

History & Honour Roll – Victorian Mid-Amateur Championship

History

The Victorian Men's & Women's Mid-Amateur Championships is a 36-hole stroke play event for male and female amateurs between the age of 30 years and over (as of 2018).

The Men's Mid-Amateur was introduced in 2005 to provide a pinnacle State Championship for players aged 30-54. National and State Mid-Amateur titles had been conducted in the US for many years and it was felt that such an event was worth undertaking in Victoria given the domination of major amateur titles by players aged 16 - 25.

Victoria's decision was mirrored by Golf Australia who soon after added a National Mid Amateur title in 2007. The women's section was introduced to the Championship in 2011.For the second time in 2019, any amateur over the age of 30 will be eligible to enter the Victorian Mid-Amateur Championship.

Previously in Victoria, only those aged between 30-54 on the first day of the championship have been eligible to tee it up but in keeping with many organisations around the world, Golf Australia has removed the upper age-restriction
