History

Junior Pennant is open to all male and female players under the age of 18 years. The Sharp Cup, which commenced in 1974 is named after William ‘Bill’ Sharp whom has a rich golfing history in South Australia.

There are two divisions of Junior Pennant – Sharp Cup and Division 2. Each club is represented by a five-person team.

The Pennant Season is “Round Robin” match play contests between clubs at one venue in each division every week. At the conclusion of the minor round contest, the top four teams in each division compete in semi-finals to determine the top two teams to compete in the final to decide the divisional flags. Sharp Cup is an “off the stick” competition and Division 2 is contested as handicap match play.
