Conditions of Entry

- 1. **Event**: The Karrie Webb North Queensland Junior Masters is an open event. The event will be played over 2 days from 19th to 20th October 2019 as a stroke event over 12 holes (6 hole players), 18 holes (9 hole players) and 36 holes (18 hole players).
- 2. **Players**: All players must be a financial member of a golf club. 18 hole players must have a registered Golf Australia Golflink number. 9 & 6 hole players must have a registered handicap with their home club.
- 3. **Divisions**: Divisions will be dependent on numbers and be at the discretion of the GNQ Junior Coordinator and Event Committee.
- 4. Prizes: Prizes will be awarded for Gross, Nett, Runner-ups and NTPs in each division.
- 5. **Nominations**: The closing date for nominations is Sunday 13October. Late nominations may be accepted dependent on numbers
- 6. Fees: Full fees must be paid on arrival prior to tee-off on the first day.

Rules and Player Information

- 1. **Rules**: The rules of Golf as published by R & A Rules Ltd together with Local Rules as issued by the Event Committee will apply.
- 2. **Event Committee**: The Event Committee lead by the GNQ Junior Coordinator shall have sole management and control of the event with total discretion, at any time, to alter conditions.
- 3. **Code of Conduct:** The Event Committee takes violations of the Code of Conduct very seriously. Penalties for violations of the code may result in disqualification and may include ineligibility in future events. All Code of Conduct decisions made by event officials are final. Violations include but are not limited to:
 - disrespectful treatment of any official, golf course employee, volunteer or any participant
 - cheating
 - · vandalism, destruction or abuse of the golf course facilities
 - intentional littering
 - use of profanity
 - outbursts of anger or temper including throwing clubs or anything else in anger, smashing or damaging clubs
 - use of mobile phones
- 4. **Dress code**: All participants must wear event appropriate golf clothing. The final decision on inappropriate dress will rest with the Event Committee.
- 5. **Pace of play**: The pace of play is of utmost importance. The R & A Rules for pace of play are in force and players are subject to penalty if they fall behind. All players and caddies should assist with searching for lost balls. Players should announce and hit a provisional ball if they believe there is a chance their ball may be lost or out of bounds. Rule 6-7 will be strictly enforced so remember to keep up with the group in front of you and do not worry about the group behind you.
- 6. **Caddies**: Caddies are allowed for all divisions. Key roles for caddies include:
 - be a good example to all junior golfers
 - be courteous to all players, volunteers, event officials and spectators
 - maintain pace of play and work to keep the group in position on the golf course
 - avoid over-coaching your player and encourage ready golf
 - assist other caddies to help make a good experience for all
 - rake bunkers, repair divots and other actions to preserve or improve the condition of the course
 - any caddie that the event officials determine is acting in a detrimental way to the operation
 of the event may be dismissed immediately at the sole discretion of the officials with no
 appeal









- 7. **Draw and tee times**: A draw for each day will be published. Players shall start at the time and in the order arranged by the Event Committee. The penalty for a breach of the starting time is disqualification. The Event Committee may overrule the disqualification and each circumstance will be judged on its own individual merits.
- 8. **Scoring**: At the conclusion of each round all players must immediately report to the scoring table and players only are allowed into the scoring area. If scoring officials need assistance from any caddies they will advise, otherwise only players interact with scoring officials.
- 9. **Protests**: Protests or disputes must be lodged with the Event Committee immediately after the conclusion of the players round on each day.
- 10. **How to decide ties**: Sudden death playoffs will be conducted for 1st place rankings for Gross prizes. Playoff holes will be determined by the Event Committee. All other ties will be decided by applying the count-back system.
- 11. **Mobile phones**: All mobile phones must be turned off. The use of mobile phones by players is strictly prohibited unless an extreme emergency occurs. Serious breaches of etiquette may result in disqualification.
- 12. **Equipment and balls**: All players must use conforming equipment and golf balls in accordance with the Rules of Golf booklet.
- 13. **Distance measuring devices**: Players may obtain distance information by using a device that measures distance only. Devices designed to gauge or measure other conditions (eg. gradient, wind speed, temperature, etc.) shall not be allowed and the penalty may result in disqualification, regardless of whether any such additional function is actually activated.
- 14. **Motorised buggies**: Players must not travel in or on any motorized vehicle unless authorized by a member of the Event Committee. A penalty of 2 strokes for each hole where the breach occurred with a maximum penalty per round of 4 strokes. Players' golf bags may be carried by a caddie on a motorized buggy.
