of the 2018 Emirates Men's Australian Open at The Lakes Golf Club in mid-November. One hundred and three players from 57 different clubs, including 40 country clubs, played at Royal Melbourne on a near perfect Spring afternoon to conclude the Victorian Play 9 Championship.

As part of the Play 9 initiative, nine-hole qualifying competitions were held from July at numerous clubs both in Melbourne and regional Victoria to determine the finalists that progressed through to Royal Melbourne.

Play 9 was established as part of an industry-wide promotion of nine-hole golf as a fast, fun and enjoyable playing option that can fit into busy lives. Golf Victoria expresses its sincere appreciation to the Royal Melbourne Golf Club and all of the clubs that staged qualifying rounds in the second year of the event to promote nine-hole golf.

DEVELOPMENT

REGIONAL DEVELOPMENT

The Regional Development Programme across Victoria is supported by a team of Regional Development Officers who have extensive experience in a wide range of golf activity assistance across both game development and participation as well as club help and governance.

The skill set of the officers conducting these activities is broad and includes a mix of PGA Professionals, Sport Administrators from Consultative Services as well as Regional Sports Assemblies and Sports Australia. The team is spread across Victoria and are based out of Geelong (South West & Western Districts), Ballarat (Ballarat & Wimmera Districts), Bendigo (Golf Central Victoria, Kara Kara, Northern & Murray Darling Districts), Shepparton (Goulburn Murray, North East & Dalhousie Districts), Frankston (Peninsula District) and Warragul (East, West & South Gippsland Districts).

In 2018 the programme concentrated on improving the capabilities of district golf associations as well as club committees and has comprehensively assisted the delivery of junior, men's and

women's specific programmes by way of facilitating the national and state based, "MyGolf", "Play Golf" and "Community Instructor" programmes. Many of our clubs and districts now have strategic plans to assist them in their future directions, their funding opportunities and to assist with providing quality outcomes for their members. Many of these programmes have been assisted with funding through the VGF.

In particular the Regional Development Programme has assisted 14 of the 15 Victorian districts to amalgamate with the final district scheduled to be amalgamated during the next 12 months, thus establishing modern day committee structures to best improve golf in their geographical area. Additionally, five of these districts now have a dedicated officer to approach gender equality. Our Victorian Districts and as a consequence our clubs are leaders in our sport and an example for other states.

INCLUSION REPORT

Golf Victoria would like to thank the Victorian State Government (SRV), Golf Australia and the PGA of Australia for the co-contribution to inclusive golf across Victoria.

The reporting year saw the addition of the first "Inclusive Initiative of the Year Award" presented at the Victorian Golf Industry Awards Dinner held at Arts Centre Melbourne. Congratulations to Pakenham & District Golf Club and PGA All Abilities Coaches Haydn Thompson and Scott Lavcock for taking out the inaugural award, Pakenham and District Golf Club is embarking on a facility upgrade that includes an "all abilities" playground for the wider community, accessible function areas and partnerships with Special Olympics Victoria.

PARTICIPATION HIGHLIGHTS

The Sport Australia Sporting Schools programme continues to build momentum in Special Schools across Victoria. The highlight of this programme was the development of a MyGolf All Abilities Gala Day supported by the Southern Special Schools Sports Association where 16 Special Schools and 180 kids would participate in the event held at Edithvale Golf Course.

The concept was mirrored with the Northern association with similar numbers. A special thanks to PGA All Abilities Coaches Paul Boxall (Edithvale) and Sienna Voglis (Ivanhoe) for coordinating the days.

Golf Australia in partnership with PGA Tour and ISPS Handa held the world first, ISPS Handa Disabled Cup. Twelve of the top players on the World Rankings would mirror play of the World Cup of Golf over 36 holes off the same tees and conditions as the professionals. Golf Victoria would like to thank the Victorian State Government (SRV) and the PGA Tour for their support of this world first event.

DEVELOPMENT

EDUCATION

The expansion of the PGA All Abilities Coach programme continues across the State with numbers of accredited coaches doubling to 36.

This increased capacity allows people with a disability across the State the opportunities to connect or reconnect with the game of golf. Capacity has now been created throughout the State with new All Abilities Coaches and programmes operating in Mildura, Tocumwal, the Barwon region and Gippsland.



PARTNERSHIPS

We welcome disability service provider GenU on board in conjunction with the TAC in making the Barwon region accessible for people with a disability through the acquisition of a Paragolfer for the region.

Two Stand Up and Play Golf Days were held by GenU to raise over \$50,000.

This new partnership is extending into other regions with Golf Victoria joining the GenU / Mornington Peninsula Shire Fit & Fun Programme.

Golf Victoria would like to thank Special Olympics Australia, Disability Sport and Recreation, Amputee Golf Victoria, Blind Golf Victoria and Deaf Golf Victoria for their continued support.

DEVELOPMENTTechnical Services

RULES OF GOLF

2018 was a watershed year for the Rules of Golf with the confirmation of the key rule changes due on 1 January 2019. During the year clubs received numerous communications updating timelines for the various resource materials available for the education of members.

This included a checklist for clubs to ensure that decisions could be made well in advance as to the marking of the course, scorecard preparation for new local rules and the best way to educate their members on the changes.

Clubs were encouraged to email their members the link to www.golf. org.au/newrules which directed them to the Golf Australia website to view the many video clips demonstrating how to apply the new rules.

During the latter half of 2018 Golf Victoria received and distributed 121,000 copies of the Players Edition rule books to all member clubs and districts, flyers and posters.

The R&A online academy will be updated in the new year and continues to be a huge success with many Victorian golfers

The R&A online academy will be updated in the new year and continues to be a huge success with many Victorian golfers registering for the free rules education programme. All Victorian Clubs have been encouraged to alert their members to this valuable learning tool.

Moving forward, Golf Australia as part of the One Golf arrangements agreed with Golf Victoria to continue to conduct, two-day Level 2 rules accreditation courses targeted specifically at key golf club personnel including golf operations staff, club captains, PGA members or match committee members. The course is designed to cover various topics including the rules of golf, course set up and competition conditions. Attendees also have the option to sit a theoretical and practical rules exam should they wish to gain Level 2 rules accreditation.

In December all existing Victorian Level 2 referees were given the opportunity to sit a 2-hour exam on the new rules to enable them to be ready for the 2019 tournament programme.

GA HANDICAPPING SYSTEM

In September 2018, Golf Australia introduced a revised process asking users to log-in to access their GA Handicap by registering their email address via the Golf Australia website.

By moving in this direction Golf Australia will be able to develop and maintain a rich source of data to generate insights that will be critical to growing the industry's capacity to support golf clubs and their businesses. It will also be used to communicate important information and updates, and to develop innovative ways to improve the golf experience of individual players.

COURSE RATING

Rating reviews continue to be undertaken at the request of clubs and rating adjustments for clubs who have made substantial changes to their courses.

The use of the statistical data available from Golflink has proved invaluable in this review process.

During 2018, many clubs requested to have shorter tees rated for men and some slightly longer courses rated for women to allow for more variety and options for their members.



NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

For the year ended 31 December 2018

1. Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial report preparation requirement of the Corporations Act 2001. The directors have determined that the company is not a reporting entity.

The financial report is for entity Golf Victoria as an individual entity. Golf Victoria is a company limited by guarantee, incorporated and domiciled in Australia.

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with requirements of the Corporations Act 2001, and the following applicable Accounting Standards:

Framework for the Preparation and Presentation of Financial

AASB 102: Inventories

AASB 107: Cash Flow Statement

AASB 110: Events after the Balance Sheet Date

AASB 116: Property, Plant and Equipment

AASB 118: Revenue

AASB 1031: Materiality

No other applicable Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Interpretations or other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board have been applied.

The report is also prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following specific accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this report:

- a) Inventories: Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Costs are assigned on the first-in first-out basis and include direct materials, direct labour and an appropriate proportion of variable and fixed overhead expenses.
- b) Property, Plant and Equipment: Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation. Plant and Equipment - Plant and equipment are measured on the cost basis. Depreciation - All assets, excluding freehold land and buildings, are depreciated on a straight line basis over their useful lives to the company.
- c) Investments: Non-current investments are measured on the cost basis. The carrying amount of investments is reviewed annually by the directors to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount of these investments. The recoverable amount is assessed from the quoted market value for shares in listed companies or the underlying net assets for other non-listed corporations. The expected net cash flows from investments have not been discounted to their present value in determining the recoverable amounts.

- d) Employee Benefits: Provisions are made for the company's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee benefits expected to be settled within one year together with benefits arising from wages and salaries, annual leave and sick leave which will be settled after one year, have been measured at the amount expected to be paid when the liability is settled plus related on-costs. Other employee benefits payable later than one year have been measured at the present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made for those benefits. Contributions are made by the company to an employee superannuation fund and are charged as expenses when incurred.
- e) Cash: For the purposes of the Statement of Cash Flows, cash includes cash on hand and at call deposits with banks or financial institutions, investments in money market instruments maturing within less than two months and net bank overdrafts.
- f) Revenue: Interest revenue is recognised on a proportional basis taking into account the interest rates applicable to the financial assets. Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive a dividend has been established. Dividends received from associates and joint venture entities are accounted for in accordance with the equity method of accounting. Other revenue is recognised when the right to receive the revenue has been established. All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).
- g) Goods and Services Tax (GST): Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the assets or as part of an item of expense. Receivables and payables in the Statement of Financial Position are shown inclusive of GST.
- h) Programmes, Competitions and Grants: Income and expenditure relating to programmes, competitions and grants are matched and brought to account at the time the programme or competition is conducted. Unspent grant monies are held in Membership and other Fees received in Advance.
- i) Financial Instruments: Financial assets and liabilities are recognised when Golf Victoria becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument. For financial assets, this is equivalent to the date that Golf Victoria commits itself to either purchase or sell the assets. Financial instruments are initially measured at fair value plus transaction costs. Where the instrument is not classified "at fair value through profit and loss" transaction costs have been expensed immediately. Financial instruments are subsequently measured at either fair value, amortized using the effective interest rate method cost. Fair value represents the amount for which an asset could be exchanged or a liability settled, between knowledgeable, willing parties. Where available, quoted prices in an active market are used to determine fair value. In other circumstances other valuation techniques are adopted.
- j) Staff Superannuation Fund: Golf Victoria contributes to approved superannuation funds on behalf of its employees.

2. Significant Events

During the course of the year, Golf Victoria entered into a One Golf Services Agreement with Golf Australia under which Golf Australia will effectively assume the operational responsibilities, and certain strategic responsibilities, previously undertaken by Golf Victoria. As part of that agreement, at 30th September, Golf Victoria transferred certain assets and liabilities to Golf Australia at book value and a fee equal to 3 months' of affiliation income was paid to Golf Australia to cover operating expenses for the period October to December 2018. The result was a net payable to Golf Australia reported as 'Golf Australia One Golf Transition' on the Balance Sheet and the fee is shown in the Profit and Loss as the One Golf Services Fee. Post transition date, Golf Victoria received in and paid out some income and expenses on Golf Australia's behalf resulting in a Payable and Receivable balance with Golf Australia.

Golf Victoria will still remain an entity in its own right and retain control of its existing assets for the foreseeable future.

9a) Government Funded Home of Golf Project - Deferred Income

Following the 2014 State Government Election commitment to provide \$10.0m to fund the construction of a National Home of Golf facility, Golf Victoria Ltd (GV) and Sandringham Golf Links Management Pty Ltd (SGLM) have developed a joint project proposal to develop the Sandringham Golf Course to establish the construction of a National Home of Golf. As part of the process GV and SGLM have entered a Heads of Agreement relating to the project which considers the commitments of both parties with regard to the

GOLF VICTORIA Financial Report

project. Golf Australia (GA) and the Professional Golfers Association of Australia (PGA) have committed funding to the project and are integral to the successful completion of the project. As a result, a Letter of Intent has been signed by both GA and PGA outlining their respective financial commitments to the project of \$837,500 each.

While the joint project is with SGLM, all Government funding agreements are with Golf Victoria. SGLM will enter into a sublease with Golf Victoria for the National Home of Golf premises. The ultimate holding entity of the developed asset is to be determined. The original funding agreement for \$10.0m was signed between the State Government and Golf Victoria on 27 June 2017. The State Government has since committed a further \$5.3m to increase the scope of the project with final execution of the revised funding agreement pending.

Golf Victoria has already received \$5,703,334 over the last four years in Grants from the State Government, with a further \$4,296,666 to be received over the next two years. \$1,454,608 has already been spent on a combination of project consultancy fees, project proposal planning and development and community consultation processes.

In accordance with AASB 118, Golf Victoria in 2017 had deferred the grant revenue from the State Government and reported it in the statement of financial position. As the project has now been approved and building set to commence this year, \$1,454,608 has been recognised as revenue with the corresponding asset in Capital Works in Progress - Home of Golf. \$4,248,726 is recognised as deferred income being the grant monies not yet spent on the development of the asset, and in the future will be recognised as revenue in the profit and loss, over the periods of construction.





1. Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

(b) Investments: Non-current investments are initially recorded at cost and re-valued according to market value at balance date.

(d) Trust liabilities and right of Indemnity: The Trustee acts as trustee of the Foundation and liabilities have been incurred on behalf of that trust in the company's capacity as corporate trustee. Liabilities incurred on behalf of the trust are not recognised in the financial statements when it is not probable that the company will have to meet any of those trust liabilities from its own resources. When it is probable that the company will have to meet some trust liabilities a liability for the Deficiency in Trust Right of Indemnity is brought to account. Details of the trust liabilities, the offsetting right of indemnity, and any deficiency in the right of indemnity are disclosed by way of note to the financial statements.

(e) Goods and Services Tax (GST): Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office. 3. VICTORIAN GOLF FOUNDATION (ESTABLISHMENT AND PURPOSE)

The Victorian Golf Foundation (VGF) was established in 1987. Following an initial period of capital building, the trustees in 1995 commenced making annual allocations and grants to support golf development programs and projects conducted by the Victorian Golf Association, one of the predecessor organisations of Golf Victoria, District Golf Associations, affiliated golf clubs and allied organisations. The process of annual allocations and grants is ongoing and opportunity is provided each year for interested clubs and organisations to apply for funding support. Since 1995 a total of approximately \$5.5 million has been expended by the VGF to benefit Victorian golf.

A VGF benefactor program was launched in 1997. Under this program the opportunity exists for any person or group interested in golf to make single or ongoing donations to assist in further building the foundation's capital fund. Donations are tax deductible as a result of the foundation being registered as an approved project of the Australian Sports Foundation.

During 2018 funds were provided to assist the following: Golf club memberships; school club linkage programs for juniors; community come and try clinics; District Association junior clinics and tournaments; MyGolf promotions in schools; golf in primary and secondary school; golf promotion resource materials; and support for regional sports academies.
