

School Sport SA golf teams stableford championship

Dates and venue

Monday 23 March
North Adelaide Golf Course
Strangways Terrace, North Adelaide
Nominations close Friday 13 March

Championship details

The Teams Stableford Championship is a combine event with Golf Australia.

Entry fee

Cost is \$20.00 per student. School will be invoiced after the event.

Venue and start time

- The event is 18 holes one round, held at the North Adelaide Golf Course, Strangways Tce, North Adelaide
- 9.00am start from first tee, groups will hit off at 7minute intervals.
- Players will know their actual start times seven days prior to the event.
- Players are required to check in 30 minutes prior to their start time.
- All teams are eligible to play in the championship and knockout competitions.
- Knockout semi-final, 11 May starting at 11.07am (top 10 teams from the Team Stableford Championship).
- Knockout final, 25 May starting at 9.30am.

Team composition

A team should comprise of three students from the same school. Special permission can be sought from School Sport SA for students to make up a team of three when it is not possible to do so from their own school. Teams that are entered from a combination of schools must come from within the same secondary zone.

- All players must have a Golf Australia handicap.
- All players' scores will count towards their team score.
- Teams can be of single or mixed gender.
- Country convenors are encouraged to run a golf day prior to the event.

General information

1. Students must have a consent from their school to play.
2. Each school or player is to provide approved equipment.
3. Buggy hire is available from the host venue.
4. Players are expected to have some basic knowledge of golf rules and etiquette before they play.
5. Players, teachers/supervisors and caddies must wear appropriate golfing attire of collared shirt, tailored shorts, pants or skirt. (T-shirts, jeans, football shorts, tracksuit pants and tops are not allowed). Proper golf shoes or sneakers should be worn.
6. Handicaps
Players with handicaps must provide their golf link number. Students wishing to establish a handicap should contact Golf Australia via email: allanT@golf.org.au



7. Scoring

- a. Play every hole out when points are to be scored – no 'gimmies'.
- b. Every 'airy' counts as a shot on the hole being played.
- c. Players must check scores hole by hole with other players in the group.
- d. Record the checked scores onto the score card at the end of each hole.
- e. Sign 2 cards – the card with your name on it as the player and the card you marked as the marker. The signatures verify that the players' names and handicaps are on the cards, each hole score is correct, and the date is recorded. Any alterations on the card should be initialled.

8. Tied scores.

In the event of tied scores by teams the countback method as follows will decide the winners.

- a. Deduct the lowest score from each team.
- b. Rank teams in order of new totals.
- c. In the situation of scores still tied, repeat the above procedure by deducting the second lowest score from each team.
- d. Repeat process to decide placings.
- e. Unsigned cards and/or incorrect cards may lead to disqualification.

INDIVIDUAL STABLEFORD

The Stableford competition is probably the most common event played at club level. The system takes its name from Dr Stableford of the Liverpool Golf Club, and was introduced in 1931. It involves scoring points based on results at each hole.

Using the index for each hole, players firstly make a mental allocation of their full handicap over eighteen holes. For example, a player on a handicap of 18 will add one shot to the par value for each hole to determine his or her own par for the hole. Thus a hole rated as a par 4 becomes a par 5 for the player.

The points scoring method is then calculated by allocating two points for a par, one point for one over, three points for one under, four points for two under, and so on.

Players who exceed their own par by two strokes score no points for the hole

and, since they cannot improve on that result, they should then pick up their ball and hope to score points on the next hole.

At the end of a round, all points scored are added for each nine holes and totalled for eighteen holes. The player with the most points is the winner.

The Stableford competition has two major advantages. First, it speeds up the game since there is no point continuing to play a hole once your own par is exceeded by two strokes. Second, it means you can have one or two bad holes, but compensate for them during the balance of your round.

When marking the scorecard, note that the number of strokes taken must always be shown for holes where points are scored. Thus, the card records both strokes and points.

Examples:

1. If the Handicap is 12 then par is plus 1 for Stroke Index holes 1 - 12
2. If the Handicap is 24 then par is plus 1 for 18 holes and an additional stroke for each of the Stroke Index holes 1 - 6
3. If the Handicap is 27 then par is plus 1 for 18 holes and an additional stroke for each of stroke index holes 1 - 9.
4. If the Handicap is 36 then par is plus 2 for 18 holes
5. If the Handicap is 45 then par is plus 2 for 18 holes and an additional shot for index holes 1 - 9

Event details

Competition information

The competition will comprise of a qualifying event (The Teams Stableford Championship) which is traditionally played in the first term of the year and then the 2 knockout rounds which will conclude by the end of term 2. The competition will be a stableford event. Teams of three players with all scores counting towards their total score.

Round 1: The semi-final will commence at 11.07am with a field of the top 10 teams from the qualifying round.

Round 2: The final will commence at 9.30am with a field of the top 5 teams from round 1 competing.

Entries: Please tick the box on the teams stableford entry form to indicate the school/student wishes to participate in the knockout competition.

Players will know actual start times seven days prior to the event

Start time

The start time for all days unless otherwise notified will be 9.30am rolling first tee starts. Groups will hit off in 7 minute intervals. Players will know actual start times seven days prior to the day. Teams are required to check in 30 minutes prior to their tee off time.

Entry fee

Cost is \$20.00 per student per round. School will be invoiced after the event by School Sport SA.

Scoring and ties

The team with the highest aggregate stableford score each round will be the number one qualifier. Teams that are tied on a qualifying position, the following golf count back system will be used to decide on placings:

1. Deduct the lowest score from each team
2. Rank teams in order of new totals
3. In the situation of scores still tied, repeat the above procedure by deducting the second lowest score from each team
4. Repeat process to decide placings
