2020 Victorian Boys & Girls Championship – Player Information

History of the Victorian Boys & Girls Championship:

The Victorian Boys and Girls Championships are Australian, and World ranked events. In 2020, the Championships will move from Moonah Links to Cranbourne. Originally the tournament was played over 36-holes qualifying, followed by elimination match play until 2012. However, the Championships are now contested as pinnacle 72-hole junior stroke events without a 'cut'. The event has fast become one of the most coveted titles in the country. Year after year it attracts a huge field with some of the best junior golfers from Australia and overseas assembling in chase of the titles.

Registration:

All players are requested to report to the registration desk 30 minutes prior to the tee time of each round to be allocated scorecards, temporary local rules and pin placements

Withdrawals:

Any player wishing to withdraw from the Championship should contact Golf Australia on 03) 9626 5000 or dylang@golf.org.au
Any entrant may withdraw and have the entrance fee refunded provided notification is received within three working days prior to the event. Under no circumstances will entry fees be refunded after this date unless players can provide Golf Australia supporting documents regarding their withdrawal from the event (i.e. Medical certificate).

Results & Draws:

The Round 1 & 2 draws will be made available approximately 1 week prior to the event.

There is no 'cut', all players will contest all four rounds of the Championships. However, after 36 and 54-holes the draw will be reseeded with the leading players competing in the afternoon field. The draws will be made available on the Golf Australia website at www.golf.org.au and also e-mailed to competitors, from approximately **8:00pm** on both nights.

Practice:

Practice rounds are available after 3:30pm on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursday afternoon or Fridays for an additional cost of \$45. Please contact the Cranbourne Pro Shop on 03) 5991 3400 to place a booking.

Practice Facilities and Balls:

During the championship range balls will be available on the range each morning free of charge. For range balls outside of practice days, please purchase them from the pro shop.

Pull Buggies:

Cranbourne only has a very limited number of pull buggies available. If you are a local player, please ensure you bring your own buggy to use for the championship.

Championship Committee:



The Tournament Committee shall consist of representatives of host clubs and Golf Australia. In the absence of the full Championship Committee, present members of the committee at any time may give a decision and any decision shall be deemed the decision of the full Championship Committee.

Ready Golf:

The Championship is a “Ready Golf” event. “Ready Golf” should be played, but in a safe and responsible way. Play when you are ready – you don’t have to wait until the farthest away players has played. E.g. play Ready Golf

- When the player farther away has a difficult shot and is assessing options
- When a longer hitter has to wait for the green to clear
- On the tee if a player with the honor is delayed
- By playing your shot before helping to look for a lost ball

Catering:

Lunch will be provided to players on each day of the championship.

Dress Regulations

The following is not permitted: jeans, jean-style and cargo pants, track suits, tight stretch pants for women, brief shorts, T-shirts, singlets, shirts without collars, thongs, sandals, significant advertising on any garment, hat, or shoe.

Golf Footwear

Players are requested to note that soft spikes are mandatory.

Course Care / Club Regulations

Players are reminded that sand buckets **MUST** be taken and used, and pitch marks are to be repaired. Mobile phones are not to be used in the clubhouse or on the course unless in the case of an emergency or a ruling during the round. Play will be from the nominated tee markers. Any player not complying with these requirements will be subject to action in accordance with the GA Code of Conduct.
